


Number of international migrants




Number of international migrants (millions)



Increase in the number of international migrants (millions)








Number of refugees (millions)



Remittance flows to low and middle-income countries declined from 2008 to 2009




The impact of the economic crisis

Rise in unemployment among migrants

 Migrant Smuggling Protocol 2000


Multilateral assistance for international migration and development has been growing
