## Mr. Chairman,

- 2. Make full use of modern communication means such as the Internet to maximize the dissemination of demographic research results so as to enable as many government decision-makers, program managers and academic researchers as possible to make full use of such research results.
- 3. Reinforce capacity building of developing countries in the aspects such as standardized demographic data collection, analysis of demographic changes and national strategic studies on population. Due to different national socioeconomic development levels and acceleration of economic globalization, the population trend of many countries features increasing uncertainties. As such, reinforcing capacity building of developing countries in these regards is of critical importance to the realization of the ICPD goals and the MDGs.
