LEADERSHIP, COORDINATION, COHERENCE

KEY HIGH-LEVEL EVENTS

→ <u>High-Level Briefing to Member States</u> on UNOCT's Programmes and Projects in Central Asia focused on achievements and the way forward (23 Jan)



 Tenth Counter-Terrorism Coordination <u>Compact Committee meeting</u> discussed strategic coordination of counter-terrorism initiatives in Africa (24-25 Jan)



- Interactive Event on the International PVE Day organized by the Permanent Mission of Iraq to the UN (13 Feb)
- → Connect and Learn <u>Platform</u> won the gold medal at the <u>2024</u> <u>Learning Platform of</u> <u>the Year Awards</u> (Feb)
- → Security Council meeting on the <u>18th</u> report of the Secretary-General on the threat posed by ISIL (Da'esh) (15 Feb)
- UN Security Council CTC regional <u>open</u> <u>briefing</u> on counter-terrorism-efforts in South-East Europe (28 Feb)



KEY ISSUES RAISED BY HEADS OF ENTITIES

- → SG Guterres <u>underscored</u> that "our collective response to terrorism must be grounded in the principles that define our shared humanity—respect for human rights, the rule of law, and the pursuit of peace" (24 Jan)
- UNOCT USG Voronkov emphasized that "the transnational nature of terrorism requires stronger international cooperation and innovative partnerships, especially with regional organizations" (24 Jan)



- → UNODC ED Waly <u>highlighted</u> that "coordination is key, whether between different agencies on the national level, between different Member States, or between UN entities and international organizations, and specifically among Compact entities" (24 Jan)
- → OHCHR ASG Brands Kehris stressed that "the first line of defence against violence and conflict should be an examination of the root causes, promotion of the rule of law and respect for human rights" (24 Jan)
- CTED ASG Gherman noted that "the transnational and decentralized character of the threat posed by Da'esh and its affiliates continues to demand a nimble international strategy focusing on multilateralism, information-sharing, and cooperation across borders" (15 Feb)

ENGAGEMENT WITH MEMBER STATES

- → UN Special Rapporteur on counterterrorism and human rights briefed EU Member States on international humanitarian law in the Israel-Gaza crisis (12 Jan)
- → UNOCT CT TECH initiative provided tailored capacity-building support to <u>Trinidad and Tobago</u> (9-12 Jan) and Kenya (29 Jan)
- → UNOCT workshop on Vulnerable Targets Protection and Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) in <u>Togo</u> (31 Jan)

→ USG Nderitu addressed the United States <u>Congressional Briefing on</u> <u>Transnational Repression</u> (14 Feb)



- → Palau became the 124th state party to the International Convention for the Suppression of Nuclear Terrorism (ICSANT) (18 Feb)
- → The <u>23rd GCTF Coordinating</u> <u>Committee meeting and side events</u>, co-hosted by Egypt and EU in Nairobi, Kenya, focused on Africa and holistic approaches to counter-terrorism (26-29 Feb)



→ Co-Chairs of the GCTF Foreign Terrorist Fighters WG, U. S. and Jordan, with UNOCT, held the <u>first workshop of the</u> <u>new Border Security and Management</u> (BSM) Initiative to develop an Addendum to the 2016 GCTF Good Practices (22 Feb)



MULTI-AGENCY MEETINGS, PROGRAMMES

UNICRI-Stockholm International Peace Research Institute Expert Group Meeting on Private Military Companies explored links between private military companies, criminality, terrorism and their effects on international peace and security (14 Feb)

4th INTERPOL-UNICRI Global Meeting on **Responsible AI for Law Enforcement** reaffirmed its commitment to responsible Al innovation (20-23 Feb)
