





# Side Event on the margins of the 55<sup>th</sup> Session of the United Nations Commission on Population and Development

# Population and Inclusive Development in the Arab Region: Building Back Better for All

April 27, 2022 Time: 12:00-13:15 Cairo Time

### I. Background

The special theme of the 55th session of the Commission on Population and Development this year will be "Population and sustainable development, in particular sustained and inclusive economic growth".

Population dynamics, sustained economic growth, and poverty have been focus of several global frameworks, notably the ICPD Programme of Action 1994 and more recently in the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. The interlinkages between the three topics have received increasing attention from academics and policy makers. However, this focus has intensified due the COVID-19 pandemic, and its negative impacts that extended beyond health concerns, to regressing national economies, reversing progress towards development, and threatening the overall wellbeing of individuals, especially the most vulnerable.

Poverty and unemployment continue to plague the Arab region. The COVID-19 pandemic has disrupted sustainable development and compounded existing challenges. The pandemic has ushered in a new era that compels us to reinvent our economies to be more resilient, socially inclusive, and environmentally sound. An inclusive economy aims to achieve sustainable development by addressing urgent needs for rapid economic growth and poverty alleviation.

Against this backdrop, and in line with the CPD 55<sup>th</sup> Session thematic focus, the League of Arab States/Population Policies Department, the Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia (ESCWA), and the United Nations Population Fund-Arab States Regional Office (UNFPA – ASRO), will organize a virtual side event on the margins of the CPD 2022, titled "Population and inclusive development in the Arab Region: Building Back Better for All".

#### II. Objectives

In this pursuit, the side event will explore linkages between population, inclusion, and sustainable development in the Arab Region. It will focus on reflecting on the lessons learnt from the COVID-19 pandemic and means to build back better for all people ensuring inclusive economic growth and sustainable development. This session zooms into the distinct yet interrelated issues of population groups including older persons, migrants, youth, women and persons with disability. Given that including the most marginalized and vulnerable is integral to the 'leaving no one behind' agenda, the side event will consider how best to prepare for inclusive recovery processes that put populations' well-being at the top of the agenda.

The main objectives of the planned side event are the following:

- Ensure evolving population dynamics are at the center of the regional sustainable development agenda
- Discuss the state of inclusion in economic growth of population groups in vulnerable situations in the Arab Region
- Reflect on the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on population groups in vulnerable situations
- Highlight promising practices in including different population groups in the development process
- Explore policy recommendations to promote more inclusive and sustainable development process for all population groups

#### III. Date and time and modality

The side event will be organized on April 27th 2022, from 12:00 to 13:15 Cairo Time.

Due to the COVID-19 restrictions, the side event will be held virtually via ZOOM platform. The Zoom link will be shared with confirmed participants in due time.
