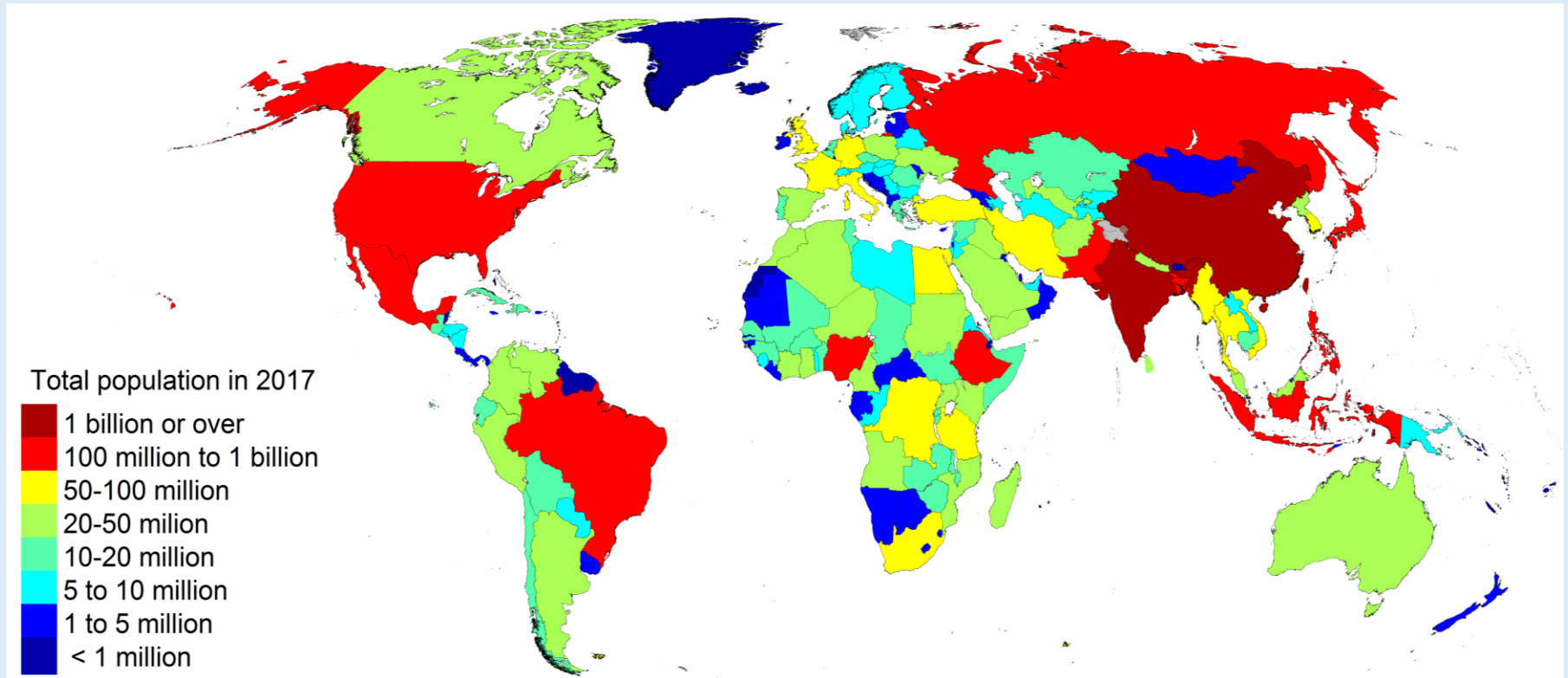

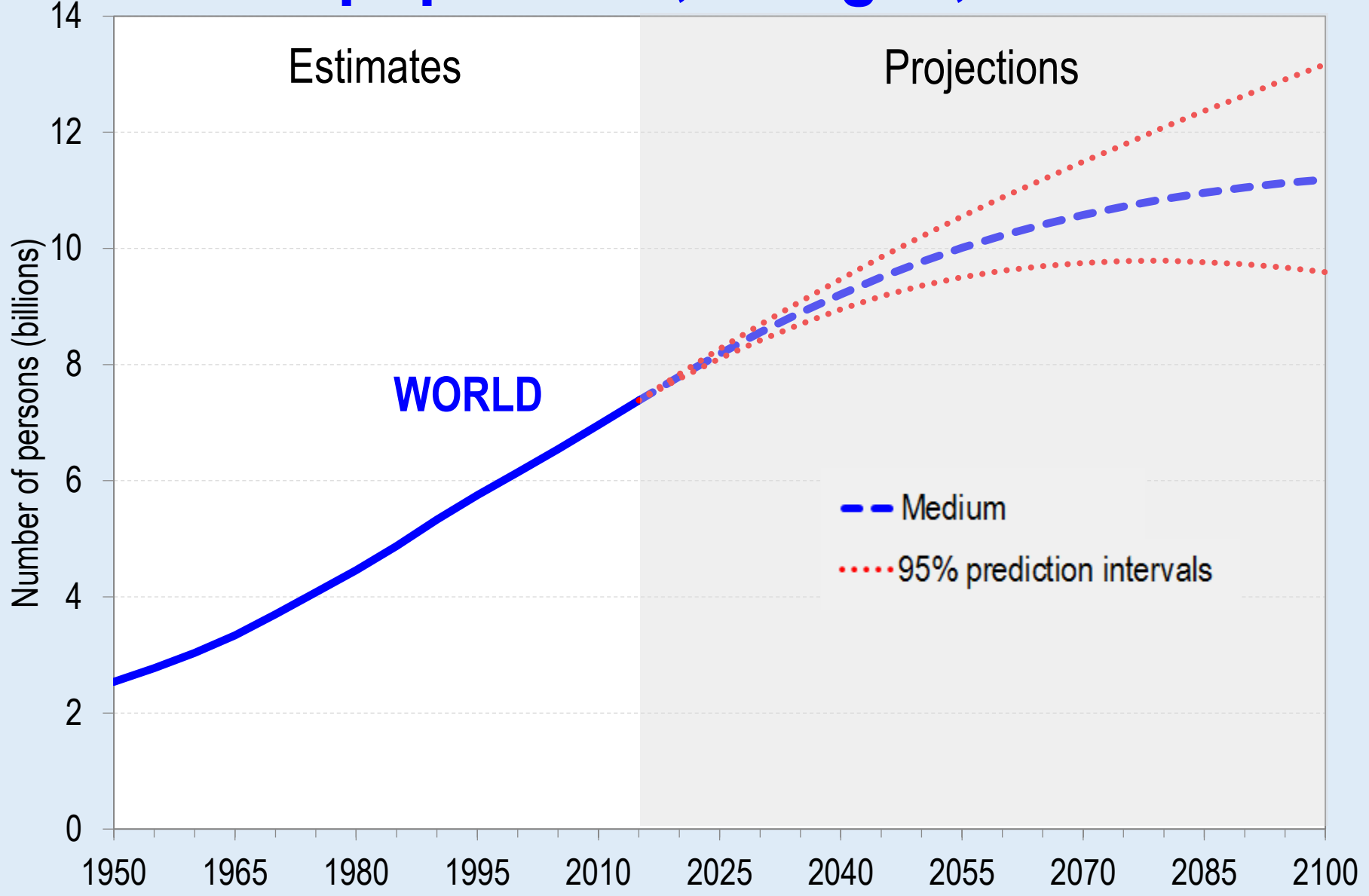
Countries and areas of the world



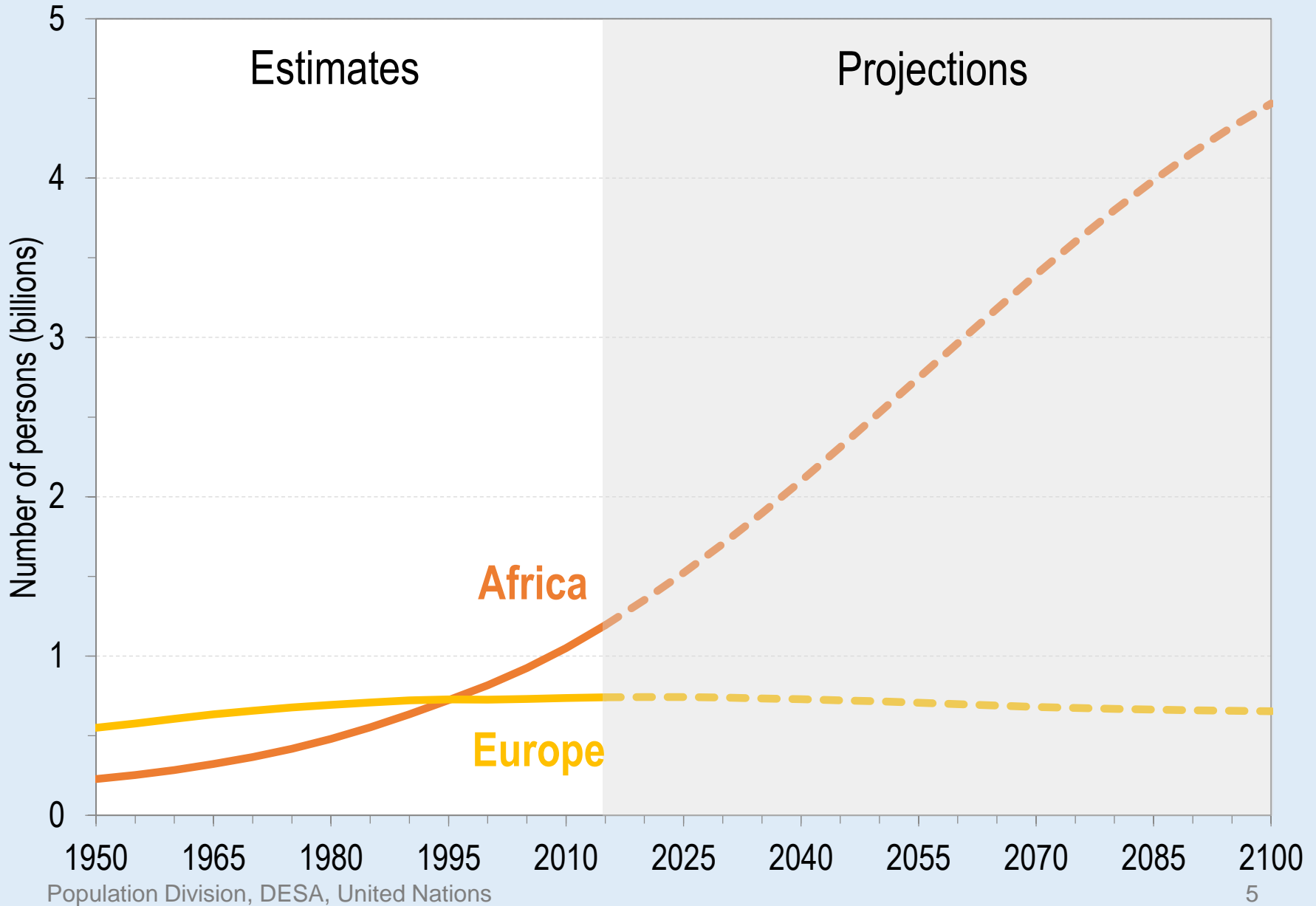

Final boundary between the Republic of Sudan and the Republic of South Sudan has not yet been determined.

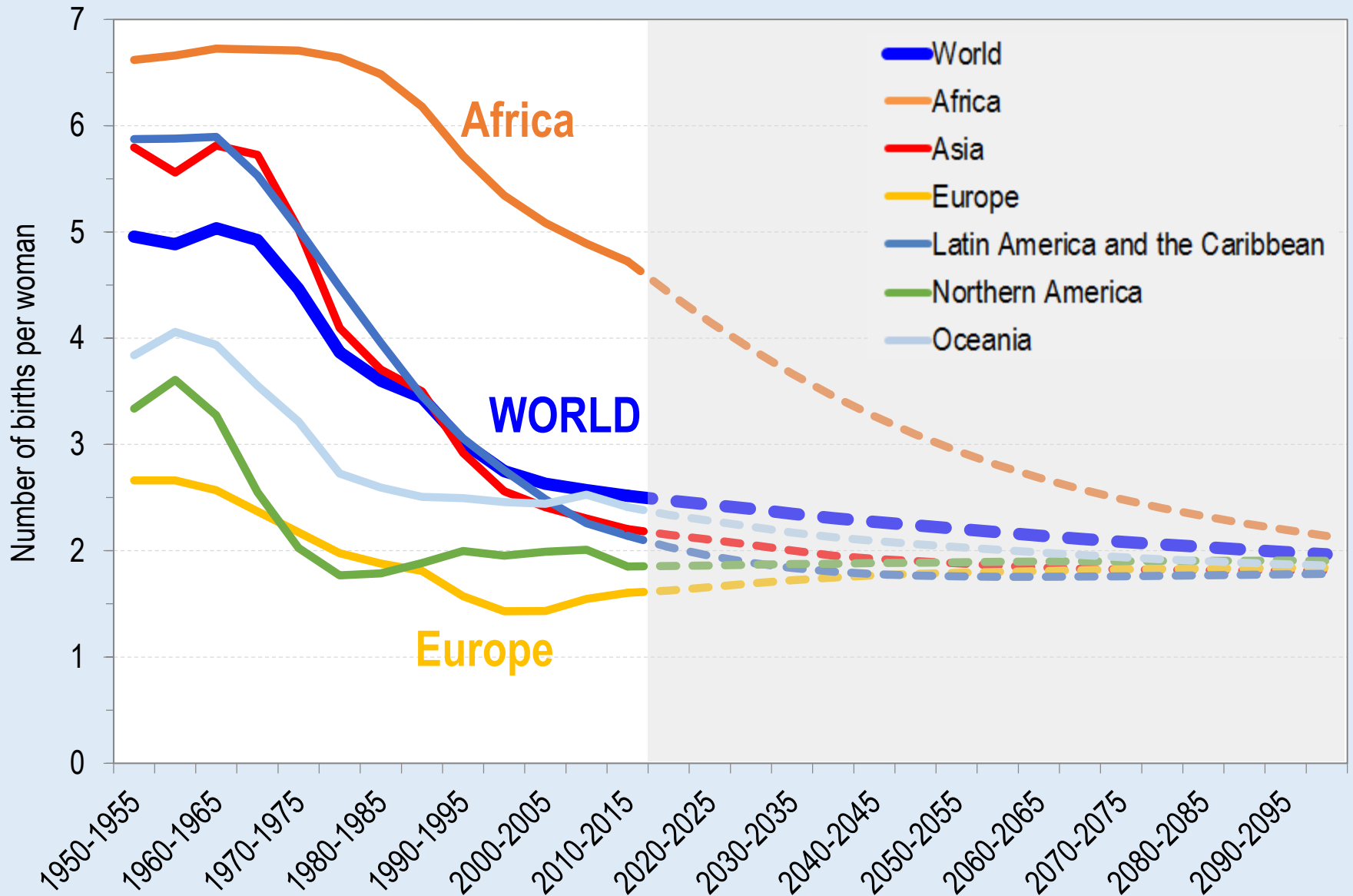
Global population, all ages, 1950-2100



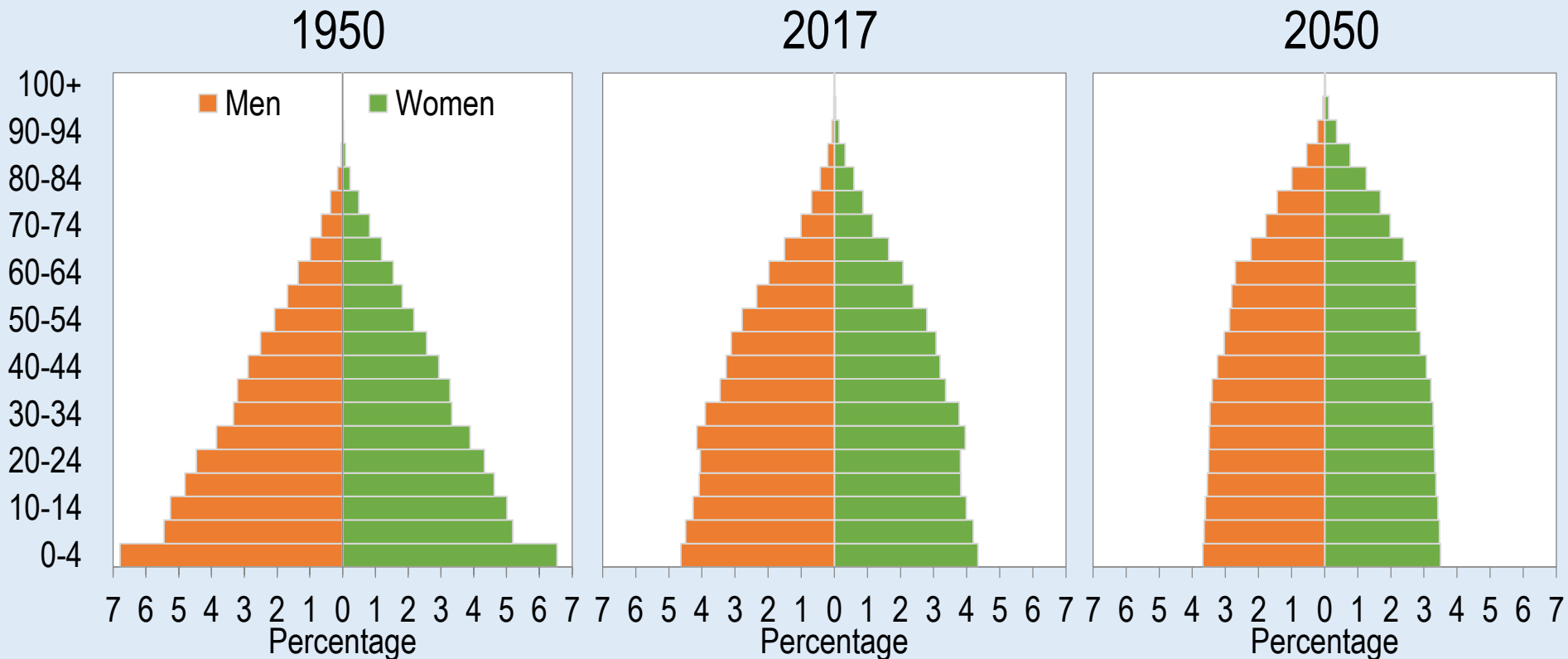
Population, all ages, 1950-2100



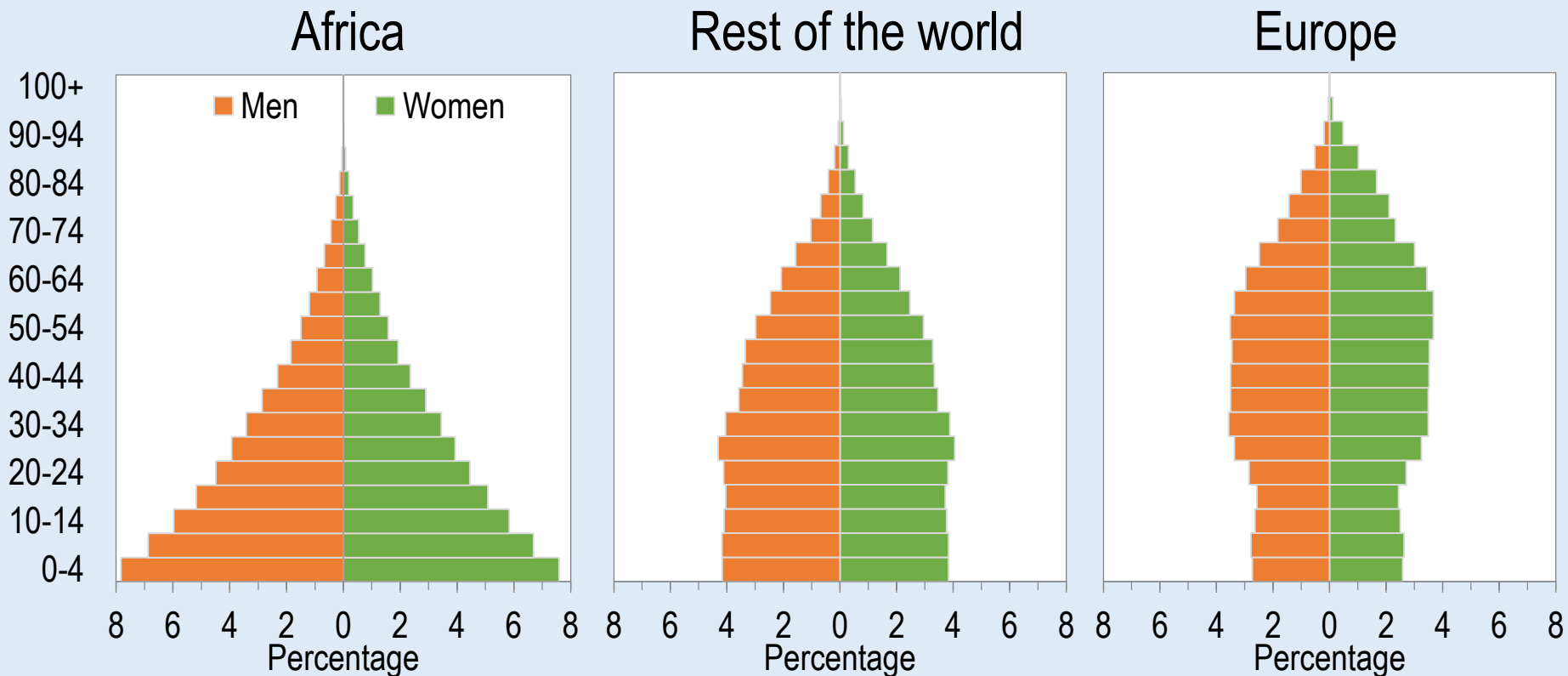
Fertility (births per woman), 1950-2100



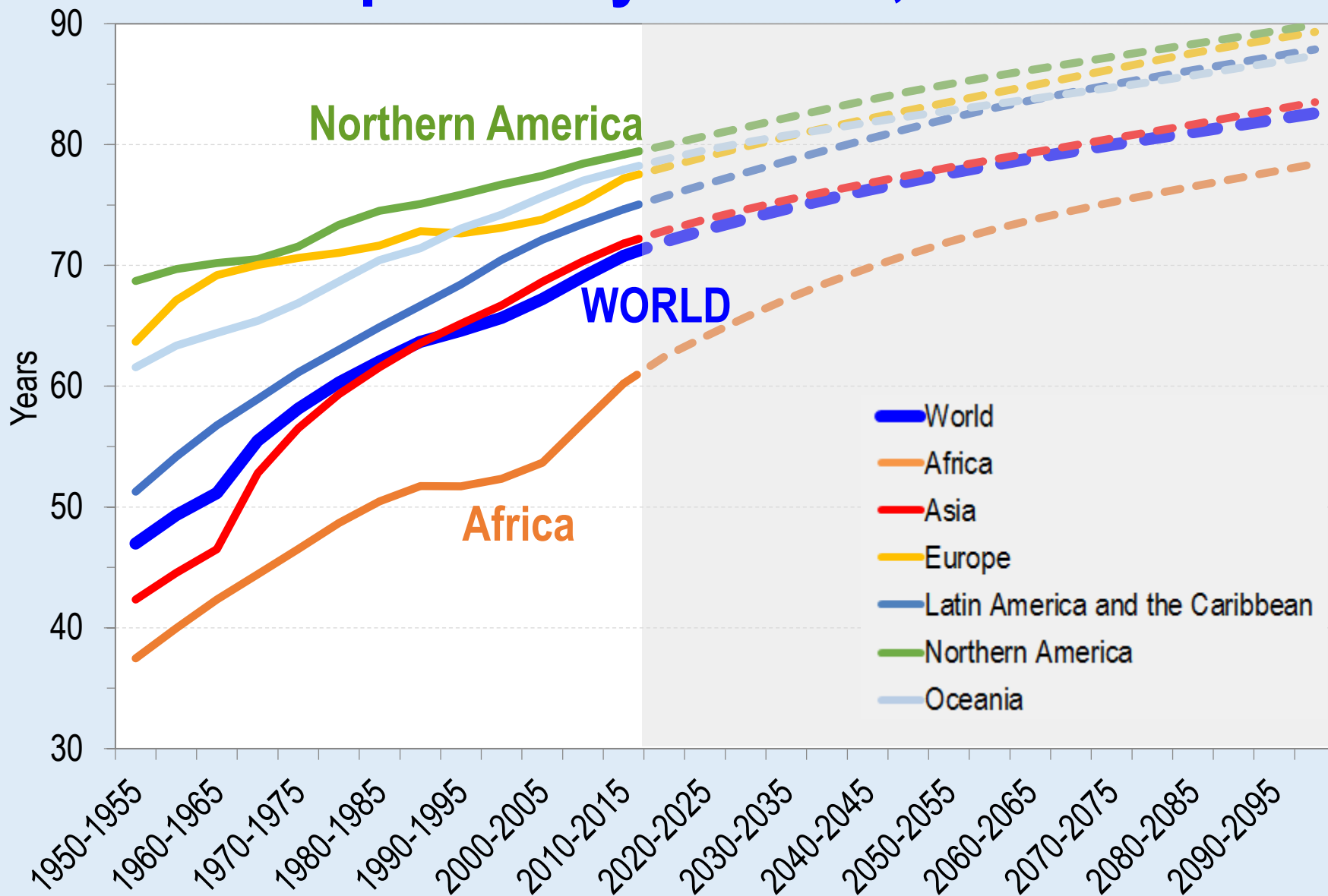
Population by age and sex, world



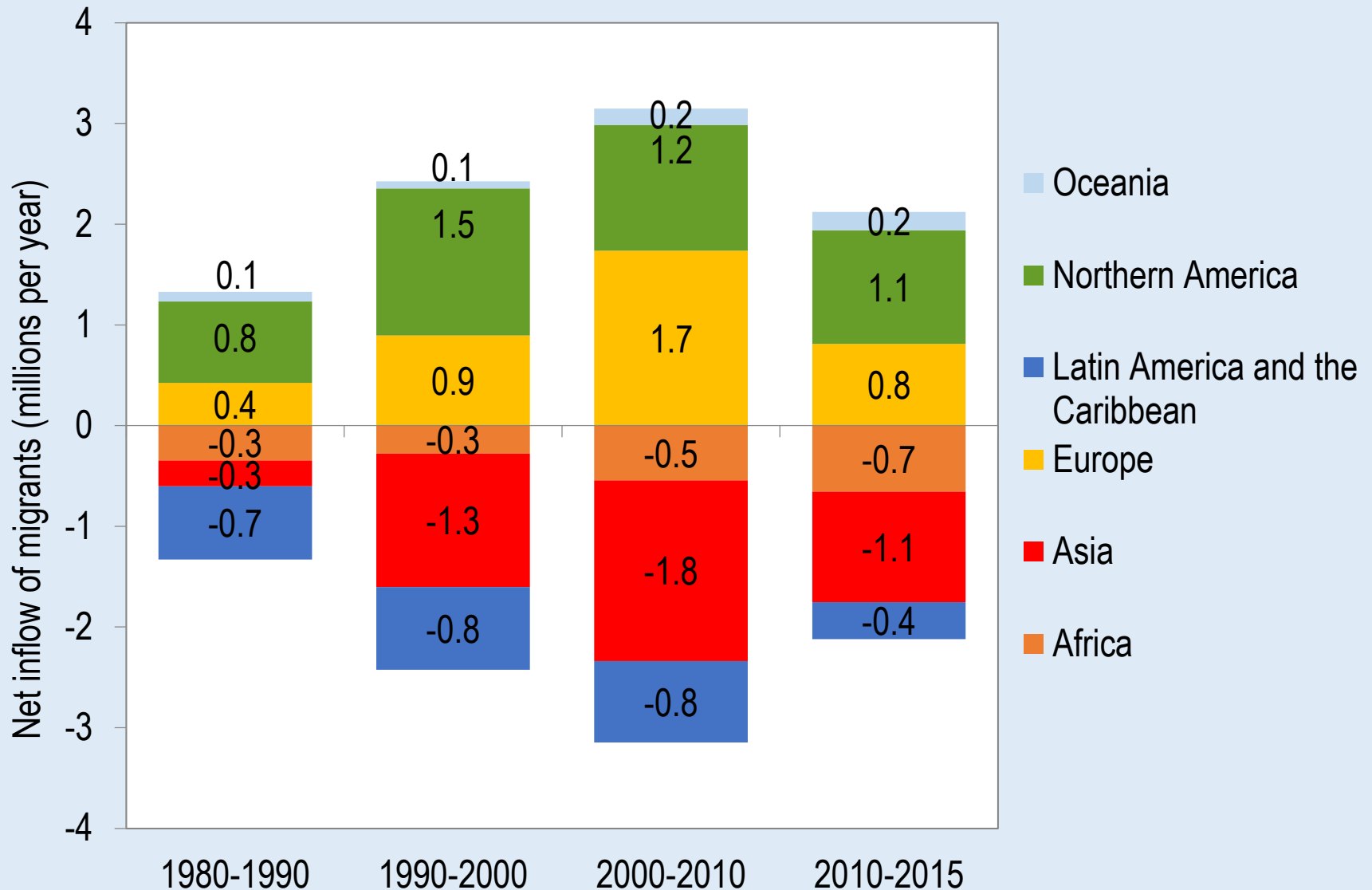
Population by age and sex, 2017
