Delegations are requested to organize their interventions around the following questions so as to frame the discussions on assessing the effectiveness of the Agreement:¹

1. In which areas is implementation of the Agreement and the recommendations adopted at the Review Conference in 2016 proceeding generally well, and in which areas could such implementation be strengthened?
2. What means could be proposed to further strengthen the substance and methods of implementation of the Agreement?
