

Biographies of speakers



H.E. Mr. Abdulaziz M. Alwasil has served as the Ambassador and Permanent Representative of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia to the United Nations Headquarters in New York since July 2022, and to the United Nations Office in Geneva since November 2016. He also served as the Chair of the Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) on its 69th session. Previously, he served as Deputy Head of Mission at Saudi Arabia's Embassy in London for more than three years. During his diplomatic career, he was also assigned to the Saudi Arabian Mission to the United Nations Office in Geneva and the Saudi Arabian Embassy in Australia. At the beginning of his career, Mr. Alwasil worked as a college lecturer. He has published several articles on social and political issues. Dr. Alwasil holds a PhD in international relations, a master's degree in political science and a bachelor's degree in Arabic language and literature.



Ms. Krassimira Beshkova has served as the Deputy Permanent Representative of Bulgaria to the United Nations since 2022, and as acting Chargé d'Affaires, a.i., since March 2025. Ms. Beshkova joined the Bulgarian Foreign Service in 1996. From 2002 to 2006, she served as Legal Adviser with the Permanent Mission of Bulgaria to the United Nations and was also a member of the Bulgarian UNSC team. During part of her second posting to New York (2016-2020), she served as the Deputy Permanent Representative. Between 2009 and 2012, Ms. Beshkova was posted with the Permanent Mission of Bulgaria to the European Union in Brussels. During 2014-2015, she served as the Permanent Representative to the Council of Europe in Strasbourg for the preparation of the Chairmanship of Bulgaria of the Committee of Ministers. Ms. Beshkova holds a master's degree in law from Sofia University.



Ms. Nombulelo Dlamini is the Director of the National Population Unit in the Ministry of Economic Planning and Development of Eswatini, overseeing the implementation of national population policies and coordinating with government sectors and international organizations. Ms. Dlamini is a highly accomplished professional with over 24 years of progressive experience in demography, statistics, data management, project coordination and policy implementation. Ms. Dlamini has advanced skills in data analysis, and she has developed comprehensive monitoring and evaluation frameworks. Ms. Dlamini holds a master's degree in population studies from Liverpool University in the United Kingdom, and a bachelor's degree in social sciences, majoring in economics and statistics.



Mr. Hugo Allan García Monterrosa is the Undersecretary of Strategic Analysis for Development at the Secretariat of Planning and Programming of the Presidency in Guatemala, where he coordinates the implementation and monitoring of the country's National Priorities and the Sustainable Development Goals. Previously, he served as the Deputy Technical Manager at the National Institute of Statistics, where he led the base year change of the Consumer Price Index and promoted the Geoportal with the support of the Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC), as well as the open data portal. He also worked as a fiscal transparency advisor at the Ministry of Public Finance, where he designed a key financial model for the parametric insurance contract against excessive rainfall and developed fiscal transparency portals. He has master's degree in mathematical sciences from the National Autonomous University of Mexico, and a bachelor's degree in applied mathematics from the University of San Carlos of Guatemala.



H.E. Mr. Anatolio Ndong Mba has served as the Ambassador and Permanent Representative of Equatorial Guinea to the United Nations since January 2010. He is also serving as the Vice-President of the Economic and Social Council. Previously, Mr. Ndong Mba served as a representative of the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) in Djibouti, Angola, Sao Tome and Principe, Ghana and Guinea-Bissau (1997-2008), as well as the Deputy Regional Representative of FAO for Africa (2001-2004). Mr. Ndong Mba has extensive ministerial experience, including as Minister of State for Fisheries and Forestry (1996-1997); Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Finance and Equatorial Guinea Governor at the International Monetary Fund (1994-1996); Minister of State for Planning and International Cooperation and Equatorial Guinea Governor to the World Bank (1992-1994); and Minister for Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries and Forestry (1989-1992). He has also served as Secretary-General in the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development (1986-1989); Chief of Staff of the Planning, Research and Monitoring Project (1984-1986) and Secretary-General (1982-1984) in the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries and Forestry; and Director General of Livestock (1981-1982). Mr. Ndong Mba holds a Bachelor of Science in agro-livestock from Zagazig University in Egypt, as well as diplomas in animal production and rural credit.



Ms. Yoshita Singh is an award-winning multi-media journalist with over 21 years of experience, including 16 years as a foreign correspondent. She is currently the Chief United Nations and New York Correspondent for Press Trust of India (PTI), India's largest newswire headquartered in New Delhi. Ms. Singh has previously been posted in the Boston area, Chicago and New Delhi. Her area of reporting and expertise include foreign policy, international relations, United Nations and its agencies, US and India relations, global trade, politics, business, culture and multilateral relations. As PTI's only correspondent in the New York area since August 2011, Ms. Singh has covered a broad spectrum of subjects - from the annual high-level UN General Assembly sessions, visits by Indian Prime Ministers, US Presidential elections to the T20 Cricket World Cup. She sits on the jury of the New York Indian Film Festival, the oldest and most prestigious film festival showcasing cinema from and about the Indian subcontinent. Ms. Singh's work is cited in critically acclaimed books, trade publications, research papers, think-tank reports and journals.
