Paragraph 70 of the International Migration Review Forum Progress Declaration

Member States 'request the Secretary-General, in his next biennial report, to propose, for the consideration of Member States, **a limited set of indicators**, drawing on the global indicator framework for the Sustainable Development Goals and targets of the 2030 Agenda as contained in General Assembly resolution 71/313 of 6 July 2017 and other relevant frameworks, to assist Member States, upon their request, in conducting inclusive reviews of progress related to the implementation of the Global Compact, as well as to include **a comprehensive strategy for improving disaggregated migration data** at the local, national, regional and global levels.'



Deliverables

2023

- Conduct a **mapping** of relevant approaches to measuring the governance of migration in general and with a specific focus on the Global Compact for Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration
- Develop a **proposal** for a limited set of indicators, building on existing indicators and data collection processes, including the work of the UN Expert Group on Migration Statistics
- Conduct **consultations** with Member States and a wide range of relevant stakeholders on the limited set of indicators

2024

- Develop a **comprehensive strategy** for improving disaggregated migration data
- Conduct a **technical consultation** on the draft comprehensive strategy for improving disaggregated migration data



Key principles guiding the workstream

Inclusiveness

- Encourage participation in the activities of the workstream by a broad range of relevant **stakeholders**
- Conduct **regional** and **global consultations** with **Member States** and other **stakeholders** on the proposal of a limited set of indicators

Efficiency

- Build on **existing frameworks**, such as the **SDG** global indicator framework
- Maximize **synergies** to link GCM reporting processes with other monitoring tools

Transparency

- Conduct briefings, informal hearings, consultations and other meetings both **virtually** and **in person**, and ensure that they are widely accessible including through the **GCM Talks platform**
- Disseminate the mapping, proposals, presentations and summaries of all briefings and consultations via the **Hub**



Inclusiveness

- **10 members in the workstream** (preliminary): Global Research Forum on Diaspora and Transnationalism, ILO, IFAD, IOM, International Trade Union Confederation, OHCHR, UN DESA, UNDP, WHO, the World Bank
- **1 questionnaire** to Member States and stakeholders to gather their views on the purpose and scope of the limited set of indicators
- **8 consultations** on the proposed set of indicators:
 - **5 regional** for Member States and stakeholders (virtual): in Asia and the Pacific, Europe and Northern America, Latin America and the Caribbean, Middle East and North Africa, and sub-Saharan Africa
 - **2 global** for Member States and stakeholders (in person): in Geneva and New York
 - **1 global** dedicated for **stakeholders**: modalities to be determined



Efficiency

- A systematic **mapping** of relevant approaches to measuring the governance of migration in general and with a specific focus on the GCM. Priority will be given to those already endorsed by an intergovernmental body, including the **global indicator framework for the Sustainable Development Goals and targets of the 2030 Agenda**
- The **proposal** for a limited set of indicators will build **on existing indicators and data collection processes**, including the work of **the UN Expert Group on Migration Statistics** to be adopted at 54th session of the United Nations Statistics Commission (28 February to 3 March 2023)



Transparency

- **Technical briefings** and **informal hearing** to introduce the work plan and share the proposed timeline
 - 2 for Member States and stakeholders: 1 in New York (in person) and 1 (virtual -- via **GCM Talks**)
 - 1 for Champion Countries in Geneva (hybrid)
- The consultations on the proposed set of indicators will be **accessible** through the platform **GCM Talks**
- The initial **mapping** of indicators, the **proposal** for a limited set of indicators and the **summaries** of the regional and global **consultations** will be disseminated via the **Hub**
- The **proposal** for a limited set of indicators will be reviewed and revised iteratively **3 times** following the regional and global consultations before being sent for approval to the **Executive Committee** of the United Nations Network on Migration

April

- **First preliminary proposal of the limited set of indicators** (shared via the Hub)
- Regional consultation for **MS & S** on the proposal in Asia and the Pacific (virtual - GCM Talks)
- Regional consultation for **MS & S** in Latin America and the Caribbean (virtual - GCM Talks)



May

- Regional consultation for **MS & S** in Middle East and North Africa (virtual - GCM Talks)
- Regional consultation for **MS & S** in sub-Saharan Africa (virtual - GCM Talks)
- Regional consultation for **MS & S** in Europe and Northern America (virtual - GCM Talks)

July

- **Revised proposal of the limited set of indicators** (shared via the Hub)
- Global consultation for **MS & S** in New York (in person and GCM Talks)
- Global dedicated **stakeholder** consultation (modalities tbc - GCM Talks)

September/October

- **Revised proposal of the limited set of indicators** (shared via the Hub)
- Global consultation for **MS & S** in Geneva (in person and GCM Talks)

Late 2023

- **Final revision of the proposal of the limited set of indicators** (shared via the Hub)
- Proposal submitted for approval to the Executive Committee of the UN Migration Network



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
