



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

#### Data:

- Information collected from <u>113 sources</u> reporting trafficking cases in more than <u>450</u> <u>publications</u> from all over the world
- About <u>5,000 accounts</u> of trafficking recorded between 1996 and 2003
- Detailed information on <u>161 countries</u>

#### Sources of data:






#### Database includes information on:

- Persons trafficked from, through and to a country
- Trafficking routes
- Trafficking for sexual exploitation or forced labour
- Nationality, sex, and age of victims and offenders
- Number of investigations, prosecutions and convictions per country




#### Origin countries of trafficking in persons






#### Transit countries of trafficking in persons






#### Destination countries of trafficking in persons






#### Profile of the victims







## Type of exploitation





### Offenders Nationality






## Global Patterns – Transnational and Internal Trafficking

- Victims are reported to be trafficked from poor territories to more affluent areas.
- Both origin and destination countries have strong presence of organized crime.
- Victims are trafficked from rural areas to more affluent urban areas
- Exploited in the urban areas
- Further trafficked from urban areas abroad
