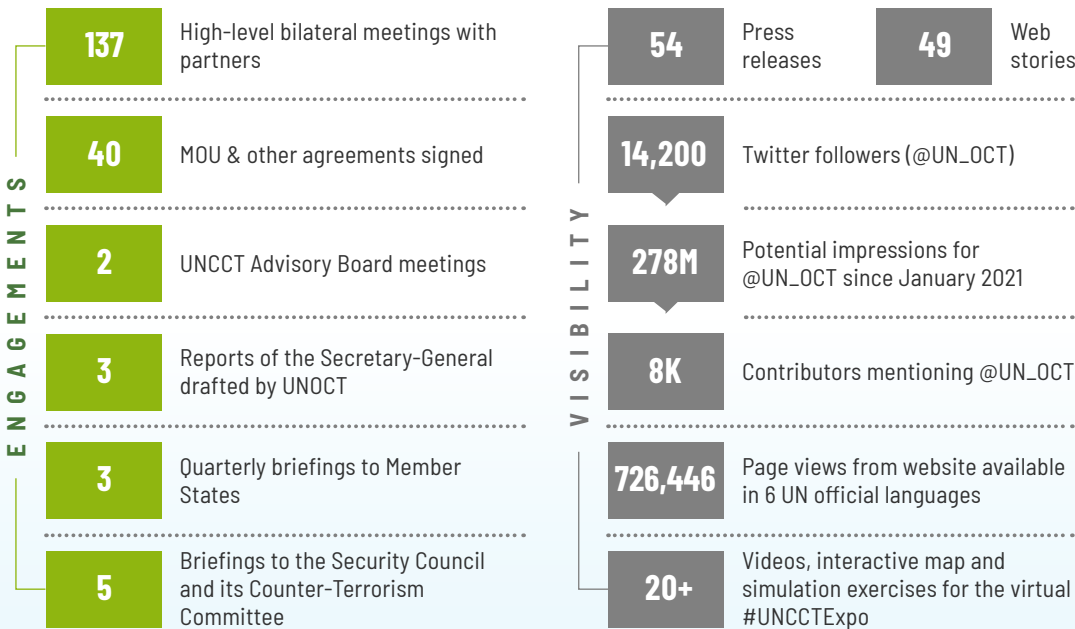


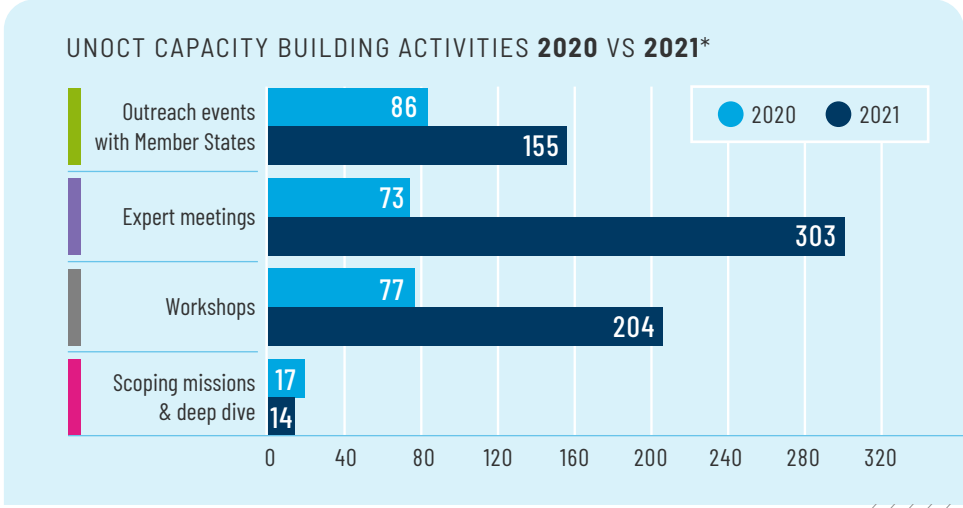

Capacity-building

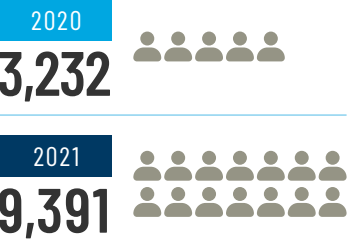
The Office organized **161 high-level bilateral meetings**, **676 capacity building activities**, including workshops and **over 150 outreach events** promoting counter-terrorism efforts while mainstreaming human rights and gender, and **mobilizing over 20,000 people**.

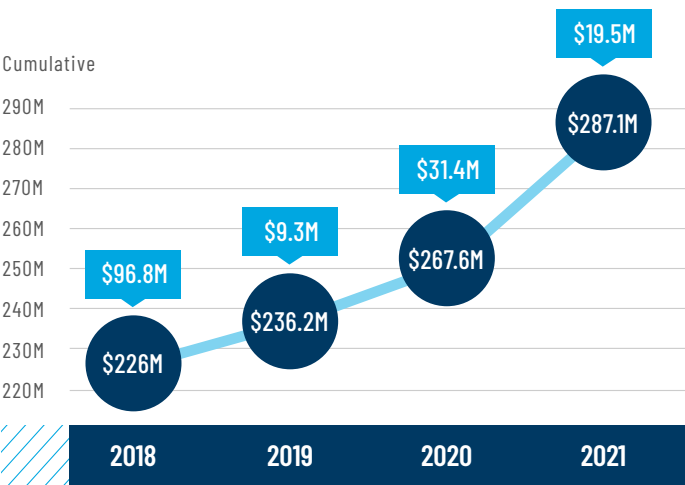

TRUST FUND FOR COUNTER-TERRORISM SINCE 2009 AND OTHER FUNDS (USD MILLION)

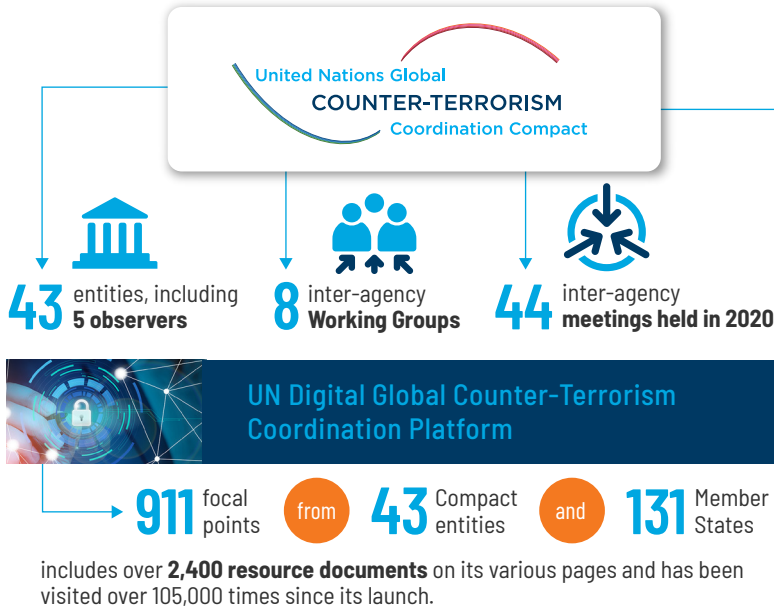
