

# Report of the Secretary-General on the pattern of conferences (A/71/116)

7 July 2016

## Supplementary information

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## **I. Calendar of conferences and meetings**

### **A. Requests for exceptions to section I, paragraph 7, of General Assembly resolution 40/243 of 18 December 1985**

#### **1. Committee on Relations with the Host Country**

##### **Memorandum dated 1 June 2016 from the Secretary of the Committee**

As in previous years, I wish to submit a request that the Committee on Relations with the Host Country be permitted to meet at Headquarters during the seventy-first session of the General Assembly.

This request is based on the Committee's mandate set forth in General Assembly resolution 2819 (XXVI) of 15 December 1971 authorizing the Committee to meet periodically during the year or whenever the need arises. The Committee, since its establishment in 1971, has always met during the regular sessions of the General Assembly in order to consider, among other matters, issues experienced by delegations of Member States, to finalize its annual report and to present it to the General Assembly.

Pursuant to its resolution 70/121 of 14 December 2015, the General Assembly affirmed the importance of the Committee being in a position to fulfil its mandate and meet on short notice to deal with urgent and important matters concerning the relations between the United Nations and the host country, and in that connection requested the Secretariat and the Committee on Conferences to accord priority to requests from the Committee on Relations with the Host Country for conference-servicing facilities for meetings of that Committee that must be held while the General Assembly and its Main Committees are meeting, without prejudice to the requirements of those bodies and on an "as available" basis. The Assembly also requested the Committee to continue its work in conformity with General Assembly resolution 2819 (XXVI) and, in this framework, to continue to consider additional appropriate measures to enhance the work of the Committee and its effectiveness.

Having due regard for the nature of the Committee, its work and previous experience, it would suffice to make the necessary conference facilities available for two or three meetings only.

#### **2. Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People**

##### **Letter dated 3 June 2016 from the Chair of the Committee**

As you are aware, the General Assembly, by its resolution 70/12 of 24 November 2015, has again requested the Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People to continue to keep under review the situation relating to the question of Palestine and to report and make suggestions to the General Assembly, the Security Council or the Secretary-General, as appropriate. By the same resolution, the Assembly requested the Secretary-General to continue to provide the Committee with all the necessary facilities for the performance of its tasks.

As the Committee has no control over the timing of the events it is called upon to discuss, it needs to meet throughout the year, as circumstances require. Based on past experience, the Committee would request facilities for approximately three

meetings per General Assembly session. These are in addition to the special meeting in observance of the International Day of Solidarity with the Palestinian People, which is included in each year's calendar.

With regard to the documentation submitted to the General Assembly, please be advised that the Committee submits its annual report (Supplement No. 35) under the agenda item entitled "Question of Palestine". The Committee usually adopts its report in early October of each year, at which point it is submitted for processing.

In the light of the above, I should like to request that authorization again be granted to the Committee on the Exercise of Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People to hold meetings during the forthcoming seventieth [seventy-first] session of the General Assembly, as necessary for carrying out the important mandate entrusted to the Committee by the Assembly.

### **3. Executive Board of the United Nations Children's Fund**

#### **Memorandum dated 6 June 2016 from the Secretary of the Working Group**

We would be grateful if you would, in accordance with the exception referred to in paragraph 7 of General Assembly resolution 40/243:

"Decides that no subsidiary organ of the General Assembly may meet at the United Nations Headquarters during a regular session of the Assembly unless explicitly authorized by the Assembly"

seek on our behalf the approval of the Committee on Conferences for the second regular session of the Executive Board of the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) to meet from 14 to 16 September 2016.

This is with a view to avoiding overlap with the second regular sessions of the other executive boards of the United Nations funds and programmes, which all convene during the beginning of the month of September.

### **4. United Nations System Chief Executives Board for Coordination**

#### **Memorandum dated 6 June 2016 from the Acting Secretary of the Executive Board**

I would be most grateful if you would, in accordance with the exception to paragraph 7 of General Assembly resolution 40/243, seek the approval of the Committee on Conferences for the United Nations System Chief Executives Board for Coordination (CEB) to hold its second regular session for 2016 at United Nations Headquarters in New York on 9 November 2016.

As is usual practice, CEB holds two sessions per year as follows: first regular session (two days in April-May) at the headquarters of one of its member organizations; second regular session (two days in November) held at United Nations Headquarters on the first day.

The Board is chaired by the Secretary-General and comprises the executive heads of United Nations system organizations. The timing of both sessions needs to take into account, inter alia, the timing of its (30) member organizations' own major meetings to ensure the fullest participation possible. Both April-May and November were agreed upon as the most suitable periods.

As for the location of each CEB session, given the commitments of the Secretary-General and those of United Nations system executive heads during the General Assembly sessions, it was agreed to hold the second regular session of CEB at United Nations Headquarters in New York. To ensure geographical balance among Board members, the first regular sessions of CEB are held away from United Nations Headquarters, mostly in Europe.

We have confirmed the support of the office of the Chef de Cabinet for holding of the CEB sessions at United Nations Headquarters in New York on the proposed date.

**5. United Nations Board of Auditors and Panel of External Auditors of the United Nations, the Specialized Agencies and the International Atomic Energy Agency**

**Letter dated 10 June 2016 from the Executive Secretary of the Board**

We would like to seek the Committee's approval to hold the fifty-seventh regular session of the Panel of External Auditors from 21 to 22 November 2016 (second day, morning session only) during the seventy-first session of the General Assembly in New York.

Currently, the members include heads of the supreme audit institutions of the United Republic of Tanzania (Chairman), France (Vice-Chair), India, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Germany, Italy, Ghana, the Philippines and Switzerland.

The meeting location and date are decided a year in advance of the previous session. New York is the meeting venue for this year based on a decision made in December 2015. It would not be possible to change the meeting venue given the high-profile nature of the meeting participants and their busy schedules.

I would be grateful if careful consideration could be given to this request.

**6. Independent Audit Advisory Committee**

**Letter dated 16 June 2016 from the Executive Secretary of the Independent Audit Advisory Committee**

The Independent Audit Advisory Committee was established by the General Assembly in its resolution 60/248 as a subsidiary body to assist the Assembly in fulfilling its oversight responsibilities.

According to its terms of reference (refer: annex to General Assembly resolution 61/275), the Independent Audit Advisory Committee is authorized to meet up to four times a year, in coordination with the relevant activities of the United Nations and the Assembly and in accordance with Assembly resolutions on the pattern of conferences.

To date in 2016, the Independent Audit Advisory Committee has met twice and will meet again from 27 to 29 July in New York. In order to complete its work programme for 2016 and to ensure that it provides timely advice to the General Assembly, the Independent Audit Advisory Committee is planning to hold one final session for this year, from 28 to 30 November 2016.



At the November session, the Independent Audit Advisory Committee plans to discuss, inter alia, the programme of work for the year 2017. The Office of Internal Oversight Services (OIOS) workplan will not be available to the Independent Audit Advisory Committee before November 2016. The Independent Audit Advisory Committee is required to examine the workplan of OIOS, taking into account the workplans of the other oversight bodies (United Nations Board of Auditors and Joint Inspection Unit). In addition, the Independent Audit Advisory Committee will review the OIOS budget proposal under the support account for peacekeeping operations for 2018-2019, taking into account the OIOS workplan, and provide its comments to the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions prior to the Advisory Committee's review of the OIOS budget proposals.

In this regard, I am requesting that the Independent Audit Advisory Committee be granted a waiver to hold its last session from 28 to 30 November 2016, in line with General Assembly resolution 40/243. The granting of this waiver would enable the Independent Audit Advisory Committee to complete its programme of work for 2016.

## II. Utilization of conference-servicing resources and facilities

Utilization of conference-servicing resources and facilities may be measured in terms of a utilization factor, calculated using the following formula:

$$UF = \frac{(A+B)-(C-E)-(F/3)}{(A+B)}$$

where: UF is the utilization factor, the percentage of available conference resources actually used by the organ in question; A is the number of meetings programmed by a given organ at a scheduled session; B is the number of additional meetings held during the session; C is the number of meetings cancelled during the session; E is the total number of reassignments; and F is the amount of time lost owing to late starting/early ending (hours and minutes rounded to the nearest five minutes, for example, 5:25 = 5 hours and 25 minutes).

In the foregoing calculation, the time lost as a result of late starting and early ending (F) is converted into the equivalent of meetings lost by dividing the total by three, as the standard meeting time is three hours. The number of reassignments (E) is subtracted from the number of cancelled meetings (C). The difference between the two and the number of meetings lost are then subtracted from the sum of meetings planned (A) and additional meetings held (B). The result is expressed as a percentage of the sum of meetings programmed and additional meetings held.

The statistics set out in the tables below are compiled in accordance with the methodology adopted by the Committee on Conferences at its 348th meeting, held on 18 May 1993 (see [A/AC.172/161](#) and Corr.1 and 2).

In compliance with the request of the Committee on Conferences at its 1999 substantive session, utilization factors for a three-year reporting period are provided and organs are listed in the order of the utilization factors for the latest reporting period by duty station.

## **VII. Performance matrix as at 31 December 2015**

### **A. Quality measures**

The global e-survey captures feedback from Member States on common indicators covering meeting services, translation and interpretation services and the overall quality of conference services at the four main duty stations. In New York, additional information and ratings are collected on technical Secretariat services.

The e-survey results are presented in section F below. The e-survey has been adapted in various ways. It is now shorter, more user-friendly and visually more appealing. Some questions are no longer mandatory and deadlines for completing the e-survey have been extended. Despite those improvements, however, the response rate remains low.

In 2015, although the e-survey was accessed 6,290 times globally, the rate of response remained at 5 per cent. More than 94 per cent of the 204 respondents gave a rating of “very good” or “good” for the overall quality of the conference services provided.

To complement the e-survey, the Division of Conference Management of the United Nations Office at Geneva identified six meetings at which participants were invited to provide additional views and comments. More than 94 per cent of 256 respondents gave a rating of “very good” or “good” for the overall quality of conference services in Geneva.

To supplement the global survey with real-time local surveys, the Division of Conference Services of the United Nations Office at Nairobi carried out three extra surveys during the year for meetings held in Paris, Bonn, Bangkok, Geneva and Montevideo. Overall, 94 per cent of the respondents rated the services provided as either “excellent” or “good”, 4 per cent were of the opinion that the services provided were fair, while only 2 per cent indicated that the services were poor.

It is noteworthy to mention that the Division of Conference Services at the United Nations Office at Nairobi was the recipient of a Baobab Award, a symbol of strength and persistence, in 2014, in efforts to successfully coordinate and service the first Environment Assembly of the United Nations Environment Programme.

The United Nations Office at Vienna conducted a survey on paper-smart services at the General Conference of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (30 November-4 December 2015) and the United Nations Commission on International Trade Law Working Group III (30 November-4 December 2015). The survey results revealed a positive outcome, given that 96 per cent of the responders rated the availability of documentation online as either “very good” or “good” and 86 per cent of the delegates reported that paper-smart had a positive impact on their work during the meetings. Moreover, 93 per cent of the delegates responded that the overall quality of paper-smart services provided was either “very good” or “good”.

The Department for General Assembly and Conference Management has made a significant reduction in the number of printed documents as a result of a decrease in requests from delegations to the Secretariat owing to the availability of various digital outlets, such as the Official Document System (ODS), PaperSmart Portal, United Nations websites and e-Subscription. During the past seven years, the

printing across the four duty stations has declined significantly, from an accumulated 726 million printed pages in 2008 to 472 million printed pages in 2011 to 223 million printed pages in 2015; a decrease of 69 per cent in the seven-year period.

In order to accommodate the requests by the delegates for ad hoc printing needs, in 2015, the Department for General Assembly and Conference Management re-established a Documents Assistance Centre and a Documents Counter in New York. Since their establishment, the centres have printed an average of 31 documents, or 350 pages, per month in New York.

On a global average of the survey results, 89 per cent of participants indicated that electronic availability of documents has “positively impacted” their work during the meetings, whereas 11 per cent indicated that there was “no impact” on their work. The survey findings also revealed that the participants had well received the paper-smart services provided, given that 90 per cent, on average, of the respondents rated the service either “very good” or “good”, whereas 10 per cent rated it as “average”. The availability of United Nations documentation online was rated in New York at 91 per cent as “very good” or “good” and “average” at 9 per cent; in Geneva, at 75 per cent as “very good” or “good”, and “average” at 25 per cent; in Vienna, at 96 per cent as “very good” or “good” and “average” at 4 per cent; and in Nairobi, at 79 per cent as “excellent” or “good”, with the remaining 21 per cent as “average”.

## VIII. Pan-African Masters Consortium in Interpretation and Translation project

In December 2015, an agreement was signed between the European Union and the United Nations Office at Nairobi to set up a trust fund to support the Pan-African Masters Consortium in Interpretation and Translation (PAMCIT) and the creation of a network of universities acting as centres of excellence in Africa for teach interpreting and translation. The duration of the project will be 42 months, covering three academic years (2015-2016, 2016-2017 and 2017-2018), with a budget of approximately 3.7 million euros. The project will build on the previous

experience of the “African project”, a joint effort of international stakeholders and African universities to implement the European Masters programme in Conference Interpretation on the African Continent.

PAMCIT is constituted by a core group of six African universities representing and serving the five main geographic and linguistic configurations of the African continent: the University of Nairobi (Kenya), the University of Buea (Cameroon), the Universidade Pedagógica de Moçambique in Maputo (Mozambique), the University of Ghana in Accra, the Faculty of Al Alsun of Ain Shams University in Cairo (Egypt) and the University Gaston Berger in Senegal.

The United Nations Office at Nairobi is responsible for setting up and supporting the PAMCIT Permanent Secretariat, which will coordinate the overall activities of the Consortium.

The PAMCIT project intends to channel financial support to: (a) the universities of the PAMCIT Consortium to allow them to offer high-level training matching international quality standards; (b) students, in order to help them to pursue their studies and thus find employment in Africa; and (c) the PAMCIT Permanent Secretariat, to ensure sustainable and effective funding and coordination of the project.

The main expected results are:

(a) PAMCIT universities have trainers who teach at high-level international standards, improve their capacity thanks to pedagogical assistance and have adequate equipment and facilities to teach interpreting and translation in compliance with international standards;

(b) PAMCIT students have more financial means to enrol in Masters courses and have access to mobility and scholarship programmes.

The ultimate aim is for PAMCIT to set up a virtuous circle with sufficient language professionals being trained at the adequate level to provide quality services, train future generations and crowd out substandard services. The poor quality of the translation and interpretation services currently available on the African market has been a cause for complaint among regional and international organizations and is hampering efficiency in international cooperation activities. The project will also offer valuable professional outlets to graduates with language skills for whom language teaching was the sole option up to now.

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
