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Indicators of the LDC criteria

LDCs are low-income countries suffering from the most severe structural impediments to **sustainable development**.

GNI per capita

Human Asset Index (HAI)

- Percentage of population undernourished
- Under five mortality rate
- Gross secondary enrolment ratio
- · Adult literacy rate

Economic Vulnerability Index (EVI)

- Population
- Remoteness
- Merchandise export concentration
- Share of agriculture, forestry and fisheries in GDP
- Share of population in low elevated costal zones
- Victims of natural disasters
- Instability of agriculture production
- Instability of exports of goods and services

Gross national income


- Gross national income (GNI) per capita, in \$
 - Measures resources available for consumption and investment
- World Bank Atlas method is used to convert national currencies into US \$
- CDP uses three-year averages to account for short-term fluctuations

HAI and **EVI** - basics

- ◆HAI and EVI are composite indices
 - Higher HAI scores are better
 - Lower EVI scores are better
 - Indicators are converted into indices using the 'Max-min procedure'.
 - Max and min values are based on distribution of all developing countries.

Human Asset Index


 Human asset index (HAI) is a measure of human capital available for development



- In 2018, maternal mortality ratio will be added as new indicator
 - Weights for all health related indicators will be 1/6
 - Weights for education indicators will remain 1/4

Economic Vulnerability Index

◆ Economic vulnerability index (EVI) is a measure of structural vulnerabilities to economic and environmental shocks



Numbers in brackets denote weights in overall EVI


Data issues

- Data for all indicators are from international organizations
 - United Nations, UNESCO, FAO, ...
 - > Ensures data is consistent and can be compared
 - LDCs need to be compared to each other and other developing countries
- International organizations rely on national data, but may make adjustments
- Missing national data estimated by international organizations


Thresholds

- GNI per capita 3-year average of World Bank low income threshold
 - For 2015 triennial review:
 - Inclusion: \$1,035 and below
 - Graduation: \$1,242 and above
 - 'Income only' graduation: \$2,484 and above
- Human Asset Index
 - Thresholds for HAI and EVI were fixed by the CDP in 2014 at their 2012 levels
 - Inclusion: 60 and below
 - Graduation: 66 and above
- Economic vulnerability index
 - Inclusion: 36 and above
 - Graduation: 32 and below


GNI 2015 (LDCs excl. Eq. Guinea)

Graduation eligibility

- In order to be eligible for graduation
 - Country passes thresholds of any 2 criteria
 - GNI and HAI

Bhutan, Kiribati, Sao Tome and Principe, Solomon Islands, Tuvalu, Vanuatu

OR

> GNI and EVI

OR

HAI and EVI
Nepal

OR

Income > double income graduation threshold Angola, Equatorial Guinea, Timor-Leste, Tuvalu, Vanuatu
