Excellency,

We thank you for participating in the 6<sup>th</sup> Development Cooperation Forum (DCF) Survey of progress in national mutual accountability and transparency, conducted by the United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UNDESA).

Participants value the DCF Survey for promoting candid dialogue on international development cooperation, mutual learning among stakeholders, and improved coordination within governments and with international development cooperation partners. This has increased transparency of development cooperation information, fostered knowledge exchange between countries and improved monitoring, review and accountability of development cooperation. The survey process encourages and supports consultation between Ministries and domestic actors and beneficiaries in developing countries, and their international development cooperation partners.

The DCF Survey is structured around key enablers of effective development cooperation, such as National Development Cooperation Policies (NDCPs), country-driven results frameworks, clear institutional structures with dialogue forums, quality information on development cooperation, and capacity support. These enablers can serve as building blocks in designing and implementing integrated national financing frameworks (INFFs) and optimal mobilization and management of financial and non-financial resources to achieve national sustainable development strategies.

Confidential country responses and inputs directly feed, without attribution, into the UN-led intergovernmental and inter-agency processes and reports. These include the Development Cooperation Forum, ECOSOC Forum on Financing for Development and the High-level Political Forum on Sustainable Development, as well as the Report of the Secretary-General to the DCF and the Financing for Sustainable Development Report (FSDR) by the Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF). The groundwork laid by countries completing this survey also facilitates preparation and follow-up of the Voluntary National Reviews of progress toward the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

When it is a separate document, it is typically called "aid policy", "development assistance policy", "partnership strategy", or similar.
