



- Available on website; regularly updated



Part I - adoption of legal instruments related to international migration


Part II - demographic indicators, including (a) population estimates and projections, (b) rates of population change, and (c) effect of net migration on population change

Part III - development indicators, including life expectancy, GDP per capita, remittances, and other


Part IV - international migrant stock by sex and age, country of origin and destination, refugee population, and tertiary students studying abroad













The number of countries experiencing population decline will increase



Net migration the only driver of population growth in developed countries (millions)








