LEADERSHIP, COORDINATION, COHERENCE

KEY HIGH-LEVEL EVENTS

→ UNOCT-IEP High-level event on the "State of Terrorism 2023" featured key findings from IEP's 2023 Global Terrorism Index and presentations by CTED and UNDP (16 Mar)



- ➔ UNDP-Belgium-EU CSW67 <u>side event</u> featured the flagship <u>ExtremeLives</u> <u>video series</u> (17 Mar)
- UNODC and UN Women signed an MoU to strengthen joint efforts in promoting gender equality (21 Mar)

On behalf of the Security Council Counter Terrorism Committee, CTED conducted assessment visits to Jordan (6-9 Mar), <u>Benin</u> (13-17 Mar) & <u>Spain</u> (24-28 April)



- → 9th GCTF Counter-Terrorism Compact Partnership Consultation focused on new and emerging technologies, CT/PCVE in Africa, and behavioral insights to prevent radicalization, while exploring avenues of future collaborations (21 Mar)
- → <u>7th meeting</u> of the SG's High-Level Action Group on Preventing Violent Extremism <u>discussed</u> response to the spread of violent extremism in parts of Africa (28 April)



ENGAGEMENT WITH MEMBER STATES

- UNODC-EU-Mozambique launched a <u>new joint project</u> aimed at strengthening criminal justice responses to terrorism (14 Mar)
- UNODC contributed to UNODA-Kenya-IGAD workshop on <u>ICSANT Project</u> on UNSCR 1540 in Nairobi (14-15 Mar)
- → UNOCT-GCTF-Canada <u>Second</u> <u>Consultations</u> on <u>Gender and Identity</u> <u>Factors Platform</u> discussed gender needs assessment (15-16 Mar)

KEY ISSUES RAISED BY HEADS OF ENTITIES

- USG Voronkov <u>underlined</u> the need to strengthen technical assistance and capacity-building support to Member States and to ensure coherence and coordinated support through the CT Compact (3 Mar)
- → OSAPG USG Nderitu <u>called</u> for greater efforts to promote freedom of religion or belief, foster intercultural dialogue, protect religious minorities and combat hate speech while upholding freedom of opinion and expression (6 Mar)
- CTED ASG Gherman <u>stressed</u> the need to pursue a whole-of-society approach and work with numerous partners in our fight against terrorism (16 Mar)

- → WCO SG Mikuriya <u>called</u> for customs compliance and enforcement-related matters aimed at identifying new trends and priorities and coordinating global and regional cooperation (27-31 Mar)
- UN SG António Guterres <u>noted</u> that the terrorist threat in Africa is especially concerning and called to "place human rights at the centre of our efforts" (28 Mar)
- → ICAO SG Salazar <u>underscored</u> progress achieved in addressing terrorist threats to international civil aviation through collaborative efforts between ICAO, CTED and UNOCT (20 Apr)



→ UN Counter-Terrorism Coordination Compact held an Expert-level briefing to Member States on the role and key priorities of CT Compact ahead of the 8th GCTS review (17 Mar)



→ UNICRI-UNODC undertook its <u>first</u> <u>scoping mission to Togo</u> to discuss the nexus between terrorism & organized crime in Africa (20-21 Mar)




→ UNOCT-USA held <u>expert-level briefing</u> on Risk and Threat Assessments to Protect Vulnerable Targets (28 Mar)


