KEY HIGH-LEVEL EVENTS

- → The 10th Geneva Peace Week focused on "Building Trust, Building Peace: An Agenda for the Future" (30 Oct-3 Nov)
- → Annual briefing of the Subsidiary Body Chairs to UNSC highlighted expanded coordinated efforts to strengthen counter-terrorism work in addressing the evolving threat (15 Nov)
- → INTERPOL's 91st General Assembly officially marked its 100 years, analyzed strategies to leverage technology and \rightarrow UNSC cooperation mechanisms (28 Nov-1 Dec)



→ UN Vulnerable Targets Programme Steering Committee meeting discussed progress achieved and agreed on next strategic priorities to support Member States (5 Dec)

- **KEY ISSUES RAISED BY HEADS OF ENTITIES**
- → SG Guterres, in a UNSC meeting, reiterated collective support to Member States to address the links between transnational organized crime and terrorism through the UN Global Counter-Terrorism Coordination Compact (7 Dec)
- UNOCT USG Voronkov underlined that coordinated and multilateral responses are required to address the evolving threat of terrorism (4 Dec)
- CTED ASG Gherman noted the importance of supporting Member States' efforts to advance more meaningful accountability for sexual and gender-based violence linked to terrorism (15 Nov)

→ UNHCR High Commissioner for Human Rights Türk stressed that failure to uphold human rights will lead to deepening hostility, suffering & violence and the loss of our capacity to deter crises or to deliver solutions (5 Nov)



UN Women ED Bahous highlighted that violence against women and girls, in all its forms, is a "hindrance to peace, a hindrance to security, and a hindrance to sustainable development" (22 Nov)



- → OPCW and Spain jointly organized a → UNODC and NCTC of Maldives held a → INTERPOL General Assembly voted to admit the Republic of Palau as the 196th member of its organization (28 Nov)
 - → UNOCT signed an MoU with the Institute for Strategic and Regional Studies (5 Dec)




- → UNOCT quarterly briefing to Member States discussed common efforts to confront the global threat of terrorism and the way forward (11 Dec)


