Wolfgang Lutz is Interim Deputy Director General for Science at the International Institute for Applied Systems Analysis (IIASA) and the Founding Director of the Wittgenstein Centre for Demography and Global Human Capital, a cooperation between the University of Vienna, IIASA, and the Austrian Academy of Sciences.

He has expertise in global population changes and the interactions between demographic changes, the economy, the environment, and the educational structure of populations. He has previously served as member of an Independent Group of Scientists appointed by the UN Secretary-General, which produced the *Global Sustainable Development Report 2019: The Future is Now – Science for Achieving Sustainable Development.* He also served as Director of the World Population Program at IIASA from 1994-2020 and as Director of the Austrian Academy of Sciences from 2002 to 2022.

He has published over 280 scientific articles, including 24 in Science, Nature, and PNAS, and written or edited 27 books and special issues.
