H.E. Ambassador Eva Åkerman-Börje is the Director of the Department for Migration and Asylum Policy in the Swedish Ministry of Justice and the Swedish focal point for the Global Forum on Migration and Development. During Sweden's Presidency of the European Union, she served as the Chair of the High Level Working Group on Asylum and Migration in the Council of Ministers.

Mr. John Bingham is Head of Policy at the International Catholic Migration Commission (ICMC). Before joining ICMC, Mr. Bingham worked with Catholic Charities in New York, where he was Director of the Department of Immigrant and Refugee Services and later Director of the Department of Capital Projects and Law. He coordinated the civil society activities at the 2011 Global Forum on Migration and Development.

Ms. Pratikshya Bohra-Mishra is a Research Associate at the Office of Population Research of Princeton University. Her research interests span from the determinants of migration to migrant integration. She has carried out research on the relationship of migration and the environment in Nepal.

Professor François Crépeau holds the Hans and Tamar Oppenheimer Chair in Public International Law and is scientific director of the Centre for Human Rights and Legal Pluralism at McGill University in Canada. He served as vice-president of the Canadian Human Rights Foundation and Director of the *Revue québécoise de droit international*. Mr. Crépeau was appointed United Nations Special Rapporteur on the human rights of migrants in 2011.

Mr. Jean-Christophe Dumont is the Head of the International Migration Division in the Directorate for Employment, Labour and Social Affairs at the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) in Paris, France. He is an expert on the integration of migrants into the labour market and is co-author of the OECD's *International Migration Outlook*.

Professor Andrew Geddes is Professor in the Department of Politics at the University of Sheffield in the United Kingdom and currently a Fernand Braudel Senior Fellow in the Department of Political and Social Sciences at the European University Institute, Florence. Between 2009 and 2011 he was as a member of the Lead Expert Group that authored the *Foresight report on Migration and Global Environmental Change: Future Challenges and Opportunities* which analyses the potential implications of environmental and climate change for human migration over the next 50 years.

H.E. Ambassador Eduard Gnesa is Special Ambassador for International Cooperation in Migration at the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation, Federal Department of Foreign Affairs. Prior to that, he served as Director of Federal Office for Migration and as Director of the Federal Office for Immigration, Integration and Emigration. Ambassador Gnesa was Chair-in-Office of the 2011 Global Forum on Migration and Development.

Ms. Sabine Henning is a Population Affairs Officer in the Migration Section of the United Nations Population Division, Department of Economic and Social Affairs. Before joining the Division in 2000, she was Research Specialist and Adjunct Assistant Professor at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock.

Mr. Ali Mansoor is the Financial Secretary at the Ministry of Finance and Economic Development in Mauritius since 2006 and is Chair-in-Office of the 2012 Global Forum on Migration and Development. Previously he held positions as Economist at the International Monetary Fund, the World Bank and the European Commission.

Mr. Dilip Ratha is the Lead Economist and Manager of the Migration and Remittances Team in the Development Prospects Group at the World Bank.
