2. **Minor equipment allowance: max. equivalent US\$100.**
3. **Thesis allowance: max. equivalent US\$750.**
4. **Insurance premium: US\$39.72/month/fellow or participant.**
5. **Termination (separation) allowance (effective 1 May 1995) :**
  - a) **A lump sum payment of equiv. US\$100 for fellowships up to 6 mos.**
  - b) **A lump sum payment of equiv. US\$200 for fellowships up to 1 yr.**
  - c) **A lump sum payment up to a maximum of equiv. US\$400 for long-term fellowships, at the discretion of the agency if circumstances of the fellowship, including its duration, so warranted.**
