We should also consider relevant outcomes of more recent events.

On 6 and 7 September 2022, the Population Division organized an expert group meeting that featured discussions of the latest evidence and analyses related to the theme of this year's session, "Population, Education and Sustainable Development".

The Transforming Education Summit, held in September 2022, addressed the global crisis in education and mobilized leadership and commitment in key areas of action. These included: expanding access to quality education, making schools safe, healthy and inclusive, advancing gender equality, and empowering teachers.
