UNITED NATIONS NINTH INQUIRY AMONG GOVERNMENTS ON POPULATION AND DEVELOPMENT



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INTRODUCTION

The Programme of Action, adopted by the United Nations International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) in 1994 in Cairo, recommended that "Governments and parliamentarians, in collaboration with the international community and non-governmental organizations, should make the necessary plans ... and take actions required to measure, assess, monitor and evaluate progress towards meeting the goals of the present Programme of Action". This United Nations Ninth Inquiry among Governments on Population and Development is being carried out as a measure toward the achievement of this recommendation.

As in previous United Nations Inquiries, the purpose of the United Nations Ninth Inquiry among Governments on Population and Development is to assist Governments in the monitoring of national population policies and to provide an input into the quinquennial review and appraisal of the Programme of Action of the International Conference on Population and Development, which will be conducted in 2004 by the United Nations Secretariat.

Terminology and concepts used in this Inquiry are identical with those used in the Programme of Action.
