Proposed amendments by the Permanent Observer Mission of the State of Palestine

Zero draft of the Outcome Document for the 19 September 2016 High-Level Meeting to address large movements of refugees and migrants

- 1. **Introduction, Para 1.17:** Large movements of refugees and migrants have political, economic, **social**, developmental and humanitarian ramifications which cross all borders.
- 2. Section 3, Para vii: ... They envisaged providing host countries and communities with increased financial and other support and helping to strengthen their resilience. They envisaged providing more predictable, sustained funding to relevant United Nations agencies and other humanitarian organizations and implementing partners. They also envisaged collective efforts...
- 3. Section 3, Para ix:... We recognize the importance of responding early to human rights violations, in order to lessen the likelihood of conflict, and stress in this regard the importance of horizon-scanning and early warning systems and effective follow-up efforts; and we welcome in this respect the "Human Rights Up Front" initiative...
- 4. **Section 4, Para v:...** Fulfilling the Agenda will remove or reduce the need for vulnerable migrants persons to leave their homes and migrate in the first place...
- 5. **Section 5, Para v:...** We will also work to improve the availability of accurate data on the whereabouts of **refugees and** migrants and vessels stranded at sea...
- 6. **Section 5, Para xi:...** We will ensure, on the basis of bilateral, regional and international cooperation, that adequate, sustainable and predictable financing is made available to enable host countries **and relevant**, **partnering humanitarian and development agencies and organizations** to respond to the immediate humanitarian and developmental needs of the large numbers of refugees and migrants arrive in their territories.
- 7. **Section 6, Para x:** We recognize that refugee camps should be the exception and, to the extent possible, a temporary measure in response to an emergency. Further, we will actively promote durable solutions, particularly in protracted refugee situations, with a focus on sustainable and timely return where appropriate as possible.

Draft Global Compact on Responsibility Sharing for Refugees

- 1. **Normative framework, Para 4:** We reaffirm respect for all applicable instruments, laws and practices at regional and national **levels** which provide protection to refugees.
- 2. Responsibility-sharing, Para 9:... We commit also to taking rapid action to prevent situations from becoming protracted, including by working towards solutions from the outset of a refugee situation, and to also shoulder our responsibilities to resolve protracted refugees situations in conformity with international law.

- 3. **Responsibility-sharing, Para 10:** Delete. Propose to combine with para 9.
- 4. **Solutions, Sub-title:** Delete the word "Voluntary". It should read: **Repatriation**.
- 5. Solutions, New paragraph proposal (before Para 18):

Fostering the necessary conditions to facilitate the return of refugees in safety and dignity to their homes/places of origin must remain a priority goal. In this regard, we stress the need to resolve conflicts and achieve comprehensive and just political solutions and to provide assistance to also support reintegration efforts.

- 6. **Solutions, Repatriation, Para 19, Point 2:** Support efforts to foster reconciliation and dialogue, particularly with refugee communities, and with the participation of women, and to ensure respect for the rule of law at the **international and** national level;
- 7. **Solutions, Para 19, Point 4:** Where conditions allow, plan for and support measures to encourage facilitate voluntary repatriation, reintegration and reconciliation;
