2000

Increasing relevance of international human rights regime, the standards of which frame and check state power.

International Migrants Bill of Rights

Consolidates the key rights of migrants based on the current patchwork of international law and standards

23 core articles drawn from core human rights treaties

IMBR.info

"...ensure full respect and protection for their human rights and fundamental freedoms"..." in transit and after arrival."

"Declaration and its appendices... to be implemented in a manner that is consistent with the rights and obligations of States under international law."

The Global Compacts

What is the extent to which rights are protected across states? Emphasis on data collection.

If we knew the answer, it would be easier to identify a common baseline of protections, and identify the areas where protections can be enhanced.

Methods

65 binary indicators, based on IMBR indicators

Independent coders, double-blind

Applicable to any national legal structure

5 pilot countries (GER, MEX, RUS, ZAF, TUR)



Sample Questions:

LIBERTY

Does the national law provide migrants with full freedom to hold opinions commensurate with that afforded citizens?

Do migrant workers have the right to redress if the terms of their employment contract have been violated by their employer?

Coders cite statute and case law for full transparency and replicability






