Problem

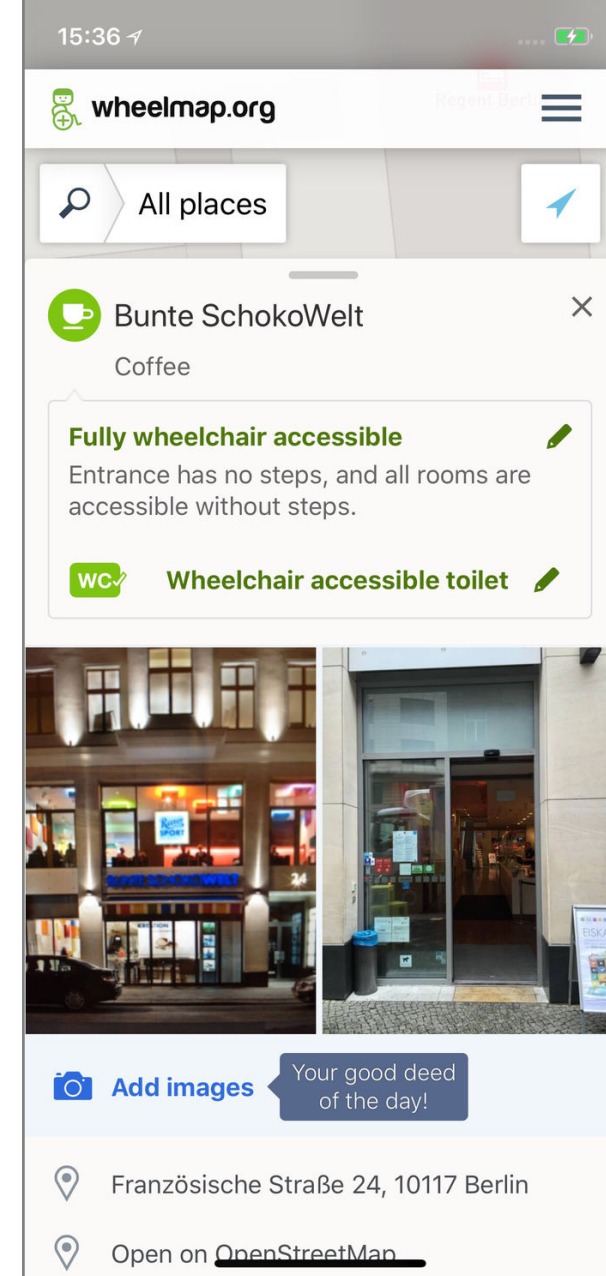
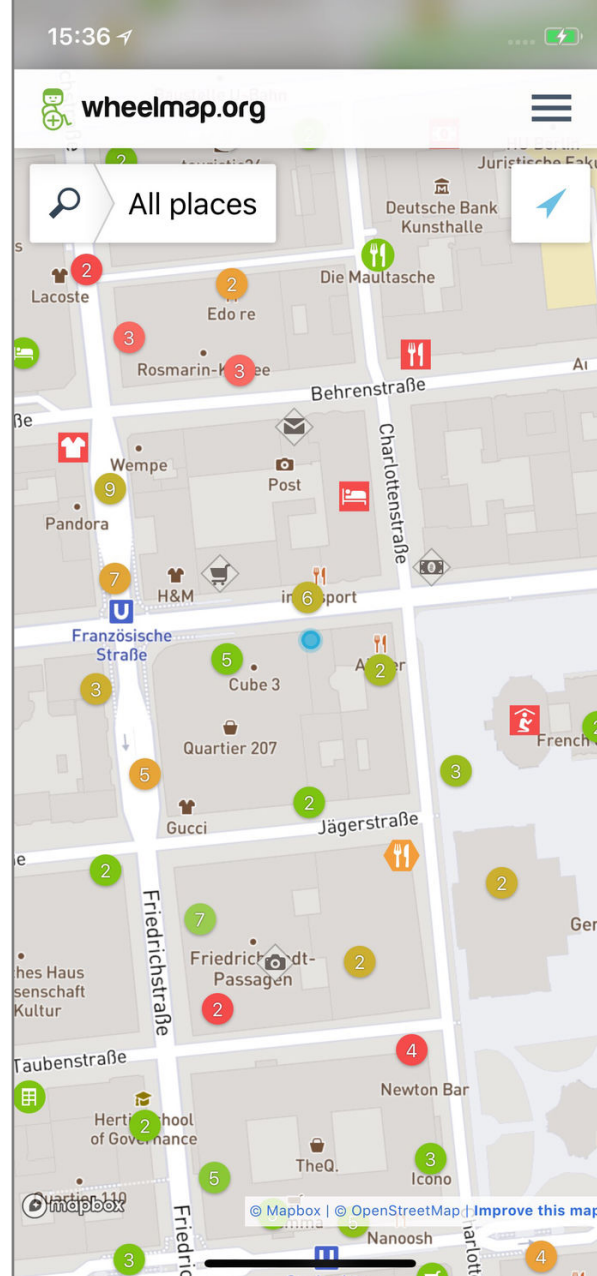
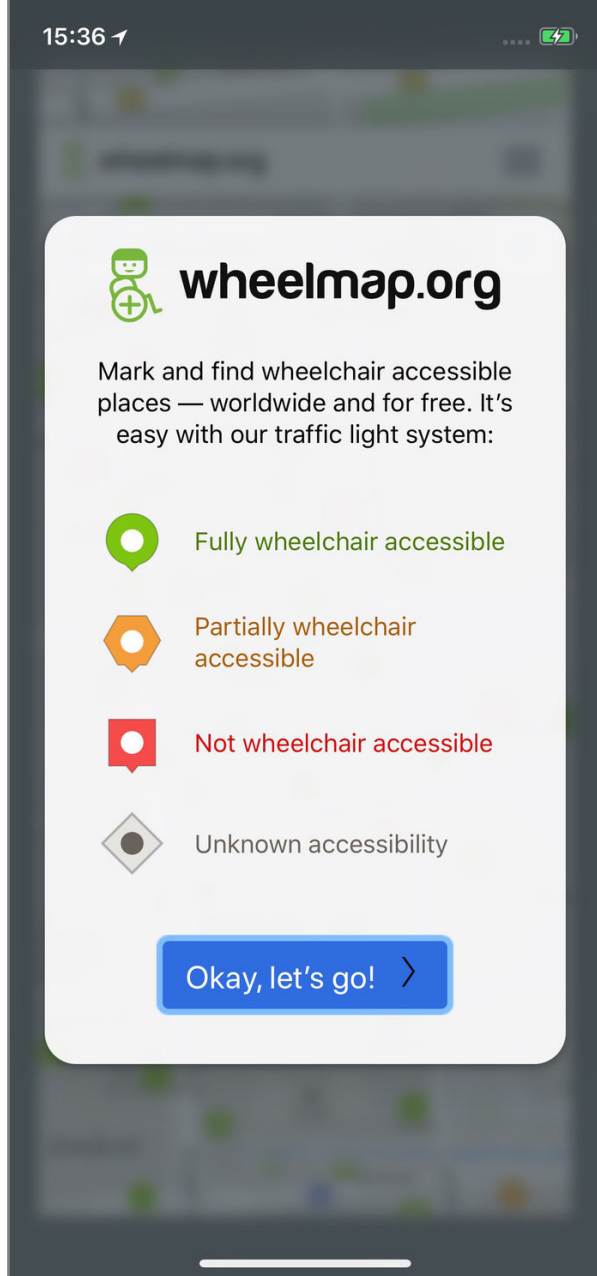
Right now this information is

it is not easy to find.

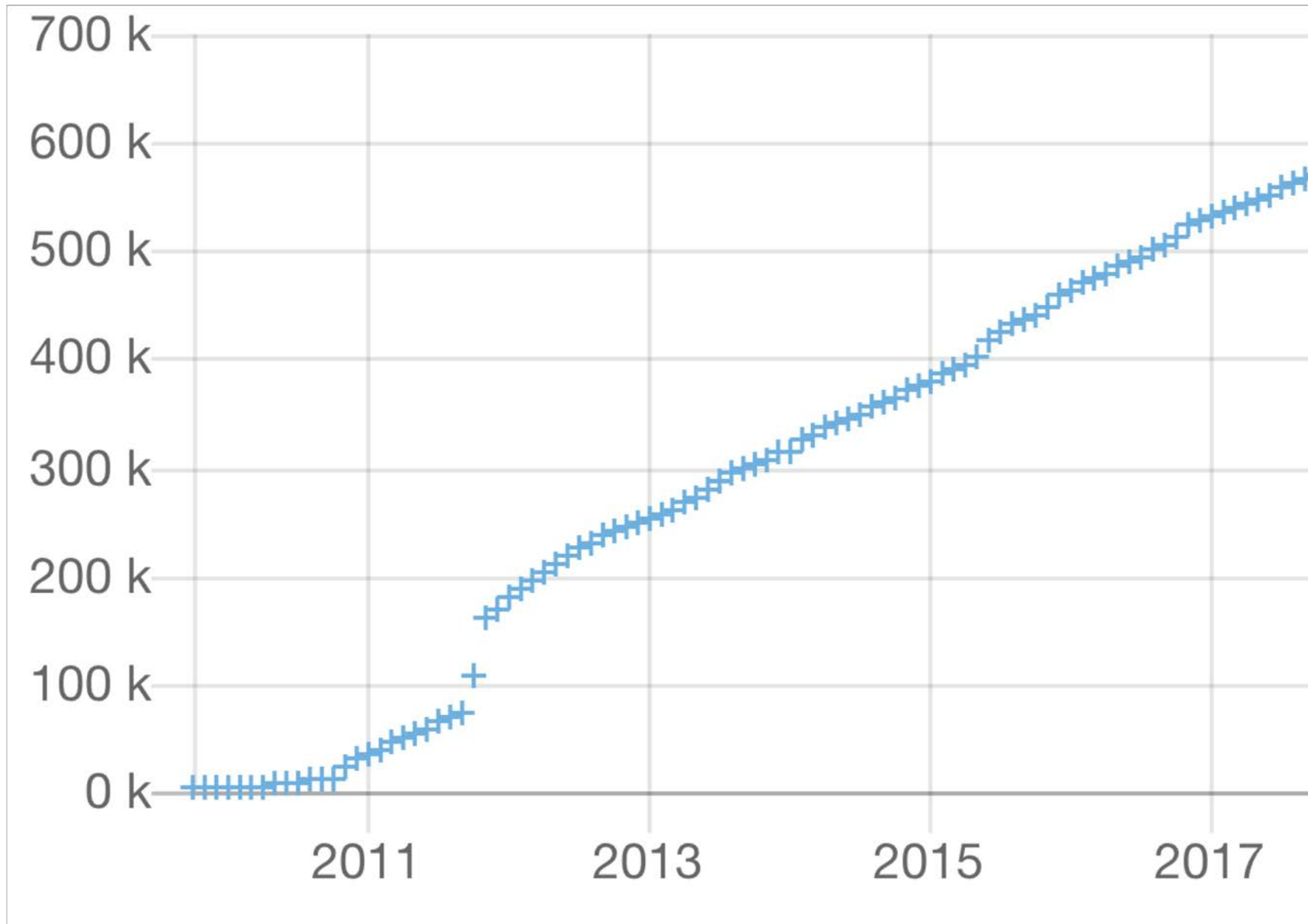


Solution

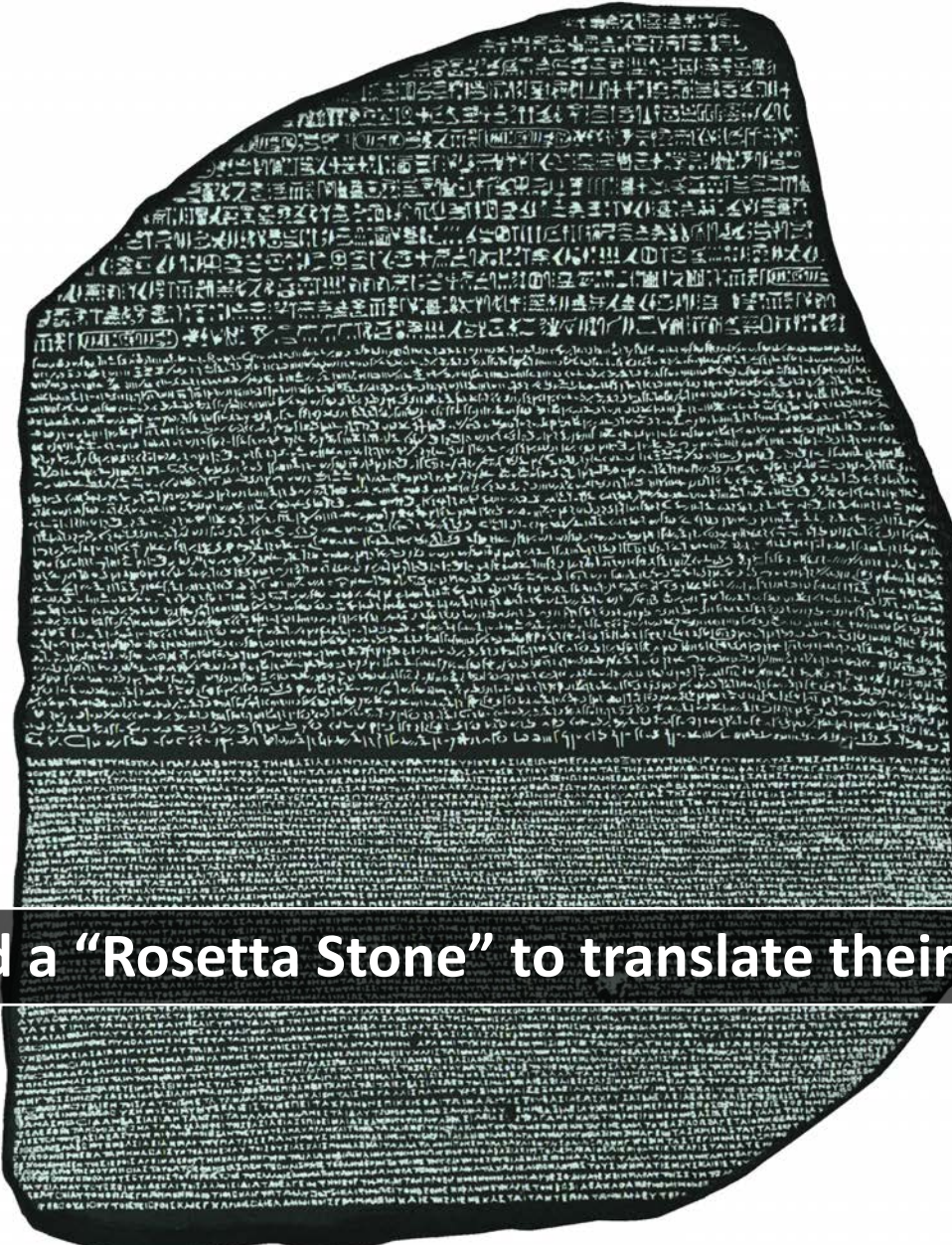

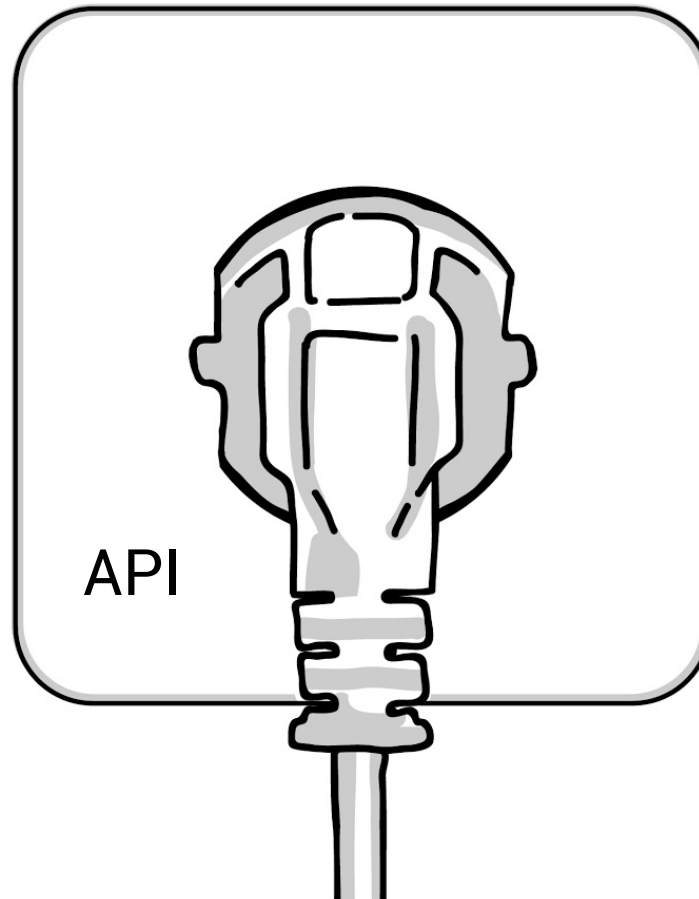
