* At its 5th plenary meeting, on 10 December 2019, the Council decided to further postpone the election of the following outstanding vacancies of the Commission: one from the Western European and other States for a term beginning on the date of election and expiring at the close of the Commission's 58th session, in 2020; two from the Western European and other States for a term beginning on the date of election and expiring at the close of the Commission's 59th session, in 2021; one from the Asia-Pacific States for a term beginning on the date of election and expiring at the close of the Commission's sixty-first session in 2023; and one from the Eastern European States, one from the Latin American and Caribbean States and two from the Western European and other states for a four-year term beginning at the first meeting of the Commission's fifty-ninth session in 2020 and expiring at the close of the Commission's sixty-second session in 2024.
