Reliable information on migrants and migration is essential to develop evidence-based policies, to inform public opinion, and to combat widely held misconceptions. How many migrants are there? What are their main characteristics? How do migrants contribute to host and origin societies? How does the role of immigrants evolve over time? These and other basic questions must be answered to plan future migration, to leverage the opportunities of migration, and to address its challenges.

On 3 and 4 October 2013, the United Nations General Assembly will convene the second High-level Dialogue on International Migration and Development. On numerous occasions, Member States have called for improving the evidence-base on international migration and its linkages to development.

The Population Division of the United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs (DESA), the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) and UNICEF are working together to close this knowledge gap.
