# 1. Rational for resource tracking



.... in which the Assembly requested the Secretary-General to prepare **periodic reports** for the substantive sessions of the Economic and Social Council **on the flow of financial resources for assisting in the implementation of the Programme of Action** and to promote the exchange of information on the requirements for international assistance among the members of the donor community

ECOSOC resolution 1995/55 of 28 July 1995, endorsed reviewing on a regular basis the flow of financial resources



..... requesting the United Nations Population Fund, in consultation with the Secretariat, to prepare technical recommendations on a potential revision of the methods, categories and data sources used as the basis for preparing this report, as well as the future scope, format and periodicity of the report.




Total ODA by DAC and non-DAC donors, 1990—2016



ODA to population data and policy analysis, and sexual and reproductive health, 2002-2015







# 4. Summary of recommendations

# **Challenges Resolved**



Challenge	Suggested response
Weak national reporting	Track ODA via the DAC data base; Re-appraise every 4 years, and strengthen National Accounting capacity
Overlap of Costed Components in SRH	Aggregate "sexual and reproductive health"
Estimated "shares' – undermining replicability	Use funding codes that best match the component to be measured; avoid "shares"
Limited Scope – Only 4 costed components	Augment annual tracking of ODA for costed components with other themes relevant to ICPD, and the annual theme;

## This report recommends the following:



Future reports focus on official development assistance, tracking resource allocations by Development Assistance Committee member countries, as recorded in the OECD creditor reporting system;

Resource tracking expands beyond the 4 costed components, to include development categories pertinent to the Programme of Action;

Continue to Report on an annual basis, subject to a quadrennial review on the potential of new data, data on other donors, and emerging data on domestic expenditures.
