# Key migration-related SDG targets

1. Strengthen and retain the health workforce in developing countries (3.c)
2. Increase the number scholarships for study abroad (4.b)
3. Eradicate human trafficking (5.2, 8.7, 16.2)
4. Protect labour rights of migrant workers (8.8)
5. Facilitate orderly, safe, regular and responsible migration (10.7)
6. Reduce transaction costs of remittances (10.c)
7. Establish legal identity including through birth registration (16.9)
8. Disaggregate data by migratory status (17.18)

# Global compact for safe, orderly and regular migration (Annex II)

- What: Framework for international cooperation on migrants and mobility
- When: Adopted at 2018 international conference on international migration
- How: Preparatory process, intergovernmental negotiations

# Global compact for safe, orderly and regular migration – key elements

1. Drivers of migration
2. Safe, orderly, regular and responsible migration and mobility of people through well-managed migration policies
  - a. Cooperation for border control
  - b. Combat human trafficking, migrant smuggling, irregular migration
  - c. Return and readmission
  - d. Protect migrants in vulnerable situations and countries in crisis
3. Contribution of migrants and migration to development
4. Impact of migration on human capital
5. Integration, inclusion and regularization
6. Human rights of migrants; migrants in vulnerable situations
7. Obligations of migrants in host countries
8. Improve labour conditions for migrants
9. Portability of qualifications, skills and earned benefits
10. International cooperation on migration (“governance”)
