- ⇒ Caps in contribution to UN budget, discounts in contributions to PKO
 ⇒ Travel funds

Capacity-building for graduation strategies for LDCs in Asia and Africa

Main objectives:

1. Building capacity in graduating countries in preparing strategies for a smooth transition

Improve LDCs' capacity to access information on existing support measures and to make use of such measures.

Objective 1. Capacity building for smooth transition strategies for graduating countries Main activities/outputs:

- **Case studies:** analysis of the role of support measures in development progress and how to prepare for a smooth transition.
- Macro-economic model framework: assessment the benefits and the likely impact of their phasing out upon graduation
- **Toolkit:** analytical review of eventual change in the support received due to graduation; policy options for the implementation of smooth transition strategies.

Objective 2 Enhancing access to ISMs: information gathering and sharing

Main activity: Surveys




