





# EU-UN Global Terrorism Threats Facility

A new modality for UN technical assistance, in cooperation with the European Union, to provide rapid and flexible support to Member States facing an urgent or evolving terrorist threat or situation. It seeks to help Member States increase their capacities to detect, prevent, counter, respond to and investigate evolving terrorist threats, while ensuring the respect for international law, including human rights and the rule of law.

### **PRINCIPLES**

# The Facility will be delivered according to two principles:

- 1. It will be **demand-driven** based on official requests from a Member State; and
- 2. It will be complementary to other UN and EU support.

Member States are encouraged to draw on the recommendations from the assessment visits conducted by the Security Council's Counter-Terrorism Committee, through its Executive Directorate (CTED) in their requests.

### THREE CORE ACTIVITIES

## The Facility will be delivered through three types of activities:

- Tailored technical assistance will be provided through the deployment of experts for advisory and mentoring support, in a number of thematic areas determined by Member States' requests;
- **2. Training activities or workshops**, which could be co-organized with UNOCT's global capacity building programmes and other UN entities' efforts; and
- 3. Limited provision of light, non-lethal equipment.
