The [United Nations Countering Terrorist Travel \('CT Travel'\) Programme](#), a flagship global initiative of the [United Nations Office of Counter-Terrorism \(UNOCT\)](#), assists Member States in building their capabilities to detect and counter-terrorists and other serious criminals by using Advance Passenger Information (API) and Passenger Name Record (PNR) data to improve the use of international databases with known and suspected terrorists and criminals, and enhance international information exchange, in accordance with Security Council resolutions [2178](#) (2014), [2396](#) (2017), and [2482](#) (2019), as well as international standards and recommended practices and human rights principles.

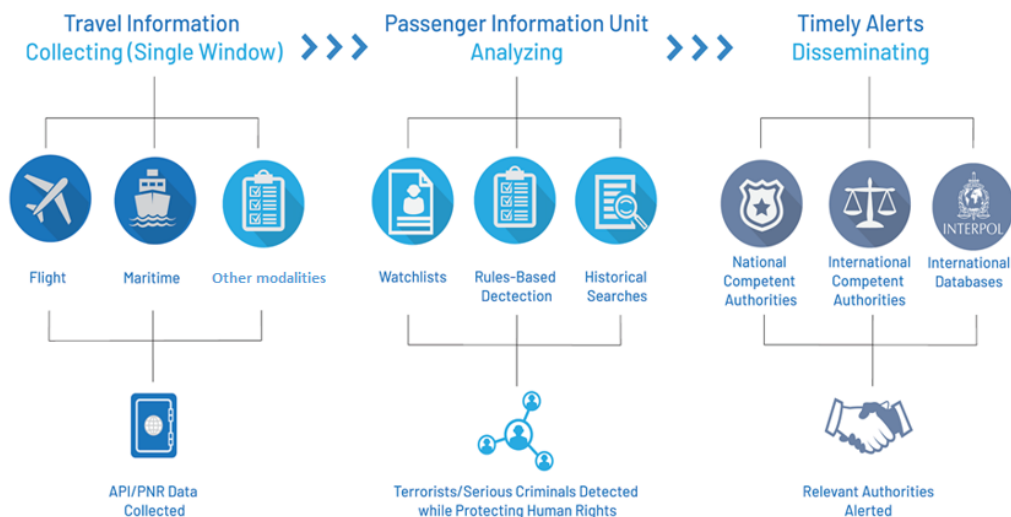

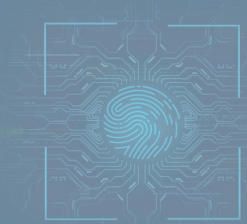

UN Countering Terrorist Travel Programme



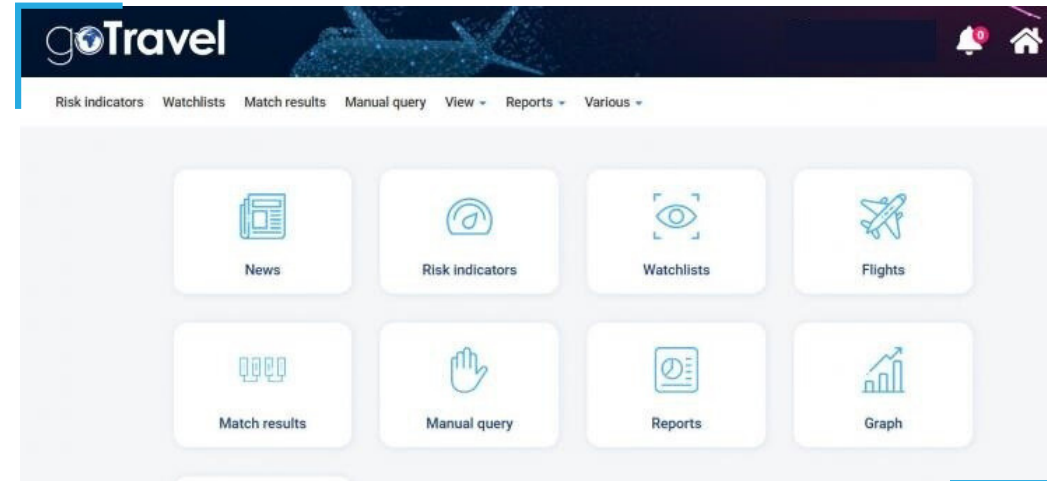
The Countering Terrorist Travel Programme provides assistance to Member States across four key pillars of work, to build or enhance the detection capacity, known as Passenger Information Units (PIUs), applied depending on the state of readiness priorities of beneficiary Member States. This follows an assessment of the beneficiary Member State's current needs and joint development of a roadmap for implementation with national stakeholders through:

- 1** First, legislative assistance to put in place a legal framework that regulates the collection, processing and protection of data;
- 2** Second, operational assistance to set-up a Passenger Information Unit, including training and drafting standard operating procedures;
- 3** Third, facilitating air carrier engagement and connectivity, by building close cooperation with the transport industry; and
- 4** Fourth, providing technical assistance and support to deploy the goTravel software to collect, process, and analyze passenger data.



goTravel

The collection, sharing, analysis, and dissemination of data by the PIUs is empowered by the UN goTravel software system.



This technology is part of the comprehensive support package provided to beneficiary Member States and includes training, sharing of good practices, and expert advice. The goTravel software is a reconfigured version of the Travel Information Portal (TRIP) system donated by the Kingdom of the Netherlands. Each beneficiary Member State also has secured access to the [Cooperative Online Platform \(COP\)](#), which allows real-time interactive collaborations and information exchange to share best practices and lessons learned.
