



Of the 6.9 billion people in the world in 2010




... 214 million or 3.1 per cent were international migrants

as South-North migration










International migrants in Africa and Asia are relatively young ...

Percentage of migrant stock under age 20, 2010




... while they are older in Latin America and Europe

Percentage of migrant stock age 65 or over, 2010
















Røle of South - North migration in immigration flows




Impact of the financial crisis: inflows of foreigners


















Status of ratification of legal instruments related to international migration by Member States, 1950-2009*








TRENDS IN INTERNATIONAL MIGRANT STOCK:
