The project

The **Interrelations between Public Policies, Migration and Development** (IPPMD) report is the result of a project carried-out by the European Commission and the OECD Development Centre in 10 partner countries: Armenia, Burkina Faso, Cambodia, Costa Rica, Côte d'Ivoire, the Dominican Republic, Georgia, Haiti, Morocco and the Philippines. The project aimed to provide policy makers with empirical evidence on the way migration influences specific policy sectors – labour market, agriculture, education, investment and financial services, and social protection and health – and, in turn, how sectoral policies affect migration.

The event

This event, organised on the sidelines of the 15th Coordination Meeting on International Migration, aims to discuss the results of the empirical work presented in the IPPMD report. The panellists will discuss the impact of specific programmes, such as job employment agencies, vocational training, conditional cash transfers and agricultural subsidies, on different migration outcomes, including the decision to migrate, the use of remittances, the sustainability of return and the integration of immigrants. They will also discuss the policy implications of the IPPMD findings.
