



In 2003, the Commission on Population and Development had a similar theme.




Population and education are interlinked






The influence of population on education


3. Population challenges to human capital investment




At aggregate level, human capital investment is similar in countries with high and low youth populations.

About 5% of GDP.

3. Population challenges to human capital investment




At individual level, differences in human capital investment are large and driven by demographic differences.



Influence of education on lifecycle demographic processes:

- Fertility, marriage, family formation.
- Mortality, morbidity, health.
- Migration


Fertility and Education, 2000




Difference in the level of fertility between countries is strongly correlated with educational attainment.

Fertility and Education, 1950-2015




Life Expectancy and Education, 2000

Sustainable Development

- The population-education nexus is important for achievement of multiple sustainable development goals.
- It impacts:
 - Inclusion: "leaving no one behind"; gender equality; intra-generational and inter-generational equity;
 - **Economies:** economic growth (the demographic, education, and gender dividends); fiscal sustainability of public sector programs;
 - Individual well-being: autonomy, health, and economic opportunity.
- Focusing on the population-education nexus responds to the SG's call in "Our Common Agenda" to place long-term intergenerational thinking at the heart of national governance and the multilateral system.












