A panel of experts will examine intersectional approaches to disability in policy, programs, and data analysis. This event will address cross-disability issues relating to gender, race, indigeneity, and youth, and consider how they are impacted by policy, legislation, and environmental reforms. Increasingly, intersectionality is being applied in research, policy and practice; at the same time, there are a number of challenges for the practical application of intersectionality, especially in the areas of policy, programs and services relating to persons with disabilities. Does the application of intersectional policies and tools help governments to improve the inclusion of persons with disabilities in program, policy, and service delivery development?
