3. Journal of International Migration and Integration

- Multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary bilingual (English & French) scholarly journal, published quarterly. Permits high level exchanges between researchers and policy-makers
- Some topics covered: ★ Comparative analysis of integration policies in Germany, France, Canada, United Kingdom, Italy and The Netherlands; ★ NGO Government Partnerships; ★ Les réfugiés sur le marché du travail suisse; ★ A Typology of Immigrant Policies in Western Europe; ★ Civil Enculturation: Nation-State, School, and Ethnic Difference in Four European Countries; ★ Minority Leadership, Science, Symbols, and the Media: The Belgian Islam Debate and its Relevance for Other Countries in Europe; ★ The Starting Line and the Promotion of EU Anti-Discrimination Legislation: The Role of Policy Oriented Research; ★ Toward a New Modus Vivendi Between Academic Research and Practical Social Policy; ★ Ethnicity and Social Mobility: The Case of Turks in Germany, etc.

4. An International Comparative Research Project (PME/Metropolis)

- The Foundation Population, Migration and Environment (Zurich, Switzerland) in co-operation with the International Metropolis Project is funding pilot studies on Comparative Views on Integration Policies and Migration Flows
- Status: 7 proposals are currently being evaluated. Kind of topics covered: Labour Migration, Trafficking, Flows, Second Generation, Youth, Databanks, Civic and Political Participation, Integration in Cities, etc.
