## New York Declaration for Refugees and Migrants

## Programme budget implications of draft resolution A/71/L.1

## Note by the Secretariat

1. The present note is issued in accordance with rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly.

2. Paragraphs 9 and 10 of annex II to draft resolution A/71/L.1 provide that:

(a) The global compact would be elaborated through a process of intergovernmental negotiations, for which preparations will begin immediately. The negotiations, which will begin in early 2017, are to culminate in an intergovernmental conference on international migration in 2018 at which the global compact will be presented for adoption;

(b) As the Third High-level Dialogue on International Migration and Development is to be held in New York no later than 2019, a role should be envisaged for the High-level Dialogue in the process.

3. Pursuant to those paragraphs, it is understood that all issues relating to the intergovernmental negotiations, the conference and the Third High-level Dialogue on International Migration and Development, including the dates, format, organization and scope, are yet to be determined. Accordingly, in the absence of modalities for the meetings, it is not currently possible to estimate the potential cost implications of the requirements for meetings and documentation. Upon a decision on the modalities, format and organization of the meetings, the Secretary-General will submit the relevant costs in accordance with rule 153 of the rules of procedure

of the General Assembly. Furthermore, the dates of the meetings will have to be determined in consultation with the Department for General Assembly and Conference Management.
