Decision 2000/1 Special themes for the Commission on Population and Development in the years 2001-2003*

The Commission on Population and Development:

- (a) Reaffirms Commission on Population and Development decision 1999/1² in which the Commission decided that "Population, environment and development" should be the special theme for the Commission at its thirty-fourth session in 2001;
- (b) Decides that the special theme for the Commission at its thirty-fifth session in 2002 shall be "Reproductive rights and reproductive health, with special reference to human immunodeficiency virus/acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (HIV/AIDS)";
- (c) Also decides that the special theme for the Commission at its thirty-sixth session in 2003 shall be "Population, education and development";
- (d) Requests the Population Division of the United Nations Secretariat to give due attention to the impact of human immunodeficiency virus/acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (HIV/AIDS) in the preparation of reports for the forthcoming theme sessions of the Commission on Population and Development for the years 2001-2003.
