FINANCIAL REPORT AS AT 31 DECEMBER 2014 ON THE STATUS OF THE ASSISTANCE FUND UNDER PART VII OF THE AGREEMENT FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF THE UNITED NATIONS CONVENTION ON THE LAW OF THE SEA OF 10 DECEMBER 1982 RELATING TO THE CONSERVATION AND MANAGEMENT OF STRADDLING FISH STOCKS AND HIGHLY MIGRATORY FISH STOCKS<sup>1</sup>

## September 2015

#### 1. Introduction

In November 2003, the United Nations General Assembly, in Resolution A/RES/58/14, established an Assistance Fund under Part VII of the Agreement for the Implementation of the Provisions of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea of 10 December 1982 relating to the Conservation and Management of Straddling Fish Stocks and Highly Migratory Fish Stocks (1995 UN Fish Stocks Agreement), to assist developing States Parties in the implementation of the Agreement. It also decided that the Fund would be administered by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO). On 19 April 2005, the Fund was established.<sup>2</sup> It is managed in accordance with the Fund's Terms of Reference and FAO's Financial Regulations as well as other applicable Rules.

### 2. Contributions to the Assistance Fund

The United Nations and FAO have continued to call for contributions to the Assistance Fund at international fora including Sessions of the United Nations General Assembly and the FAO Committee on Fisheries (COFI) as well as on the Assistance Fund's Website.<sup>3</sup> A call for contributions was also made during the 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> round of Informal Consultations of States Parties to the United Nations Fish Stocks Agreement (New York, 7-8 April 2014 and 16-17 March 2015).

As at 31 December 2014 the Governments of Australia, Canada, Iceland, Lebanon, New Zealand, Norway and the United States of America, all States Parties to the 1995 UN Fish Stocks Agreement, had made financial contributions to the Assistance Fund totalling USD 1,467,455. Table 1 shows contributions to the Fund together with accrued interest of USD 49,342. As at 31 December 2014 the Fund's total receipts were USD 1,516,797. In 2014 no financial contributions were received. Due to the near depletion of the fund, States Parties were informed in October 2014 that the use of the fund was temporarily being suspended and applications for assistance were not being accepted until its replenishment.

# 3. Requests for Assistance from the Fund

Information about the existence and purpose of the Assistance Fund has been disseminated widely by the United Nations and FAO, including through electronic means, international meetings and contacts with relevant regional fisheries bodies. In 2014, 27 applications for travel were received. Of this total, 24 were considered favourably, processed and funded. Two applications were not funded because the one-month advance notice rule was not respected. The total number of travel requests in 2014 was lower than in 2013 (36 requests) since the use of the fund was suspended in November 2014 due to lack of funds available.

Table 2 provides details of expenditure from the Assistance Fund as at 31 December 2014. Expenditure is categorized according to the purposes for which assistance is permitted and administrative expenses, as reflected, respectively, in paragraphs 14 and 21 of the Fund's Terms of Reference.

In 2014 total expenditure from the Fund was USD 149,147 of which:

- 72 percent supported participation in technical and annual sessions of regional and subregional fisheries management organizations and arrangements (Commission for the Conservation of Antarctic Marine Living Resources (CCAMLR), Indian Ocean Tuna Commission (IOTC), International Commission for the Conservation of Atlantic Tuna (ICCAT), Pacific Islands Forum Fisheries Agency (FFA), South-East Atlantic Fisheries Organization (SEAFO), South Pacific Regional Fisheries Management Organisation (SPRFMO) and the Western and Central Pacific Fisheries Commission (WCPFC)) (paragraph 14 (a) of the Terms of Reference);
- 19 percent supported participation in meetings of global organizations (FAO Committee on Fisheries; Informal Consultations of States Parties to the United Nations Fish Stocks Agreement; Global Oceans Action Summit) (paragraph 14 (b) of the Terms of Reference);
- 6 percent supported participation in meetings in connection with building capacity in relation to flag State responsibility, MCS, data collection and scientific research at a national and/or regional level (paragraph 14 (d) of the Terms of Reference);
- 3 percent supported attendance at meetings related to the settlement of disputes between States Parties to the Agreement (paragraph 14 (g) of the Terms of Reference).

# 4. Panel of Experts

The Panel of Experts was not convened in 2014.

# 5. Assistance Fund Travel Allocations by State Party

Table 3 provides an allocation of travel expenditure by State Party and by category of expenditure under paragraph 14 of the terms of reference for the period 2006 to 2014. Twelve Parties benefitted from funding in 2014.

#### 6. Assistance Fund Balance

As at 31 December 2014 the balance in the Assistance Fund was USD 24,273 (see Tables 1 and 2).

### 7. Conclusion

Over the duration of the Fund's operation from 2006 to 2014,71 percent of expenditure was devoted to supporting Parties to the Agreement participate in RFMO and global meetings, 6 percent went to support Parties' participation in negotiations for new RFMOs, 21 percent was directed to capacity development, a very small percentage supported issues related to dispute settlement and 2 percent was for administrative and associated costs (Table 2).

The Assistance Fund was established, and is being managed, in accordance with its Terms of Reference and FAO's Financial Regulations and other applicable Rules. The United Nations and FAO encourage States, intergovernmental organizations, international financial institutions, national institutions, non-governmental organizations, as well as natural and juridical persons, to make voluntary financial contributions to the Fund. The United Nations and FAO seek to ensure that the Assistance Fund maintains a healthy funding level so that support for the implementation of the 1995 UN Fish Stocks Agreement can be sustained.
