WHAT TO EXPECT

- Called the [Interspecies Assembly](#), a video art installation is to be projected nightly at 8 pm on the north wall of the iconic UN Secretariat building in New York City.
- Created by SUPERFLEX, a Danish group known for integrating art, activism and science into their work and brought to UNGA in partnership with Art2030, the projection showcases Siphonophores - marine creatures that function not as a single, physically connected body, but a colony of organisms that work in harmony for the well-being of their society.
- Projected during the High-level Week of the UN General Assembly, the installation symbolizes interdependence and the importance of global solidarity to safeguard the well-being of all species and reflects the aspiration of a pivotal moment, as world leaders are faced with the urgent need for collaboration to overcome pressing global challenges.

OBJECTIVES

The Projection aims to raise awareness of the critical need to protect the diverse ecosystems and many forms of life across the planet that are fundamental to achieving the Sustainable Development Goals by 2030.
