2. Minor equipment allowance: max. equivalent US\$100.
3. Thesis allowance: max. equivalent US\$750.
4. Insurance premium: US\$39.72/month/fellow or participant.
5. Termination (separation) allowance (effective 1 May 1995) :
  - a) A lump sum payment of equiv. US\$100 for fellowships up to 6 mos.
  - b) A lump sum payment of equiv. US\$200 for fellowships up to 1 yr.
  - c) A lump sum payment up to a maximum of equiv. US\$400 for long-term fellowships, at the discretion of the agency if circumstances of the fellowship, including its duration, so warranted.
