

**Intervention by Mr. Kang Yoosik, Director of Int'l Security Division,
Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Korea on 6 December 2019**

Thank you, Mr. Chair.

On the 2015 GGE report, there is no recommendation of capacity building for law enforcement agencies.

I understand that cybercrime is not within the purview of the GGE in charge of responsible State behaviors.

However, law enforcement agencies play a key role in investigating and attributing malicious actors of cyber attacks as well as dealing with cyber crimes.

In my country, when massive-scale or serious cyber intrusion incidents occur, National Police Agency's cyber department or Prosecutor's Office's cyber department takes a lead in investigating the case, while national CERT supports law enforcement agencies by providing technical assistance.

Under the process of investigations, national CERT is prohibited to share any information without the approval of law enforcement agencies.

Therefore, it seems desirable to approach in more flexible way, at least, in the heading of capacity building. The recommendations to encourage capacity buildings for law enforcement agencies should be included at the new GGE report.
