- General Assembly Resolution 61/208
 - Possible options for appropriate follow-up to the High-level Dialogue
- General Assembly Resolution 62/270
 - Evaluation of existing cooperation mechanisms on international migration and development

- Work increasingly links development and international migration

Inter-Governmental Cooperation Mechanisms

- A review of activities based on formal regional organizations and informal consultative processes
- Activities have increased
- Many activities associated with the High-level dialogue



Evaluation

- Formal regional consultative processes more successful at follow-up than informal processes
- Institutional support available for follow-up in formal processes
- Informal processes have only begun recently



Method to determine options for follow-up to High-level dialogue

- Short questionnaire sent to all Member States
- Also sent to country Focal Points as designated by the Global Forum on Migration and Development
- 64 Member States responded



Follow-up options

- Continue including an item on international migration and development on the agenda of the General Assembly
- 2. Give special considerations to the ideas and initiatives of the Global Forum on Migration and Development in the General Assembly's deliberations
- 3. Periodically conduct a high-level dialogue in the General Assembly
