




• Demography of contemporary migration




## Factors affecting contemporary migration in Europe

### **HIV/AIDS in Europe**



# **Changing face of HIV/AIDS**

- "one disease, two epidemics"\*
- Globally one fifth of people in need receive ART
- North of the world:
  - management often inadequate
- South of the world:
  - women represent 77% of newly infected persons
- Inability to face STI:
  - renewed emphasis on the prevention is needed






