


World population, 1950-2100


























































Births per woman, 1970-2030











Contraceptive use, 1970-2030











Life expectancy at birth, 1950-2030







Youth cohorts (aged 15-24), 1970-2050










Growth of the numbers of older persons and pension coverage




Proportion of men and women of statutory age receiving a pension in 2010
