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PREFACE

The Population Division of the Department of Economic and Social Affairs (DESA) of the United Nations Secretariat is responsible for providing the international community with up-to-date and objective information on population and development. The Population Division provides guidance to the United Nations General Assembly, the Economic and Social Council and the Commission on Population and Development on population and development issues. The Division also undertakes regular studies on population levels, trends and dynamics, including trends of international migration, changes in population policies and the interrelationships between population and development.

In the area of international migration, the Population Division estimates the global number of international migrants at regular intervals, monitors levels, trends and policies of international migration, and collects and analyses information on the relationship between international migration and development. The Migration Section also convenes the interagency coordination meeting on international migration and organizes expert group meetings. As part of its monitoring activities, the Migration Section within the Population Division maintains the United Nations Global Migration Database, which contains the most complete set of statistics on international migrants enumerated in the countries or areas of the world and classified by country of birth or citizenship, sex and age. On behalf of DESA, the Migration Section participates in the interagency Global Migration Group (GMG). The Section also services the intergovernmental process on international migration and development at the General Assembly and acts within the Secretariat as the focal point for the State-led Global Forum on Migration and Development (GFMD).

This report presents information on international migration levels, trends and legal instruments for major areas, regions and countries of the world. The data for the international migrant stock are taken from the publication *Trends in International Migrant Stock: The 2008 Revision*. The estimates on the total population, net migration and the projected population up to 2050 are based on *World Population Prospects: The 2008 Revision*. For the first time, data on international migration flows for a selected group of countries are included in the analysis. The data come from the dataset *International Migration Flows to and from Selected Countries: The 2008 Revision*. The analysis of the ratification status of migration-related legal instruments for Member States of the United Nations and the International Labour Organization (ILO) is based on information from the United Nations Treaty Section which can be accessed at treaties.un.org. For more information on the data and methodology used for calculating the various indicators used in this report, please see the above-mentioned publications.

Responsibility for this report rests with the Population Division. Preparation of this publication was facilitated by the ongoing work of the regional commissions, the specialized agencies and other relevant bodies of the United Nations, in particular the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), the World Bank and the International Monetary Fund (IMF). The Population Division is also grateful to the Statistics Division of the Department of Economic and Social Affairs for its continuing cooperation.

A full stop (.) is used to indicate decimals.

Use of a hyphen (-) between years, for example, 1995-2000, signifies the full period involved, from 1 July of the first year to 1 July of the second year.

Due to rounding, the numbers and percentages displayed in tables may not add up to the corresponding totals.

The terms "more developed" and "less developed" regions are used for statistical convenience and do not necessarily express a judgment as to the developmental stage of a particular country or area. Where appropriate, the term "country" may refer to a territory or area.

More developed regions are comprised of all countries of Europe, Northern America, Australia/New Zealand and Japan. The term "developed countries" refers to countries in the more developed regions.

Less developed regions are comprised of all countries of Africa, Asia (excluding Japan) and Latin America and the Caribbean, as well as Melanesia, Micronesia and Polynesia. The term "developing countries" is used to designate countries in the less developed regions.

The group of least developed countries, as defined by the Committee for Development Policy (CDP), a subsidiary body of the United Nations Economic and Social Council, currently comprises 48 countries: Afghanistan, Angola, Bangladesh, Benin, Bhutan, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cambodia, Central African Republic, Chad, Comoros, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Djibouti, Equatorial Guinea, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Gambia, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Haiti, Kiribati, Lao People's Democratic Republic, Lesotho, Liberia, Madagascar, Malawi, Mali, Mauritania, Mozambique, Myanmar, Nepal, Niger, Rwanda, Samoa, Sao Tome and Principe, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Solomon Islands, Somalia, Sudan, Timor-Leste, Togo, Tuvalu, Uganda, United Republic of Tanzania, Vanuatu, Yemen, Zambia.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The *International Migration Report 2009: A Global Assessment*, prepared by the Population Division of the Department of Economic and Social Affairs of the United Nations Secretariat, is the third in a series which presents information on international migration levels and trends and the status of ratification of international legal instruments relevant to international migration as well as related indicators for major areas, regions and countries of the world.

International migration has moved to the forefront of the national and international agenda. The United Nations system is addressing the various dimensions of this topic. The United Nations Secretariat has focused on the collection, analysis and dissemination of information on the levels and trends of international migration. Other parts of the United Nations system have been concerned with issues such as migrant rights, human trafficking and the social and economic integration of migrants. In addition, specialized agencies have focused on topics related to their expertise and mandates, such as labour migration, refugee protection and remittance flows.

Since 2006, several initiatives have been launched at the global level to enhance the benefits and to address the challenges posed by international migration. In 2006, the General Assembly convened the High-level Dialogue on International Migration and Development, the first high-level event in the United Nations exclusively devoted to international migration. Participants recognized that international migration, development and human rights were intrinsically interconnected. They also affirmed that, provided that international migration was supported by appropriate policies, it could be a positive force for development in both countries of origin and destination. Following a proposal by the Secretary-General at that meeting, the Global Forum on Migration and Development (GFMD) was subsequently created. By 2010, Belgium, the Philippines, Greece and Mexico had hosted the Global Forum on Migration and Development. This informal, non-binding, voluntary and State-led process fosters practical cooperation between Governments in order to maximize the developmental benefits of international migration and to reduce its negative impacts. It does not produce normative decisions or negotiated outcomes. The Special Representative of the Secretary-General on International Migration and Development, appointed in early 2006, is the main link between the United Nations and the Global Forum process.

In response to the 2005 report of the Global Commission on International Migration (GCIM), the Secretary-General established the Global Migration Group (GMG) in early 2006. This inter-agency group brings together heads of agencies to promote the wider application of all relevant international and regional instruments and norms in relation to migration. The group promotes the adoption of more coherent, comprehensive and better coordinated approaches to international migration. As of 2011, the Group consisted of 16 members which has organized joint meetings, produced joint publications and provided support to the Global Forum.

Since 1994, international migration and development is addressed in the General Assembly's Second Committee every two years. Human rights of migrants are a recurrent item on the agenda of the Assembly's Third Committee. In its resolution 61/208 of 20 December 2006, reproduced in the back of this publication, the General Assembly took note of the summary of the High-level Dialogue on International Migration and Development by the President of the General Assembly, welcomed the heightened awareness achieved by the High-level Dialogue on the topic and decided to consider, at its sixty-third session, possible options for appropriate follow-up. It also took note with interest of the establishment of the Global Migration Group in 2006. Two years later, the General Assembly decided in its resolution 63/225 of 19 December 2008 to hold another High-level Dialogue during its sixty-eighth session in 2013 and decided that the focus and modalities of this High-level Dialogue would be decided during its sixty-seventh session.

In 2006, during its thirty-ninth session, the Commission on Population and Development also addressed international migration and development. Among many other points raised, the Commission acknowledged the important contribution made by migrants and migration to development in countries of origin and destination. It also recognized the need for Member States to consider the multidimensional aspects of international migration and development in order to identify appropriate ways and means of maximizing the development benefits and minimizing the negative impacts. The Commission also requested the Secretary-General to continue his substantive work on international migration and development.

This report is a direct response to Member States' request to provide information and analysis on international migration levels and trends for countries, regions and for the world as a whole. The many questions arising from growing concerns about international migration, however, have few clear answers largely because of the lack of accurate and up-to-date information on international migration. The Division is also working with its counter parts at the international level and countries to raise awareness in this regard and encourages the collection, tabulation and dissemination of international migration data that is accessible, comparable, timely and reliable.

The number of indicators in this report is larger in comparison with the previous issue (United Nations, ESA/P/WP.209), and includes data by sex when possible. For many countries, there is sufficient information to provide a reasonable basis for the estimation of migrants stocks. For some countries, however, information is limited or unavailable, and in such cases, imputations were made. Furthermore, data on citizenship, if available, are used for estimating the numbers of international migrants in the absence of data on place of birth.

In addition to estimates on the migrant stock, numbers of refugees and workers' remittances, population data by sex, are listed. In the Annex, a separate table shows whether a country is party to international instruments such as the 1951 Convention and the 1967 Protocol, both relating to the status of refugees, the Convention concerning Migration for Employment (Revised 1949) (No. 97), the Convention concerning Migrations in Abusive Conditions and the Promotion of Equality of Opportunity and Treatment of Migrant Workers (Supplementary Provisions) (No. 143) and the 1990 International Convention on the Protection of the Rights of All Migrants and Members of Their Families. The table also lists the ratification status of the 2000 Protocol to Prevent, Suppress and Punish Trafficking in Persons, Especially Women and Children and the 200 Protocol against the Smuggling of Migrants by Land, Sea and Air.

Key findings:

- 1. By 2010, the estimated number of international migrants was 214 million, an increase of 58 million since 1990. International migrants represented 3.1 per cent of the total world population in 2010 (table 1).
- 2. In 2010, more developed regions hosted 60 per cent of the total migrant stock. The growth in the international migrant stock in more developed regions has been slowing recently and the growth rate of the migrant stock for less developed regions surpassed the growth rate for more developed regions for the first time in 2005-2010.

- 3. In 2010, the largest number of international migrants lived in Europe (70 million), followed by Asia (61 million) and Northern America (50 million). There were 19 million international migrants living in Africa, seven in Latin America and the Caribbean and six in Oceania. Oceania had the highest percentage of international migrants relative to the total population (16.8 per cent), followed by Northern America (14.2 per cent) and Europe (9.5 per cent). In Africa, Asia and Latin America and the Caribbean, international migrants accounted for less than 2 per cent of the total population.
- 4. A relatively small number of countries hosted most of the world's international migrants in 2010. Ten countries with the largest number of international migrants accounted for 52 per cent of the global migrant stock. Twenty per cent of all international migrants were residing in the United States alone (42.8 million) (table 2).

- 5. In 2010, the number of refugees was estimated at 16.3 million representing 8 per cent of the total migrant stock in the world. Eighty-six per cent of all refugees in the world, or 14 million, were residing in less developed regions. Asia hosted by far the largest number of refugees (10.9 million), followed by Africa (2.6 million), Europe (1.6 million), Northern America (0.7 million), Latin America and the Caribbean (0.5 million) and Oceania (0.1 million).
- 6. The increase in the global refugee population was concentrated in less developed regions between 2000 and 2010. Asia experienced a 23 per cent increase, whereas Europe's refugee population declined by 36 per cent and Africa's by 28 per cent. The large increase in refugees in Latin America and the Caribbean was due to the recent inclusion of persons in refugee-like situations in several countries in the regions, which the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) had previously not reported as refugees.
- 7. Female migrants represented almost half of the total international migrant stock in 2010. This situation has changed very little over the last 20 years. In developed countries, women and girls accounted for 51.5 per cent of all international migrants in 2010, as were 45.3 per cent in developing countries.
- 8. In 2010, female migrants outnumbered male migrants in Europe, followed by Oceania, Northern America and Latin America and the Caribbean. Men continued to outnumber women in Africa and Asia.
- 9. International migration flows to traditional countries of immigration, such as Australia, Canada, New Zealand and the United States, increased between 1980 and 2008. The United States admitted the largest number of immigrants in the world, with an average of about 1.1 million permanent residence permits issued per year between 2005 and 2008. This was followed by Canada with 250,000 foreigners and 145,000 foreigners and citizens admitted to Australia over the same period. For New Zealand, the annual inflow of foreigners stood at 60,000 between 2005 and 2008. Over the last 30 years, immigrants from less developed countries accounted for a growing share of immigrants to Australia, Canada, New Zealand and the United States.
- 10. Since the 1980, most countries in Europe have experienced increasing immigration. In addition to countries in Europe that have attracted immigrants for some time, such as France, Germany and the United Kingdom, former countries of emigration, such as Italy and Spain, have become preferred destinations for immigrants from other parts of Europe as well as from developing countries.
- 11. Inflows to Europe increased in the late 1980s and 1990s in part due to the fall of the Berlin wall and the collapse of communism in Eastern and Central Europe which resulted in travel restrictions being lifted for these countries. Germany was the country most affected by emigration from Eastern Europe with ethnic Germans moving to Germany in the early 1990s. By 2000, the inflow from that region had declined. The dissolution of the former USSR also led to significant movement of populations between successor states. The civil war in the former Yugoslavia generated large outflows of refugees and asylum seekers between 1990 and 1994.

- 12. Countries in Northern Europe that used to have low levels of immigration in the past experienced an increase since the mid-2000s, especially due to the arrival of asylum seekers and refugees.
- 13. Between 1980 and 2008, the majority of immigrants to Europe came from developed countries, especially other European countries. In absolute numbers, the inflow of immigrants from less developed countries was high in France, Germany and the United Kingdom. The numbers increased for France and the United Kingdom between 1990 and mid-2000, but not for Germany. The number of immigrants to Italy and Spain from less developed regions also increased. However, immigration from less developed regions began to stall or decline in mid-2000.
- 14. Between 1950 and 2010, the more developed regions have been gaining population due to positive net migration, whereas the less developed regions have been losing population due to negative net migration. Northern America (1.3 million annually for 2000-2010) and Europe (1.5 million annually) are the major areas currently gaining the most from net immigration, whereas Asia (1.3 million annually) and Latin America and the Caribbean (1.1 million annually) are losing the most (table 3).

- 15. For 2000-2010, the United States followed by Spain and Italy were the top net immigration countries, whereas Mexico, China and Pakistan were the top net emigration countries. For the future, the United States, Canada and the United Kingdom are projected to be leading the group of net immigration countries and Mexico, China and India the group of net emigration countries.
- 16. During 2010-2050, the net number of international migrants to more developed regions is projected to be 96 million or an average of 2.4 million annually. For the developed world, such a level of net migration largely offsets the expected excess of deaths over births. Despite continued positive net migration, however, the surplus in deaths is projected to dominate population change starting by 2040-2050 leading to overall population decline. For developing countries, the 96 million net emigrants projected for 2010-2050, or 2.4 million annually, represent scarcely 4 per cent of the expected population growth. Thus, net migration will have little effect on overall population change in less developed countries.
- 17. Assuming no migration in the future, the population of developed countries is projected to be 10 per cent smaller in 2050 than for the medium variant projection which assumes that current (2000-2010) net migration levels remain constant. Given the little effect net migration has on

developing countries, their population is projected to be only 2 per cent higher under a zero-migration scenario.

- 18. The dependency ratio, or the ratio of the young and old population to the working-age population, will increase under the zero migration-scenario for more developed regions. For every 10 working adults, there were 4.8 dependent persons in 2010 rising to 7.1 dependent persons in 2050 assuming that current migration trends will continue. Under the zero-migration scenario, the dependency ratio will increase to 7.6 dependent persons per 10 working adults. There will hardly be any change in dependency ratios for the less developed regions under the zero-migration scenario.
- 19. The status of ratification for international instruments related to international migration, such as those focusing on human rights and those addressing migrant worker rights, varies by Member States. Instruments designed to protect refugees and to prevent and prosecute migrant smuggling and human trafficking have been ratified by more than two-thirds of Member States by 2009, whereas instruments protecting the rights of migrant workers have been ratified by less than one-third of Member States, none of which are high-immigration countries.
- 20. By July 2009, 144 countries or 75 per cent of United Nations Member States had signed the 1951 Refugee Convention and the 1967 Refugee Protocol. The 2000 protocol relating to human trafficking and the 2000 protocol relating to migrant smuggling, although close to ten years old, had been ratified by 131 countries (68 per cent) and 119 countries (60 per cent) respectively. While the trend for the 2000 Human Trafficking Protocol continued to rise, the 2000 Migrant Smuggling Protocol was falling behind. Lastly, the 1990 Migration Workers Convention, close to 20 years old, had only been ratified by 41 countries or 22 per cent of United Nations Member States.
- 21. The countries having ratified the 1990 International Convention on the Protection of the Rights of All Migrants and Members of Their Families collectively hosted 15.3 million international migrants in 2010, about seven per cent of the global migrant population. None of the States Parties to the 1990 Convention were major migrant receiving countries, and only five of them hosted more than one million international migrants.

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PART ONE:

INTERNATIONAL MIGRATION LEVELS, TRENDS AND LEGAL INSTRUMENTS

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I. INTERNATIONAL MIGRANT STOCK

A. DATA CONSIDERATIONS

The international migrant stock is a mid-year estimate of the number of people living in a country or area other than the one in which they were born. Most of the statistics used to estimate the international migrant stock were obtained from population censuses. Additionally, population registers and nationally representative surveys provided information on the number and composition of international migrants. The estimates have been published in *Trends in International Migrant Stock: The 2008 Revision* (United Nations database, POP/DB/MIG/Stock/Rev.2008).

B. GLOBAL TRENDS

In 2010, the number of international migrants in the world was estimated at 214 million, an increase of 35 million since 2000 and 58 million since 1990. International migrants represented 3.1 per cent of the total world population, 10.3 per cent of the population in the more developed regions and 1.5 per cent of the population in the less developed regions (table 4). The more developed regions experienced the largest increase in migrant stock between 1990 and 2010 (45 million or 55 per cent). In 2010, almost 60 per cent of all international migrants were living in the more developed regions compared to 53 per cent in 1990. In the less developed regions, the migrant stock increased by 13 million (18 per cent) from 1990 to 2010.

Europe hosted the largest number of international migrants in the world (70 million) in 2010, representing one-third of the global total. The second largest number of international migrants were in Asia (61 million), followed by Northern America (50 million), Africa (19 million), Latin America and the Caribbean (7 million) and Oceania (6 million).

Oceania had the highest percentage of international migrants relative to the total population (16.8 per cent), followed by Northern America (14.2 per cent) and Europe (9.5 per cent). In Africa, Asia and

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Latin America and the Caribbean international migrants accounted for less than 2 per cent of the total population.

A relatively small number of countries hosted most of the world's international migrants (table 5). In 2010, the ten countries with the largest number of international migrants accounted for 52 per cent of the total international migrant stock; 20 countries hosted two-thirds of all international migrants. In 2010, 20 per cent of all international migrants were residing in the United States of America alone (42.8 million), followed by the Russian Federation (12.3 million) and Germany (10.8 million). Overall, 64 countries hosted more than half a million international migrants in 2010, compared to 57 in 1990.

Between 2000 and 2010, nine countries gained over one million international migrants, accounting for 67 per cent of the overall increase in the migrant stock over the last 10 years: United States (8.0 million), Spain (4.6 million), Italy (2.3 million), Saudi Arabia (2.2 million), the United Kingdom (1.7 million), Canada (1.6 million), the Syrian Arab Republic (1.3 million) and Jordan and the United Arab Emirates with one million each (table 6).



The number of countries with more than one million inhabitants where international migrants constituted more than 10 per cent of the population rose from 29 in 1990 to 38 in 2010. Countries with the highest proportion of international migrants in 2010 were mostly located in Western Asia with Qatar (87 per cent), the United Arab Emirates (70 per cent) and Kuwait (69 per cent) leading this group of countries due to the high level of international labour migration relative to total population (figure 1).

In 2010, the number of refugees was estimated at 16.3 million, up from 15.6 million in 2000 but down from 18.5 million in 1990 (table 7). The proportion of refugees among all international migrants had declined from 12 per cent in 1990 to 9 per cent in 2000 and 8 per cent in 2010. Asia hosted the largest number of refugees— 10.9 million or 66 per cent of all refugees in the world in 2010. This was followed by Africa with 2.6 million refugees or 16 per cent, Europe with 1.6 million or 10 per cent, Northern America with 730,000 refugees, Latin America and the Caribbean with 530,000 refugees and Oceania with 59,000 refugees.

Eighty-five per cent of all refugees were living in less developed regions in 2010 (table 7). Growth in the global refugee population between 2000 and 2010 was also concentrated in the less developed regions. Asia experienced a 23 per cent increase, whereas Europe's refugee population declined by 36 per cent and Africa's by 28 per cent. The large increase in refugees in Latin America and the Caribbean, from 50,000 in 2005 to over half a million in 2010, was due to the recent inclusion of persons in refugee-like situations in several countries in the region, which were previously not reported as refugees by the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR).

Although over the last 20 years the more developed regions gained the most international migrants, the annual growth rate of the international migrant stock in more developed regions had been declining, whereas the growth rate of the less developed regions had been steadily increasing (figure 2). In 2010, the growth rate for the less developed regions surpassed the rate for the more developed regions for the first time.

Globally, female migrants constituted almost half of the total international migrant stock in 2010 (table 8). This situation has changed little over the last 20 years. About 51.5 per cent of all international migrants in the more developed regions were women in 2010, as were 45.3 per cent in less developed regions. Since 2000, both the more and less developed regions showed a declining trend in the proportion of women.

There is more variation in the sex distribution of the migrant stock at the level of major areas. For some time, most migrants in Europe have been female, whereas male migrants have outnumbered female migrants in Asia and Africa (figure 3). In Latin America and the Caribbean and Oceania, women have accounted for a growing share of the migrant stock recently, and have represented 50 per cent or more of the total migrant stock since 2000. In Northern America, the proportion of female migrants declined from 51.2 per cent in 1990 to 50.1 per cent in 2010.

Between 2005 and 2010, the global migrant stock grew from 195 million to 214 million, an increase of 19 million international migrants. About 47 per cent of the 19 million were female. Thus, the migrant stock grew primarily due to male rather than female migrants. Male migrants particularly outnumbered female migrants in Asia, Africa and Northern America. In Oceania, followed at some distance by Europe and Latin America and the Caribbean, the net change in the migrant stock was due to female migrants. Assuming that current migration trends continue, the proportion of women in the international migrant stock at the global level is expected to continue to decrease, albeit slowly, for the foreseeable future.

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II. INTERNATIONAL MIGRATION FLOWS – SELECTED COUNTRIES

A. DATA CONSIDERATIONS

International migration flow data are essential to the analysis of international migration levels and trends because they document movements shortly after they have occurred whereas stock data document the cumulative effects of movements. While more recent, and thus more relevant for policy purposes, flow data are affected by limitations imposed by data availability, quality and comparability. Most data on international migration flows are available for relatively few developed countries beginning in the 1980s; few countries have complete data sets, and the data collected often suffer from definitional inconsistencies between countries as they are derived from administrative, not statistical, sources. The following section discusses international migration flows to and from developed countries. The data have been published in *International Migration Flows To and From Selected Countries: The 2008 Revision* (United Nations database, POP/DB/MIG/Flow/ Rev.2008).

B. TRENDS IN INTERNATIONAL MIGRATION FLOWS

The scale and nature of international migration flows in developed countries, especially in Europe, has changed significantly since the 1970s. Between 1945 and 1973, all highly industrialized countries in Western Europe engaged in temporary labour recruitment which ended with the oil crisis of 1973-1974. This period was followed by new complex migration patterns accompanied by a rise in numbers of people migrating. International migration became increasingly global in nature, with more countries becoming countries of origin, destination or transit. Former emigration countries changed to countries of immigration while family reunion and refugee and asylum-seeker movements added another dimension to the flows. By 2000, most developed countries had become countries of immigration. The following sections discuss migration levels and trends in traditional countries of immigration and in countries of Europe.

1. Traditional countries of immigration

Australia, Canada, New Zealand and the United States are among the few countries in the world with immigration programmes intended to attract permanent settlement. Although the number of international migrants in these countries grew between 1980 and 2008, the increase was not continuous. Changes in admission policies affected overall levels (figure 4a and 4b). In general, immigrants from less developed countries accounted for a growing share of immigrants to these traditional countries of immigration. In the United States, they consistently accounted for more than 80 per cent of all immigrants, and in Canada their share increased from 60 per cent in 1980-1984 to 80 per cent in 2005-2008. Although immigrants from less developed countries were numerically less important in Australia and New Zealand, their share rose from 38 per cent in 1980-1984 to 54 per cent in 2000-2004 in Australia, and increased from 20 per cent to 38 per cent in New Zealand in 2005-2008.

Figure 4a. Average annual immigration to traditional settlement countries, 1980-1984 to 2005-2008





Figure 4b. Immigration from less developed regions to traditional settlement countries, 1980-1984 to 2005-2008

The United States continues to admit the largest number of immigrants in the world, with an average of about 1.1 million permanent residence permits issued per year between 2005 and 2008. This was significantly higher than the annual number of 630,000 reported in the 1980s, and the 980,000 reported in the 1990s. Between 1989 and1994, 2.7 million immigrants were regularized under the 1986 Immigration Reform and Control Act (IRCA) (United Nations, 2004). Latin America and the Caribbean accounted for 42 per cent of the inflow to the United States in the 2000s, followed closely by Asia with 35 per cent. By country, Mexicans accounted for 17 per cent of the intake in 2008 alone, followed by China with 7 per cent. The inflow from Europe constituted on average 13 per cent in the 2000s. Immigration from Central and Eastern Europe to the United States contributed to the recent increase in the share of Europeans among all international migrants.

In Canada, immigration levels doubled from 126,000 foreign citizens annually in the 1980s to 220,000 foreign citizens in the 1990s and peaked at 240,000 between 2000 and 2008. Immigrants from Asia have generally constituted very high proportions of Canada's immigrant admissions, accounting for about 60 per cent in the 2000s, followed by Europe with 16 per cent. While the number of permits granted to persons originating from Europe and Northern America has been more or less stable since the 1990s, the annual admission of Asian immigrants increased significantly. For 2000-2008, the average annual inflow from Asia (146,000) was more than three times higher than for 1980-1984 (49,000). Persons from China obtained the largest number of residence permits (30,000 in 2008), accounting for 12 per cent of all permits, followed by India and the Philippines.

Immigration of both Australian and foreign citizens to Australia stood at about 94,000 persons annually in 1980-1984. Over the next five years this increased to 120,000 persons before falling back to levels below one-hundred thousands through the 1990s. For the period 2000-2008, immigration to Australia again reached 120,000 persons annually and stood at 160,000 immigrants by 2008. In the past, mostly British immigrants had dominated, and in later years this gave way to a more ethnically diverse mix of immigrants. For the period 2000-2004, the majority of permanent arrivals to Australia came from Asia, accounting for 40 per cent of the total arrivals. Annual immigration levels from Europe had declined since the 1980s, when they stood at 39,000, to 19,000 in the period 2000-2004. In recent years, the largest number of arrivals to Australia was reported for persons from New Zealand, followed by the United Kingdom, Singapore and China. Taken together, these countries accounted for half of all annual permanent arrivals. The top five destination countries of outflows from Australia in recent years were New Zealand, the United Kingdom, United States, China, Hong Kong SAR and Singapore, in order of importance. Australia's net migration was positive during the period 1980-2005, but due to increasing emigration, the gains in the 2000s were not as high as in the late 1980s and early 1990s.

For New Zealand, the number of long-term and permanent immigrants increased steadily from 21,000 foreigners annually in the 1980s to 39,000 in the 1990s. By 2000-2008, the annual intake of foreigners in New Zealand stood at 60,000. In the 1980s, New Zealand was losing population because the emigration of citizens was higher than the immigration of foreigners. By the 1990s, New Zealand was still losing citizens, but this was offset by the increasing number of foreign immigrants. Thus, on a net basis, net migration became positive. The average annual net gain in foreigners and citizens therefore stood at 12,000 annually for 1990-2008. Since the late 1980s the majority of foreign immigrants to New Zealand came from Asia, followed by Europe and Oceania. By country, the largest group of foreigners originated in the United Kingdom, then Australia, China and India.

2. International migration in Europe




Figure 5. Average annual immigration, 1980-1984 to 2005-2008

During the 1950s and 1960s, countries in Western Europe, such as France, Germany or the United Kingdom, recruited migrants from Greece, Italy, Portugal, Spain and Turkey through guestworker programmes to meet the labour demand created by post-war reconstruction. Following the increase in oil prices in the 1970s and subsequent worldwide economic recession, the labour-recruiting countries ended their guestworker programmes, but labour migrants were generally permitted to stay and reunite with families in the countries of destination. By the late 1970s and early 1980s immigration levels had fallen, and net migration in some of these countries had become negligible or negative (e.g. Germany or the United Kingdom) (figures 5 and 6). Subsequently, immigration rose again, and levels were particularly high during the 1990s. In Germany, for example, the average annual intake in foreigners stood at 946,000 million in 1990-1994 compared to 554,000 immigrating foreigners five years earlier. In Belgium, the annual intake of foreigners increased from 40,000 in 1985-1989 to 54,000 by 1990-1994 and in the Netherlands from 57,000 to 81,000 over the same period.

Economic prosperity combined with declining fertility in former labour-sending countries such as Greece, Italy, Portugal and Spain caused labour shortages, transforming them into countries of destination for immigrants from other parts of Europe as well developing countries (Castles and Miller, 2009). These changes in flows directed toward Southern Europe began in the 1990s and intensified in the 2000s. In Italy, for example, the number of foreign immigrants admitted annually doubled from 125,000 in 1995-1999 to 260,000 in 2000-2004. Spain experienced a more significant annual increase, from 8,000 foreign immigrants in 1985-1989 to 449,000 immigrants in 2000-2004 which increased further to 775,000 by 2005-2008. However, immigration declined in Italy since 2005 and in Spain since 2008.




Figure 7: Immigration to countries in Northern Europe, 2000-2008

Countries in Northern Europe with low levels of immigration in the past have experienced an increase since mid-2000 due to the arrival of asylum seekers and refugees (figure 7). In Norway, for example, the number of foreign immigrants almost doubled from 31,000 in 2005 to 59,000 in 2008. In Sweden, where levels had been higher than in Norway, the number of immigrants, including foreigners and citizens, increased from 65,000 in 2005 to 101,000 in 2008.




Figure 8. Average annual emigration of citizens, 1980-1984 to 2005-2008

Belgium, Denmark, Iceland, the Netherlands, Norway, Spain, Switzerland and more recently Germany reported an increased outflow (figure 8). The highest numbers were reported for Germany, with 154,000 citizens emigrating annually between 2005 and 2007. In the Netherlands, emigration of citizens stood at 76,000 over the same period. The data reported for these countries indicate that citizens often emigrated to neighbouring countries and to Northern America.

European migration patterns were also affected by an inflow of immigrants from Central and Eastern Europe in the late 1980s and 1990s, as former Communist regimes disintegrated and lifted restrictions on travel abroad. Germany was the country most affected by emigration from the Eastern. Between 1985 and 1989, Germany recorded an annual inflow of 264,000 citizens, increasing to 386,000 during 1990-1994. Sixty-three per cent, or 167,000 originated from Eastern Europe in 1985-1989, falling to 54 per cent, or 210,000, by 1990-1994. German citizens from Central and Eastern Europe were mostly ethnic Germans (*Aussiedler*) who had the right to German citizenship upon entering the country. By 2000, the inflow from that region had declined.

Easing of emigration restrictions from the former Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR) also led to significant movement of populations between successor states; the Russian Federation became an important country of immigration, with ethnic Russians leaving or being expelled from former parts of the Soviet Union. There was also an increase in emigration of Jews from the successor states to Israel and the United States. In addition, the dissolution of the former Yugoslavia triggered flows of refugees and asylum seekers, and between 1990 and 2000, countries in Western Europe received more than two million asylum applications from citizens of Central and Eastern European countries (United Nations, 2004). Data for Croatia show that following the war, the number of emigrants declined sharply in 2000. By the mid- to late-1990s, the Baltic States and Poland had become net emigration countries, whereas Croatia, the Czech Republic, Hungary, Slovakia and Slovenia experienced positive net migration.




Figure 9. Immigrants originating in more developed regions, 1980-1984 to 2005-2008

Over the period 1980-2008, the majority of immigrants to Europe came from developed countries, especially other European countries (figure 9). This is true of Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, Germany, Iceland, Luxembourg, Norway, Sweden and Switzerland, where the share of immigrants from more developed regions was continuously over 50 per cent. As compared with 2000-2004, the share of immigrants from more developed regions increased in 2005-2008 in Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Germany, Iceland, the Netherlands, Norway, Spain, Switzerland and the United Kingdom. The opposite was true in Finland, France, Luxembourg and Sweden.




Figure 10: Countries in Europe with high levels of immigration from less developed regions, 1990-2008

Focusing on the countries where the inflow of immigrants from less developed regions was high in recent years, one can see that the numbers increased for France and the United Kingdom over time, but not for Germany (figure 10). The number of immigrants to Italy (since 1996) and Spain (since 2000) from less developed regions also increased, reaching levels similar to those observed in France or the United Kingdom. However, for all of these countries, immigration from less developed regions began to stall or decline in mid-2000. With regard to the major areas of origin of immigrants from less developed regions, Latin America and the Caribbean was the main source for Spain. In 2008, 213,000 immigrants from that major area arrived in Spain, comprising 30 per cent of all immigrants and surpassing the number from Europe (180,000). Inflows from Africa were highest in France with 836,000 in 2007. In Italy and Spain, between 15 and 20 per cent of immigrants originated in Africa in 2000. Since 1990, inflows from Africa increased significantly in France, Italy and Spain. Since 2000, immigration from less developed regions

more than doubled in Finland, Luxemburg and Sweden. In Sweden, the increase was primarily due to the inflow of immigrants from Iraq. Since 1990, Germany and the Netherlands saw the greatest decrease in immigrants from less developed regions. In 2007, the number of Turkish immigrants to Germany reached its lowest level since 1983. Similarly, France and the Netherlands saw a drop in immigration of Moroccans, traditionally a numerically important immigrant group.

With the enlargement of the European Union (EU) in 2004 it was expected that migration from the new member states² to other EU member states and the European Economic Area (EEA) would increase. Except for Ireland, Sweden and the United Kingdom, all other member states temporarily restricted the free movement of people originating in new member states. Over time, the data confirm increased inflows from the new member states to older member states, namely Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, Germany, Italy, the Netherlands, Sweden and Spain. Compared to 2003, annual inflows of immigrants grew by more than 30 per cent in Austria, Belgium, Denmark and Sweden. While most of these countries saw the largest increase in immigrants from Poland, the largest increase in flows to Finland came from Estonia. In Norway, immigration from Poland rose during 2004-2008 to comprise one-fifth of all immigrants. Immigration flow data by country of origin for the United Kingdom were not available, but Poland reported high levels of emigration to the United Kingdom in 2006. In Germany, an important destination for Polish emigrants since the mid-1980s, inflows from Poland grew again from 2004 onwards, with an annual average number of immigrations of 146,000 arrivals and annual net gains of 43,000 during the period 2005-2007.

Following the 2007 enlargement of the EU³, the number of immigrants from Bulgaria and Romania to other EU Member increased, especially to Austria, Belgium, Germany, the Netherlands, Slovakia and Sweden. In 2007, Germany recorded a significant increase in the net gain of immigrants from these two countries. Large inflows from Romania were also reported by Italy and Spain, from Bulgaria only by Spain. Generally, following the enlargement of the EU, new Member States at first experienced high levels of emigration to other EU Member States, but these levels later declined.

III. NET INTERNATIONAL MIGRATION

A. DATA CONSIDERATIONS

Net international migration for a given country refers to the difference between the number of immigrants and the number of emigrants. If more people immigrate to a country than emigrate from it, the country gains population from positive net migration. When more people emigrate than immigrate, the country loses population through negative net migration.

This chapter focuses on net international migration for all countries in the world for the period 1950-2050. The data come from the 2008 Revision of the World Population Prospects (United Nations publication, Sales No. 09.XII.6). In this publication, net migration is often derived as a residual when estimating and projecting population, not accounted for by natural change (births minus deaths) between two successive enumerations of the population. Estimates refer to the period 1950-2010 and projections to the period 2010-2050. Given the volatility of international migration flows, it is impossible to accurately project future migration levels and trends and their impact on population change and population structures. However, population projections including different migration scenarios can help assess the likely impact international migration might have on future populations. For the medium projection variant, it is therefore assumed for the future that recent trends will continue for countries currently (2000-2010) experiencing stable trends in international migration flows. Governments' views on international migration as well as estimates of undocumented and irregular migration flows affecting a country are also taken into account. For countries affected by refugee flows, it is assumed that refugees generally return to their country of origin within the next one or two projection periods. If a country experiences international migration and refugee movements, both are considered simultaneously in order to capture the overall effect on net migration levels and trends in the future. This chapter is based on an analysis of 196 countries with an estimated population of 100,000 inhabitants or more in 2009.

Analyzing net migration alone masks the simultaneous flows of immigration and emigration. Countries with net immigration or net emigration will be characterized as overall receiving or sending countries even though they might also have lost or gained population due to migration in the opposite direction during the time under consideration. Thus countries experiencing net emigration may also experience high immigration while countries experiencing net immigration might be affected by significant emigration. At the global level, population grows or declines due to natural change and international migration is necessarily zero. Whenever the world's constituent countries are divided into groups of mutually exclusive units—such as more developed regions and less developed regions—net migration flows to one group cancel out net migration flows from the other.

B. GLOBAL TRENDS

For the period 1950-2010, the more developed regions gained population due to positive net migration, whereas less developed regions lost population due to negative net migration (figure 11). Net migration numbers increased steadily in the more developed regions, reaching an all-time high of 2.9 million annually between 2000 and 2010. The average net migration in the more developed regions projected for the next 40 years is about 2.4 million persons annually.

Northern America and Europe were the major areas currently gaining the most from net immigration, whereas Asia and Latin America and the Caribbean were losing the most (table 10). From 1950 to 2010, Northern America and Oceania were the only areas that consistently added population due to international migration, whereas Africa and Latin America and the Caribbean consistently lost population due to the same cause. Europe's negative net migration balance of the 1950s turned positive since the 1960s. Asia, on the other hand, experienced positive net migration in the 1950s and 1960s but then lost population due to net emigration starting in the 1970s. As explained earlier, for the future it is assumed that refugees will return to their countries of origin within one or two projection periods and recent migration levels and trends will be held constant through the projection period.




Figure 12. Countries per major area with positive net migration, 1950-1960 to 2000-2010

Focusing on the number of countries per major area with positive or negative net migration confirms that Northern America and Europe were the two areas in which the majority of countries experienced positive net migration, at least since 1950 for the United States and since 1970 for Europe (figure 12). In Latin America and the Caribbean, the majority of countries experienced negative net migration over the last 60 years, followed by Africa and Asia. In Asia, however, 54 per cent (1950-1960) and 52 per cent (1960-1970) of all countries had positive net migration, which then turned negative from the 1970s to the 1990s. By 2000-2010, half of all countries in Asia were net immigration countries. Except for 2000-2010, the majority of countries in Oceania were net emigration countries.

These regional trends mask substantial variation at the country level. Between 1950 and 2010, Northern America added 892 thousand people annually to its population stock due to net migration. The United States gained the most, with three million between 1950-1960 which increased to 10.7 million by 2000-2010 (table 11). Europe gained 473 thousand persons annually, over 62 per cent of which was accounted for by France and Germany. In Oceania, annual net migration stood at 91 thousands in 1950-2010, with Australia's net migration increasing from 0.8 million in 1950-1960 to 1.2 million in 1980-1990. In Latin America and the Caribbean, having lost 569 thousand persons annually over the last 60 years, Mexico's net outflow was by far the highest. In Asia, net migration was positive between 1950 and 1970 and subsequently became negative. China followed by India accounted for most of the net outflow since the 1970s. In Africa, the net loss between 1950 and 2010 stood at 312 thousands annually with Egypt and Morocco having the highest net emigration over that period.

For 2000-2010, the United States followed by Spain and Italy were the top net immigration countries, whereas Mexico, China and Pakistan were the top net emigration countries (table 11). By 2040-2050, the United States, Canada and the United Kingdom were projected to be leading the group of net immigration countries and Mexico, China and India the group of net emigration countries.

The net migration averages of the last 60 years mask variation in migration patterns over time resulting from political events and economic and social changes in countries. As table 12 shows, in 148 of 196 countries net migration changed sign or became zero at least once since 1950. Among these 148 countries, 14 countries in Europe became recent net immigration countries—including Spain and Italy, which from 1950-1960 had been among the top ten net emigration countries. Also in this group are countries that experienced repatriation of ethnic groups, such as Japanese returning from Latin America and other parts of Asia to Japan, and ethnic Russians returning to the Russian Federation from the former Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR) after its disintegration in 1991.

In 48 countries, net migration was consistent, either negative or positive, from 1950-2010. Of these 48, 15 experienced continuous positive net migration since 1950, including traditional immigration countries, such as the United States and Canada, and labour-importing countries in Asia, such as Brunei Darussalam, Qatar, Singapore and the United Arab Emirates. For 33 countries, net migration had been consistently negative since 1950; the majority of these located in less developed regions, especially Asia and Latin America and the Caribbean.

C. CONTRIBUTION OF INTERNATIONAL MIGRATION TO POPULATION CHANGE

Over time, a population grows and declines due to natural increase (births minus deaths) and net migration (immigrants minus emigrants). Migration affects population change directly by adding to or subtracting from the population in countries of destination and origin. It also affects population indirectly by impacting, for example, mortality and fertility in the respective countries. Given the age selectivity of migration, it also affects the age structure of the population in countries of origin and destination. The following paragraphs focus on the direct impact of net migration as compared to natural change on population growth and decline.





Figure 13: Contribution of natural increase and net migration to net population change by development group, 1950-1960 to 2040-2050

In 1950-1960, the population in both more and less developed regions was primarily growing due to natural increase (figure 13). By 1990-2000, growth in more developed regions was for the first time dominated by net migration. Less developed regions, however, were still growing due to a surplus of births over deaths (natural increase). Following the projection assumptions defined earlier, the population of more developed regions is projected to decline by 2040-2050; the rate of natural increase will have become negative and will no longer be offset by positive net migration. Continued

growth at lower rates is projected for the less developed regions, but net migration will remain negligible and the population will continue to grow primarily due to natural increase.



In both Northern America and Oceania net migration played a positive and important role in population growth over the last 60 years, a trend that is expected to continue (figure 14). By 2030-2040, net migration in Northern America will, for the first time, contribute more to population growth than natural increase. From then on, net migration will drive population growth in Northern America. In Europe, net migration kept population growth weakly positive since 1990-2000. By 2020-2030, Europe's

population growth will be negative. Despite continued positive net migration, the surplus of deaths over births is projected to dominate population change, leading to population decline in Europe.

Between 1950-2010, the populations of Africa, Asia and Latin America and the Caribbean continued to grow due to natural increase, however, at a declining rate. Negative net migration was more than offset by natural increase, which will remain the major factor behind population growth in these major areas in the future.

At the country level, the contribution of international migration to population change varies considerably. For the majority of countries, low levels of net migration characterized the past and are expected to have little effect on population change in the future. However, in some countries of the more developed regions with low fertility and low mortality levels, population change will increasingly be due to net international migration.

Over the period 2000-2010, the population increased in 180 countries (table 13). The majority of these, 150 countries in all, grew due to natural increase, and 30 countries grew due to net migration. There was population decline in only 16 countries, in 10 of which population decline occurred because deaths outnumbered births. Twenty of the 30 countries experiencing population growth primarily due to net migration were located in Europe and seven in Asia. Among the 20 countries in Europe were countries in Northern Europe, such as Denmark, Norway, Sweden, and the United Kingdom, countries in Southern Europe with Greece, Italy and Spain or countries in Western Europe such as Austria, Belgium and Switzerland. Among the seven countries in Asia were labour-importing countries, such as Qatar, Singapore and United Arab Emirates. Middle-income countries in Asia, such as Indonesia and Thailand were still growing primarily due to natural increase. The majority of countries in Africa, Asia, Latin America and the Caribbean and Oceania grew due to natural increase. In Northern America, natural increase drove population growth in one country, the United States, whereas net migration was the main cause of population growth in another country, Canada. With one exception, Georgia, all 16 countries experiencing population decline in 2000-2010 were located in Europe.

The impact of international migration on population growth or decline can also be assessed by comparing the results of the 2010-2050 population projection of the medium variant with those obtained by projecting the population with zero international migration. In other words, the zero migration scenario illustrates the effect natural population change alone would have on future population growth since migration is set to zero starting in 2010. Comparing the projected population of the medium variant with those of the zero migration scenario helps assess the relative impact continued international migration is

expected to have on population change in development groups, major areas and countries. Table 14 presents a comparison of these two types of projection results for 2050. As expected, the zero-migration scenario produces a smaller population for more developed regions and a higher one for less developed regions. But the magnitude of the differences in relative terms is revealing: in the more developed regions, zero migration during 2010-2050 is projected to reduce the population by 10 per cent by 2050, whereas in the less developed regions it will increase the population by almost 2 per cent. This comparison confirms the importance of international migration for population growth in the more developed regions.

At the level of the major areas, the largest differences between the 2050 population in the medium variant and the zero-migration scenario are found for Northern America and Oceania. Without any international migration, the projected population of Northern America in 2050 is projected to be 16 per cent smaller, and that for Oceania 11 per cent smaller than according to the medium variant. The potential reduction of the population of Europe is more modest, about 7 per cent, resulting from lower levels of international migration projected for that major area than for Northern America and Oceania. The impact of international migration is considerably lower in all other major areas. The 2050 population of Latin America and the Caribbean is projected to be 5 per cent higher when projected without migration, that of Asia and Africa 1.3 per cent higher when projected under the medium variant.

Similar comparisons can be made for individual countries. Table 15 presents countries with more than one million inhabitants in 2050. Most countries for which emigration is projected to be responsible for reducing significantly the size of the population in 2050 have small populations. By 2050 the most populous country in the group is projected to be Mexico, with a projected population of 129 million that would be nearly 15 per cent higher with no migration. The second populous country in this group is Sri Lanka, with a 2050 population of about 22 million that would be about 16 per cent higher under the zero-migration scenario.

Table 15 also shows countries whose populations are projected to increase significantly due to international migration. Again, most of the countries in the list have small populations. The most populous country in the group is the United States, projected at 404 million in 2050, which would be 15 per cent lower in the absence of immigration. The most significant reductions in total population under the zero migration scenario are projected for China, Hong Kong SAR, the United Arab Emirates and Qatar, all of which heavily depend on immigration to sustain their population size.

Given the age selectivity of migration, migration also affects the age and sex composition of a population. The dependency ratio is a commonly used measure of potential social and economic support needs. The total dependency ratio is calculated as the ratio of the dependent population (under 15 years of age and 65 years or older) to the working-age population (15 to 64 years of age). Table 16 presents dependency ratios for the medium variant projection and the zero migration scenario in order to approximate the impact of migration on the future age structure. In general, the higher this ratio, the more people each potential worker needs to support.

According to the medium variant, the dependency ratio is projected to increase in the developed regions over the next 40 years from 48 to 71 (table 16). In other words, for every 10 working adults, there were 4.8 dependent persons in 2010 and 7.1 dependent persons in 2050. Assuming no migration, the dependency ratio will increase to 76 in more developed regions in 2050 with 7.6 dependent persons per 10 working adults. By major area, Northern America, followed by Europe and Oceania would be most affected if there were no international migration and would all experience an increase in dependency ratios.

At the country level, the impact of migration on the age structure of populations becomes even more evident (table 17). Overall, international migration reduces dependency ratios in labour-recruiting countries, such as the oil-exporting countries in Western Asia. Also, countries of immigration in Northern America, Oceania or Europe, such as Australia, Canada, Italy, Greece and Spain are projected to have higher dependency ratios when migration is set to zero. In general, however, the changes in the dependency ratios are fairly modest for countries in which populating ageing is more advanced. For example, in the case of Japan, a country with the second highest median age in the world in 2050, the dependency ratio under the medium variant would change very little from a high of 96 in 2050 to 99 under the zero-migration scenario. Thus, international migration can play a role in modifying population decline or reductions of the working-age population, but it cannot reverse the trend of population ageing.

IV. LEGAL INSTRUMENTS ON INTERNATIONAL MIGRATION




Figure 15: Status of ratification of legal instruments related to international migration by Member States, 1950-2009^a

The international normative framework on international migration is based on (a) human rights instruments adopted by the General Assembly and (b) migrant worker rights instruments adopted by the International Labour Organization (ILO). These instruments have been ratified in varying degrees by Member States (figure 15). Instruments designed to protect refugees and to prevent and prosecute migrant smuggling and human trafficking have been ratified by more than two-thirds of Member States by 2009, whereas instruments protecting the rights of migrant workers have been ratified by less than one-third of Member States.

The 1951 Convention and the 1967 Protocol, both relating to the Status of Refugees, are the central elements in the international regime of refugee protection, and central to the activities of the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR). The 1951 Convention defines the term "refugee", enumerates the rights of refugees, and establishes the legal obligation of States regarding refugee protection. The Convention prohibits the expulsion or forcible return of persons accorded refugee status: no refugee should be returned in any manner to any country or territory in which his or her life or freedom would be threatened (non-refoulement). The 1967 Protocol extended the application of the 1951 Convention to persons who became refugees after 1 January 1951, without any geographic limitation. By mid-2009, the 1951 Convention and its 1967 Protocol had each been ratified by 144 Member States, and 141 States were Parties to both instruments (table 18). The 147 States that had ratified either the 1951 Convention or the 1967 Protocol collectively hosted 6.2 million refugees in 2008, 41 per cent of the global refugee population. This includes 4.7 million Palestinian refugees who fall under the mandate of the United Nations Relief and Works Agency (UNRWA). If they were excluded, the proportion of refugees hosted by States Parties would increase to 59 per cent.

The ILO has adopted two legally-binding instruments that specifically address migrant workers; the Convention concerning Migration for Employment (Revised 1949) (No. 97), and the Convention concerning Migrations in Abusive Conditions and the Promotion of Equality of Opportunity and Treatment of Migrant Workers (Supplementary Provisions) (No. 143). Both have been complemented by non-binding recommendations. The 1949 Convention concerning Migration for Employment covers recruitment and working conditions' standards for migrant workers. It establishes the principle of equal treatment of migrant workers and nationals with regard to laws, regulations and administrative practices that concern living and working conditions, remuneration, social security, employment taxes and access to justice. The 1975 Convention was the first multilateral attempt to address irregular migration and to call for sanctions against "traffickers". It emphasizes that Member States are obliged to respect the basic human rights of all migrant workers, including irregular migrants. It also provides that lawfully present migrant workers and their families should not only be entitled to equal treatment but also to equality of opportunity, e.g. equal access to employment and occupation, trade union and cultural rights and individual and collective freedoms. As of 1 July 2009, 49 ILO Member States out of 183 had ratified ILO Convention No. 97; 23 Member States had ratified No. 143; 17 Member States had ratified both instruments, representing 9 per cent of ILO Member States and hosting five per cent of all international migrants worldwide (11 million) in 2010.

The 1990 International Convention on the Protection of the Rights of All Migrants and Members of Their Families is the third and most comprehensive international treaty on migrant worker rights. It establishes international definitions for categories of migrant workers and formalizes the responsibility of States in upholding the rights of migrant workers and members of their families. The Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights monitors the implementation of the convention and works to further its ratification. As of mid-2009, 41 States (out of a total of 192 United Nations Member States) had ratified the convention. They collectively hosted 15.3 million international migrants in 2010, about seven per cent of the global migrant population. None of the States Parties to the 1990 Convention were major migrant receiving countries, and only five of them hosted more than one million international migrants. Overall, 82 countries had ratified at least one of the three instruments regarding migrant workers. Together they hosted 32 per cent of the world migrant population in 2010, 69 millions in absolute figures.

The two protocols seeking to stem irregular migration concern human trafficking and migrant smuggling. They supplement the United Nations Convention against Transnational Organized Crime. The 2000 Protocol to Prevent, Suppress and Punish Trafficking in Persons, Especially Women and Children took effect in 2003 and had been ratified by 131 countries as of 1 July 2009. The Protocol defines human trafficking as the acquisition of people by improper means, such as force, fraud or deception, with the aim of exploiting them. The Protocol aims to prevent and combat trafficking in persons, to protect and assist victims of such trafficking, in particular women and children, and to promote cooperation among States Parties. The 2000 Protocol against the Smuggling of Migrants by Land, Sea and Air took effect in 2004 and had been ratified by 119 countries as of 1 July 2009. As set out in the Protocol, smuggling of migrants involves the procurement for financial or other material benefit of the illegal entry of a person into a State of which the person is not a national or permanent resident. The Protocol is an effective tool for combating and preventing the smuggling of human cargo. It reaffirms that migration in itself is not a crime, and that migrants may be victims in need of protection. The United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) assists Member States in implementing the Protocols. The rapid increase in the ratification of the human trafficking and the migrant smuggling protocols indicates the growing concern of Member States about irregular migration and its detrimental effects.


Table 19 and figure 16 show the status of ratification for the above-mentioned conventions and protocols by development group and major area. For the 1951 Convention and its 1967 Protocol, both relating to the status of refugees, the rate of ratification is low in Asia with 40 per cent and in Oceania with 50 per cent, while the remaining areas show ratification rates above 80 per cent for at least one of the two instruments. Ratification rates of the protocol relating to human trafficking and of the protocol relating to migrant smuggling are highest for Member States in Northern America (100 per cent) and Europe (84 and 86 per cent). Overall, the three instruments relating to migrant rights' protection show lower ratification rates compared to the other migration-related instruments in all major areas. Latin America and the Caribbean has the highest ratification rate for at least one migrant rights' instrument, whereas Northern America has not ratified any of these three instruments.

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V. RESOLUTIONS OF THE UNITED NATIONS GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND THE ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL COUNCIL

A. 61/208 International migration and development

The General Assembly,

Recalling its resolutions 49/127 of 19 December 1994, 50/123 of 20 December 1995, 52/189 of 18 December 1997, 54/212 of 22 December 1999, 56/203 of 21 December 2001, 58/208 of 23 December 2003, 59/241 of 22 December 2004 and 60/227 of 23 December 2005 on international migration and development, and 60/206 of 22 December 2005 on the facilitation and reduction of the cost of transfer of migrant remittances,

Recalling also the 2005 World Summit Outcome, 1

Recalling further its resolution 57/270 B of 23 June 2003 on the integrated and coordinated implementation of and follow-up to the outcomes of the major United Nations conferences and summits in the economic and social fields,

Recalling its resolution 60/265 of 30 June 2006 on the follow-up to the development outcome of the 2005 World Summit, including the Millennium Development Goals and the other internationally agreed development goals,

Reaffirming the Universal Declaration of Human Rights,² and recalling the International Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Racial Discrimination,³ the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women⁴ and the Convention on the Rights of the Child,⁵

Recalling the International Convention on the Protection of the Rights of All Migrant Workers and Members of Their Families, ⁶

Recalling also Commission on Population and Development resolution 2006/2 of 10 May $2006,^7$

Acknowledging the important nexus between international migration and development and the need to deal with the challenges and opportunities that migration presents to countries of origin, transit and destination, and recognizing that migration brings benefits as well as challenges to the global community,

Acknowledging also the important contribution provided by migrants and migration to development, as well as the complex interrelationship between migration and development,

Reaffirming the resolve expressed by Heads of State and Government to take measures to ensure respect for and protection of the human rights of migrants, migrant workers and members of their families.⁸

Noting the efforts of Member States, relevant United Nations bodies, organizations, funds and programmes and international and intergovernmental organizations, including the International Organization for Migration, in respect of convening events at the national, regional and international levels with a view to advancing the dialogue on the issue of international migration and development,

Noting with interest the offer of the Government of Belgium to convene a state-led initiative, the Global Forum on Migration and Development, in 2007,

- 1. Takes note of the report of the Secretary-General;
- 2. Welcomes the convening of the High-level Dialogue on International Migration and Development in New York on 14 and 15 September 2006, and the high level and broad participation that provided an opportunity to discuss the multidimensional aspects of international migration and development;
- 3. Takes note of the summary of the High-level Dialogue by the President of the General Assembly; 10
- 4. Welcomes the heightened awareness achieved by the High-level Dialogue on the issue, and decides to consider, at its sixty-third session, possible options for appropriate follow-up to the High-level Dialogue;
- 5. Also welcomes the ongoing efforts of Governments in the area of regional and interregional cooperation and regional consultative processes, where they exist, on migration, and encourages consideration of development dimensions in such processes, towards facilitating the dialogue and the exchange of information and experiences, fostering coordination at the regional and national levels, building common understanding, promoting cooperation, contributing to capacity-building and strengthening partnerships among countries of origin, transit and destination;
 - 6. *Takes note with interest* of the establishment of the Global Migration Group;
- 7. Calls upon all relevant bodies, agencies, funds and programmes of the United Nations system and other relevant intergovernmental, regional and subregional organizations, within their respective mandates, to continue to address the issue of international migration and development, with a view to integrating migration issues, including a gender perspective and cultural diversity, in a more coherent way within the broader context of the implementation of internationally agreed development goals, including the Millennium Development Goals and respect for human rights;
- 8. Recalls its resolution 55/93 of 4 December 2000, by which it proclaimed 18 December International Day of the Migrant, and invites Member States and intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations to include in the observance of International Day of the Migrant the developmental dimension of international migration, as highlighted by the High-level Dialogue on International Migration and Development held in New York, by sharing experiences and best practices on, inter alia, how to maximize the benefits of international migration and reduce its negative impacts;
- 9. *Requests* the Secretary-General to submit a report to the General Assembly at its sixty-third session on the implementation of the present resolution;
- 10. *Decides* to include in the provisional agenda of its sixty-third session the sub-item entitled "International migration and development".

B. 61/515 Summary of the High-level Dialogue on International Migration and Development: Note by the President of the General Assembly

I. Format and participation

- 1. In accordance with paragraph 11 of General Assembly resolution 60/227 of 23 December 2005, the President of the sixty-first session of the General Assembly has the honour to transmit herewith the summary of the first High-level Dialogue on International Migration and Development that the General Assembly conducted on 14 and 15 September 2006 at United Nations Headquarters.
- 2. The High-level Dialogue was opened by the President of the General Assembly. Her statement was followed by statements from the Secretary-General and the President of the Economic and Social Council. The Dialogue included four plenary meetings at which statements were made by high-level officials of 127 Member States, including 1 Vice-President, 47 ministers and 40 vice-ministers. Representatives of 1 Observer State and 10 intergovernmental entities and organizations having received a standing invitation to participate as observers in the sessions and the work of the Assembly also made statements.
- 3. Four interactive round tables were held during the afternoon of 14 September and the morning of 15 September. Participants in the round tables included 162 high-level representatives of Member States, officials of 16 United Nations agencies, funds and programmes, the Executive Secretaries of 2 United Nations regional commissions, the Director-General of the International Organization for Migration (IOM) and representatives of 12 non-governmental organizations, civil society and private sector entities.
- 4. Each round table considered a different topic. Round table 1 focused on the effects of international migration on economic and social development and was chaired by Tarja Filatov, Minister of Labour of Finland. Round table 2 discussed measures to ensure respect for and protection of the human rights of all migrants, and to prevent and combat smuggling of migrants and trafficking in persons, and had Francisco Laínez, Minister for Foreign Affairs of El Salvador, as chair. Round table 3 considered the multidimensional aspects of international migration and development, including remittances, and was chaired by Kastriot Sulka, Deputy Minister of Labour, Welfare and Equal Opportunities of Albania. Round table 4 discussed ways of promoting the building of partnerships and capacity-building and the sharing of best practices at all levels, including the bilateral and regional levels, for the benefit of countries and migrants alike, and was chaired by Jean-François Ndongou, Minister, Deputy to the Minister of State, Minister for Foreign Affairs, Cooperation, Francophonie and Social Integration of Gabon.
- 5. At the afternoon plenary meeting on 15 September, summaries of the deliberations conducted in the round tables were presented orally by the chairpersons of the round tables. After all the statements in the plenary were made, the President of the General Assembly delivered a closing statement.

II. Key issues

6. The High-level Dialogue on International Migration and Development demonstrated the strong commitment of Member States, United Nations entities, observers, non-governmental organizations, civil society and the private sector to examining the relationship and synergies between international migration and development. There was general consensus that the High-level Dialogue presented a unique opportunity to identify ways and means to maximize the developmental benefits of international migration and to reduce its negative impacts.

- 7. Participants stressed the global character of international migration. They affirmed that international migration was a growing phenomenon, both in scope and in complexity, affecting virtually all countries in the world. They agreed that international migration could be a positive force for development in both countries of origin and countries of destination, provided that it was supported by the right set of policies.
- 8. Participants noted that international migrants contributed to development in both developing and developed countries. In some countries, migrants were essential in meeting labour shortages. A number of participants also underscored the social and cultural contributions of migrants. Some countries reported on their long experience in receiving and integrating international migrants. Other countries had only recently become migrant receiving countries. Many participants mentioned how their countries had benefited from the emigration of their citizens and from the financial and other contributions that migrant communities had made to the development of their countries. The role of migrant entrepreneurs in reinvigorating urban areas was mentioned.
- 9. Participants felt that it was essential to address the root causes of international migration to ensure that people migrated out of choice rather than necessity. They observed that people often had to migrate because of poverty, conflict, human rights violations, poor governance or lack of employment. There was widespread support for incorporating international migration issues in national development plans, including poverty reduction strategies. Participants noted that international migration could contribute to the achievement of the internationally agreed development goals, including the Millennium Development Goals, but cautioned against viewing international migration by itself as a long-term development strategy. The need to generate jobs with decent working conditions and to ensure that sustainable livelihoods were possible in all countries was emphasized.
- 10. Participants recognized that international migration, development and human rights were intrinsically interconnected. Respect for the fundamental rights and freedoms of all migrants was considered essential for reaping the full benefits of international migration. Many noted that some vulnerable groups, such as migrant women and children, needed special protection. Governments were called upon to ratify and implement the core human rights conventions and other relevant international instruments, including the International Convention on the Protection of the Rights of All Migrant Workers and Members of Their Families. Participants underlined the need for concerted efforts on the part of Governments to combat xenophobia, discrimination, racism and the social exclusion of migrant populations.
- 11. Participants emphasized that the social consequences of international migration deserved urgent attention. The integration of international migrants in receiving countries required mutual adaptation and acceptance by both the host society and the migrants themselves. It was important to combat all types of intolerance. Information campaigns about the positive contribution of international migrants to the host society and about the rights and responsibilities of international migrants were deemed useful.
- 12. Participants acknowledged that remittances were the most tangible benefit of international migration for countries of origin. They noted that the volume of remittances had increased markedly in recent years. While remittances benefited millions of families of migrants, participants believed that their development potential could be enhanced by appropriate measures. These encompassed increasing competition among money-transfer companies and banks to reduce transfer fees, improving the access to banking services, including credit, of migrants and their families and expanding financial literacy in countries of origin. There was consensus that remittances were private flows and should not be considered a substitute for official development assistance, direct foreign investment or debt relief. Some participants warned about the potentially negative consequences of remittances, including the culture of dependency that they might foster at both the household and national levels.
- 13. Participants agreed that migrant communities had significant potential to contribute to the development of their countries of origin. A number of countries had taken measures to strengthen ties with their nationals abroad and to encourage highly skilled workers in the direction of return and circular migration. Several participants noted that, through co-development projects, migrant

entrepreneurs had been agents of development in their countries of origin. The role of international migrants in transferring know-how, skills, technology, expertise and new ways of thinking to their countries of origin was also underscored.

- 14. Participants also focused on ways of minimizing the negative consequences of highly skilled emigration from developing countries. The outflow of highly skilled workers from the health and education sectors was of particular concern, since it compromised the delivery of services in countries of origin. Participants urged the implementation of measures to retain highly skilled workers by, among other things, ensuring equitable pay and decent working conditions. The promotion of return, even on a temporary basis, of skilled workers to their countries of origin was also recommended. Some participants noted that their countries had adopted or were about to adopt codes of conduct barring the active recruitment of health workers from developing countries affected by labour shortages in the health and education sectors. A number of participants suggested that cooperative arrangements could be made to train skilled workers in developing countries and others argued for different mechanisms for compensation.
- 15. Participants remarked that labour migration was crucial for the world economy. In some countries, the labour market was highly dependent on foreign workers. In others, temporary labour migration allowed for the filling of specific labour needs. Participants noted that the relatively high participation of women in labour migration had prompted some countries to re-examine their labour migration regulations and procedures to ensure that they were gender sensitive and that they offered adequate protection for female migrants.
- 16. Participants noted that about half of all international migrants were female. Women, like men, migrated in order to improve their livelihoods. For many women migration was a means of empowerment. The entrepreneurial potential of female migrants deserved support, and the contribution of migrant women to development in both countries of origin and those of destination had to be recognized. However, migration also entailed risks that were often more serious for women than for men, especially when women were relegated to undesirable low-paying jobs. It was important, therefore, to adopt policies that addressed the particular circumstances and experiences of female migrants and reduced their vulnerability to exploitation and abuse. Women and girls who were victims of trafficking were entitled to special protection.
- 17. Participants expressed concern about the increase in irregular migration and the exploitation and abuse of migrants in an irregular situation. There was general consensus that trafficking in persons and the smuggling of migrants, especially women and children, should be combated with urgency at the national, bilateral, regional and global levels. Some participants noted that restrictive migration policies contributed to an increase in irregular migration and argued for an increase in legal avenues for migration and for the regularization of migrants in an irregular situation. Participants suggested that information campaigns highlighting the dangers involved in migrating without authorization could help in reducing irregular flows. Although effective border control was considered necessary by many participants, there was recognition that security and control measures alone would not eliminate irregular migration. Hence, there was a call for migration policies that could produce a better balance between unmet labour demand and the inflows of workers from abroad. Participants also underscored that measures to control irregular migration should not prevent persons fleeing persecution and other vulnerable populations from seeking international protection.
- 18. Most participants considered that national strategies to address the impact of international migration on development should be complemented by strengthened bilateral, regional and multilateral cooperation. They considered that such cooperation was needed to promote legal, safe and orderly migration, reduce irregular migration and improve the chances of reaping the full benefits of international migration. The proliferation of regional consultative processes was seen by participants as proof that cooperation was particularly effective at the regional level. Many participants provided examples of regional mechanisms that, through improved dialogue and better mutual understanding, had led to practical measures to address migration issues.

19. Participants also recognized the usefulness of bilateral agreements and cited examples of those addressing labour migration, the portability of pensions, the readmission of nationals or the fight against trafficking in persons and the smuggling of migrants. Many participants considered that regional and bilateral initiatives had to be complemented by initiatives at the global level, noting that the United Nations was a natural venue for such initiatives. Participants also mentioned the work of the Global Commission on International Migration, whose report provided useful guidance, the International Agenda for Migration Management, produced by the Berne Initiative, and the annual dialogue on migration policy sponsored by IOM.

III. Follow-up to the High-level Dialogue

- 20. Nearly all Member States participating in the High-level Dialogue expressed an interest in the continuation of global dialogue on international migration and development. There was widespread support for the proposal of the Secretary-General to create a global forum as a venue for discussing issues related to international migration and development in a systematic and comprehensive way.
- 21. Many participants stressed that, if established, the forum should foster practical, evidence-based measures to enhance the benefits of international migration and minimize its negative effects. The forum, participants noted, should be informal, voluntary and led by Member States operating in a transparent and open manner. It would not produce negotiated outcomes or normative decisions, but it would promote closer cooperation among Governments.
- 22. A number of participants cautioned that the proposed forum should avoid duplicating existing structures and ongoing activities in other entities. If established, the forum was expected to rely on the existing expertise in the United Nations system and other international organizations. It would build on the experiences of regional consultative processes and work closely with the recently established Global Migration Group. The precise relationship between the forum and the United Nations was the subject of some debate. One proposal was to link the forum to the United Nations through the Special Representative of the Secretary-General on International Migration and Development, Peter Sutherland.
- 23. A few participants argued that adequate means to address international migration issues already existed in different entities or structures, including in the United Nations system. They favoured the use of existing institutions, including IOM and the Global Migration Group, to continue addressing the international migration and development nexus. Some participants considered that dialogue could be more effective at the regional level than at the global level, perhaps enhanced by a periodic meeting of the chairs of the regional processes.
- 24. The Government of Belgium offered to host the first meeting of the global forum in 2007, an offer that was generally welcomed. The Secretary-General stated that, should Member States deem it useful, he was ready to establish a voluntary trust fund to support the activities of the forum. His decision to extend the mandate of the Special Representative of the Secretary-General on International Migration and Development received wide support.

C. 62/270 Global Forum on Migration and Development

The General Assembly,

Recalling that the 2005 World Summit Outcome acknowledged the important nexus between international migration and development and the need to deal with the challenges and opportunities that migration presents and reaffirmed the resolve to take measures to ensure respect for and protection of the human rights of migrants, migrant workers and members of their families, ¹

Considering that the summary of the High-level Dialogue on International Migration and Development, held in New York on 14 and 15 September 2006, as contained in a note by the President of the General Assembly, underlined the close link between migration, development and human rights, as well as the fact that respect for the human rights and fundamental freedoms of all migrants was essential for taking advantage of the positive aspects of international migration,

Recalling its resolutions 61/208 of 20 December 2006 on international migration and development and 62/156 of 18 December 2007 on the protection of migrants,

Stressing the need to promote a comprehensive and coherent discussion on all aspects of the phenomenon of migration, taking into account its importance on the global agenda,

Recognizing the need for Member States to consider the multidimensional aspects of international migration and development, in order to identify appropriate ways and means of dealing with the challenges and opportunities that international migration presents,

Recalling the important contribution provided by migrants and migration to development, as well as the interrelationship between migration and development, and the importance of including the perspective of the human rights of migrants as a priority matter in relevant debates and discussions that are held in the United Nations system,

Considering that the report of the Secretary-General of 18 May 2006 on international migration and development, prepared pursuant to General Assembly resolutions 59/241 of 22 December 2004 and 60/227 of 23 December 2005, highlighted the fact that, within the United Nations system, there is no entity mandated to systematically address all matters related to international migration,³

Recalling that Member States participating in the High-level Dialogue on International Migration and Development expressed interest in continuing the dialogue on migration and development, and that there was widespread support for the proposal of the Secretary-General to create a global forum to address, in depth and in a systematic manner, all topics related to international migration and development,

Taking note of the summary report of the first meeting of the Global Forum on Migration and Development, held in Brussels from 9 to 11 July 2007 under the auspices of the Government of Belgium,⁴ and the generous offer of the Government of the Philippines to host the second meeting, from 27 to 30 October 2008, in Manila,

Noting with appreciation that the convening of the first meeting of the Global Forum on Migration and Development has already resulted in the establishment of official focal points on migration and development at the national level,

Recognizing that the Global Forum on Migration and Development currently functions under the Guiding Principles of the Forum of 2007 and as a State-led initiative, and that it should be strengthened

with the aim of addressing the multidimensional aspects of international migration and development with a comprehensive approach,

- 1. Recognizes that exchanges of information and expertise, consultation and closer cooperation between the Global Forum on Migration and Development and the United Nations could have a positive impact, and in this regard:
- (a) Welcomes the transmission to the Secretary-General by the Government of Belgium of the summary report of the first meeting of the Global Forum on Migration and Development, circulated as a document of the General Assembly,⁴ and invites organizers of subsequent meetings of the Forum to continue this practice;
- (b) Requests the Secretary-General to include in his report called for in resolution 61/208 an evaluation of the existing cooperation mechanisms on migration and development and to make it available to the Global Forum on Migration and Development, at its second meeting, in 2008;
- (c) Encourages Member States to participate actively in, and the organizations that are members of the Global Migration Group, within their respective areas of expertise, to contribute and to provide technical support to the Global Forum on Migration and Development;
- (d) Notes that the Global Forum on Migration and Development, through its Steering Group, maintains links with the Secretary-General, notably through his Special Representative on International Migration and Development;
- 2. Takes note with interest of the agenda prepared for the discussions of the Global Forum on Migration and Development, and the title of the second meeting of the Global Forum, "Protecting and empowering migrants for development", and particularly welcomes the inclusion of the topic of the human rights of migrants;
- 3. *Requests* the Secretary-General to submit to the General Assembly at its sixty-third session a report on the implementation of the present resolution.

D. 63/225 International migration and development

The General Assembly,

Recalling its resolutions 58/208 of 23 December 2003, 59/241 of 22 December 2004, 60/227 of 23 December 2005, 60/206 of 22 December 2005 on the facilitation and reduction of the cost of transfer of migrant remittances, 62/156 of 18 December 2007 on the protection of migrants, 62/270 of 20 June 2008 on the Global Forum on Migration and Development and 61/208 of 20 December 2006 on international migration and development,

Recalling also the 2005 World Summit Outcome¹ and its resolution 60/265 of 30 June 2006 on the follow-up to the development outcome of the 2005 World Summit, including the Millennium Development Goals and the other internationally agreed development goals, and taking note of the Doha Declaration on Financing for Development, adopted on 2 December 2008,²

Recalling further its resolution 57/270 B of 23 June 2003 on the integrated and coordinated implementation of and follow-up to the outcomes of the major United Nations conferences and summits in the economic and social fields,

Reaffirming the Universal Declaration of Human Rights,³ and recalling the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights,⁴ the International Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Racial Discrimination,⁵ the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women, ⁶ and the Convention on the Rights of the Child,⁷

Recalling the International Convention on the Protection of the Rights of All Migrant Workers and Members of Their Families, 8 and the invitation to Member States that have not yet done so to consider signing and ratifying or acceding to the Convention,

Recalling also the importance of the decent work agenda of the International Labour Organization, including for migrant workers, and the eight fundamental Conventions of the International Labour Organization,

Recalling further Commission on Population and Development resolution 2006/2 of 10 May 2006.9

Bearing in mind the summary by the President of the General Assembly of the 2006 Highlevel Dialogue on International Migration and Development, ¹⁰

Acknowledging that the High-level Dialogue on International Migration and Development provided a useful opportunity to address constructively the issue of international migration and development and heightened awareness of the issue,

Acknowledging also the important nexus between international migration and development and the need to deal with the challenges and opportunities that migration presents to countries of origin, transit and destination, and recognizing that migration brings benefits as well as challenges to the global community,

Acknowledging further the important contribution provided by migrants and migration to development, as well as the complex interrelationship between migration and development,

Recognizing that remittance flows constitute sources of private capital and that remittances have increased over time, complement domestic savings and are instrumental in improving the well-being of recipients,

- 1. Takes note of the report of the Secretary-General;¹¹
- 2. Encourages efforts by Member States and the international community to promote a balanced, coherent and comprehensive approach to international migration and development, particularly by building partnerships and ensuring coordinated action to develop capacities, including for the management of migration;
- 3. *Emphasizes* that respect for the human rights and fundamental freedoms of all migrants is essential for reaping the benefits of international migration;
- 4. Recognizes with appreciation the important contribution made by migrants and migration to development in countries of origin and destination;
- 5. Takes note of the Global Forum on Migration and Development, which held its first meeting in Brussels from 9 to 11 July 2007, and its second meeting in Manila from 27 to 30 October 2008, as an informal, voluntary, open, State-led initiative, and also takes note of the generous offer of the Government of Greece to host the third meeting of the Global Forum, to be held in Athens on 4 and 5 November 2009, as well as the offers of other Governments to hold subsequent meetings of the Forum:
- 6. *Invites* the countries of origin and destination, in accordance with domestic legislation, to undertake appropriate measures to facilitate the contribution of migrants and migrant communities to the development of their countries of origin;
- 7. Recognizes the need for Member States to continue considering the multidimensional aspects of international migration and development in order to identify appropriate ways and means of maximizing the development benefits and minimizing the negative impacts;
- 8. Reaffirms that there is a need to address and promote conditions for cheaper, faster and safer transfers of remittances in both source and recipient countries and, as appropriate, to encourage opportunities for development-oriented investment in recipient countries by beneficiaries that are willing and able to undertake such action, bearing in mind that remittances cannot be considered a substitute for foreign direct investment, official development assistance, debt relief or other public sources of financing for development;
- 9. *Reiterates* the need to consider how the migration of highly skilled persons and those with advanced education affects the development efforts of developing countries;
- 10. Acknowledges the need to analyse the impact of certain forms of temporary migration, circular migration and return migration on the development of countries of origin, transit and destination, as well as on migrants themselves;
- 11. Urges Member States and relevant international organizations to incorporate a gender perspective in all policies and programmes on international migration in order to, inter alia, reinforce the positive contributions that migrant women can make to the economic, social and human development of their countries of origin and their host countries, and to strengthen the protection of women migrants from all forms of violence, discrimination, trafficking, exploitation and abuse by promoting their rights and welfare, while recognizing in this regard the importance of joint and

collaborative approaches and strategies at the bilateral, regional, interregional and international levels:

- 12. Requests all Member States, in accordance with their relevant international obligations and commitments, to promote cooperation at all levels in addressing the challenge of undocumented or irregular migration so as to foster a secure, regular and orderly process of migration;
- 13. Calls upon all relevant bodies, agencies, funds and programmes of the United Nations system, and other relevant intergovernmental, regional and subregional organizations, including the Global Migration Group, within their respective mandates, to continue to address the issue of international migration and development, with a view to integrating migration issues, including a gender perspective and cultural diversity, in a more coherent way, within the context of the implementation of the internationally agreed development goals, including the Millennium Development Goals, and with respect for human rights;
- 14. Calls upon the United Nations system and other relevant international organizations and multilateral institutions to enhance their cooperation in the development of methodologies for the collection and processing of statistical data on international migration and the situation of migrants in countries of origin, transit and destination and to assist Member States in their capacity-building efforts in this regard;
- 15. Encourages the United Nations system and other relevant international organizations to support developing countries in their efforts to address migration issues within their respective development strategies in the context of the implementation of the internationally agreed development goals, including the Millennium Development Goals;
- 16. *Decides* to hold, within existing resources, a High-level Dialogue on International Migration and Development during its sixty-eighth session, in 2013, the focus and modalities of which will be decided upon at its sixty-seventh session;
- 17. Also decides to convene, within existing resources, at its sixty-fifth session, in 2011, a one-day informal thematic debate on international migration and development;
- 18. Further decides to include in the provisional agenda of its sixty-fifth session the subitem entitled "International migration and development";
- 19. *Invites* the regional commissions to examine regional aspects of international migration and development and to provide inputs, in accordance with respective mandates and within existing resources, to the report of the Secretary-General on this item;
- 20. Requests the Secretary-General to submit to the General Assembly at its sixty-fifth session a report on the implementation of the present resolution.

E. Resolution 2006/2 on International migration and development

The Commission on Population and Development,

Recalling the Programme of Action of the International Conference on Population and Development adopted at Cairo, in particular chapter X on international migration, and the key actions for the further implementation of the Programme of Action, in particular section II.C on international migration,

Recognizing that the implementation of the Programme of Action of the International Conference on Population and Development and the key actions for its further implementation is integrally linked to global efforts to eradicate poverty and achieve sustainable development and that the achievement of the goals of the Programme of Action is consistent with and makes an essential contribution to the achievement of the internationally agreed development goals, including the Millennium Development Goals.

Recalling the relevant provisions on international migration contained, inter alia, in the Copenhagen Declaration on Social Development,³ the Programme of Action of the World Summit for Social Development,⁴ the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action⁵ and their periodic reviews, and the Durban Declaration and Programme of Action adopted by the World Conference against Racism, Racial Discrimination, Xenophobia and Related Intolerance on 8 September 2001,⁶

Recalling also the 2005 World Summit Outcome of 16 September 2005,⁷

Recalling further General Assembly resolution 57/270 B of 23 June 2003 on the integrated and coordinated implementation of and follow-up to the outcomes of the major United Nations conferences and summits in the economic and social fields,

Recalling all General Assembly resolutions relevant to international migration and development,

Recalling also General Assembly resolutions 58/208 of 23 December 2003, 59/241 of 22 December 2004 and 60/227 of 23 December 2005, which are relevant to the setting up and organizing of the High-level Dialogue on International Migration and Development which will be held during the sixty-first session of the Assembly and which will discuss the overall theme of the multidimensional aspects of international migration and development in order to identify appropriate ways and means to maximize the development benefits and minimize the negative impacts,

Reaffirming the resolve expressed by the Heads of State and Government⁸ to take measures to ensure respect for and protection of the human rights of migrants, migrant workers and members of their families,

Recalling the Universal Declaration of Human Rights,⁹ the International Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Racial Discrimination,¹⁰ the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women¹¹ and the Convention on the Rights of the Child,¹²

Recalling also the International Convention on the Protection of the Rights of All Migrant Workers and Members of Their Families, ¹³ which entered into force in July 2003,

Recalling further the United Nations Convention against Transnational Organized Crime and the supplementing protocols thereto, namely, the Protocol to Prevent, Suppress and Punish Trafficking in Persons, Especially Women and Children, and the Protocol against the Smuggling of Migrants by Land, Sea and Air.¹⁴

Acknowledging the important nexus between international migration and development and the need to deal with the challenges and opportunities that migration presents to countries of origin, transit and destination and recognizing that migration brings benefits as well as challenges to the global community,

Bearing in mind that policies and initiatives on the issue of migration, including those that refer to the orderly management of migration, should promote holistic approaches that take into account the causes and consequences of the phenomenon, as well as the full respect of the human rights and fundamental freedoms of migrants,

Recognizing that remittance flows constitute one of the important aspects of international migration,

Noting that the proportion of women and girls among international migrants amounted to nearly 50 per cent in 2005 and deeply concerned about the risks that women and girls, including women migrant workers, are exposed to in the context of migration, such as gender-based discrimination, multiple aggravated forms of discrimination, violence, including sexual violence, migrant smuggling, trafficking in persons, commercial sexual exploitation and economic exploitation, sexual abuse and other forms of abuse,

Recognizing that the increasing feminization of international migration requires greater gender sensitivity in all policies and efforts related to the subject of international migration,

Recognizing also the impact of migration on the effectiveness of public services, and the need to address, as appropriate, the shortages of workers, including health and education workers, giving appropriate attention to enhancing the capacity of developing countries in this regard,

Noting the efforts of Member States, relevant United Nations bodies, organizations, funds and programmes, and international and intergovernmental organizations, including the International Organization for Migration, in respect of convening events at the national, regional and international levels with a view to advancing the dialogue on the issue of international migration and development,

Taking note of the reports of the Secretary-General on world population monitoring ¹⁵ and on the monitoring of population programmes, ¹⁶ both focusing on international migration and development, and taking note also of the report of the Secretary-General on the flow of financial resources for assisting in the implementation of the Programme of Action of the International Conference on Population and Development, ¹⁷

Taking note also of the report of the Global Commission on International Migration entitled "Migration in an interconnected world: new directions for action", ¹⁸ including its contribution to the

debate on international migration and development, and taking note further of the report as an input for consideration at the High-level Dialogue,

- 1. *Reaffirms* the Programme of Action of the International Conference on Population and Development¹ and the key actions for its further implementation;²
- 2. Acknowledges the important contribution made by migrants and migration to development in countries of origin and destination;
- 3. *Recognizes* the need for Member States to consider the multidimensional aspects of international migration and development in order to identify appropriate ways and means of maximizing the development benefits and minimizing the negative impacts;
- 4. Requests States to effectively promote and protect the human rights and fundamental freedoms of all migrants regardless of their immigration status, especially those of women and children, in conformity with the Universal Declaration of Human Rights⁹ and the international instruments to which they are party;
- 5. *Reaffirms* the responsibility of Governments to safeguard and protect the rights of migrants against illegal or violent acts, in particular acts of racial discrimination and crimes perpetrated with racist or xenophobic motivation by individuals or groups, and urges them to reinforce measures in this regard;
- 6. Recognizes that trafficking in persons and smuggling of migrants continue to pose a serious challenge to humanity and require a concerted international response, and to that end urges all States to devise, enforce and strengthen effective measures to prevent, combat and eliminate all forms of trafficking in persons, to counter the demand for trafficked victims and to protect the victims, in particular women and children subjected to forced labour, or sexual or commercial exploitation, violence or sexual abuse;
- 7. Requests all Member States, in accordance with their relevant international obligations and commitments, to promote cooperation at all levels in addressing the challenge of undocumented or irregular migration so as to foster a secure, regular and orderly process of migration;
- 8. Calls upon States that have not yet done so to enact domestic legislation and to take further effective measures to combat and prosecute international trafficking in persons and smuggling of migrants;
- 9. *Reaffirms* the right of Governments to enforce their migration laws, consistent with their international obligations;
- 10. *Invites* Governments, with the assistance of the international community, where appropriate, to seek to make the option of remaining in one's own country viable for all people, in particular through efforts to achieve sustainable development, leading to a better economic balance between developed and developing countries;
- 11. Calls upon States to facilitate family reunification in an expeditious and effective manner, with due regard for applicable laws, as such reunification has a positive effect on the integration of migrants;
- 12. *Recognizes* the importance of public awareness of opportunities, limitations and rights in the event of migration;
- 13. Urges Member States and relevant international organizations to incorporate a gender perspective in all policies and programmes on international migration in order to, inter alia, reinforce the positive contributions that migrant women can make to the economic, social and human development of their countries of origin and their host countries as well as to strengthen protection of women migrants from all forms of violence, discrimination, trafficking, exploitation and abuse, by promoting their rights

and welfare, while recognizing in this regard the importance of joint and collaborative approaches and strategies at the bilateral, regional, interregional and international levels;

- 14. *Reiterates* the need to consider how the migration of highly skilled persons and those with advanced education impacts the development efforts of developing countries;
- 15. *Acknowledges* the need to analyse the impact of certain forms of temporary migration and return migration;
- 16. *Reaffirms* that there is a need to address and to promote conditions for cheaper, faster and safer transfers of remittances in both source and recipient countries and, as appropriate, to encourage opportunities for development-oriented investment in recipient countries by beneficiaries that are willing and able to undertake such action;
- 17. *Invites* the countries of origin and destination, in accordance with domestic legislation, to undertake appropriate measures to facilitate the contribution of migrants and migrant communities to the development of their countries of origin;
- 18. *Recalls* the commitments contained in the 2001 Declaration of Commitment on HIV/AIDS¹⁹ to develop and begin to implement national, regional and international strategies that would facilitate access to HIV/AIDS prevention programmes for migrants and mobile workers, including the provision of information on health and social services;²⁰
- 19. *Invites* Governments to set up or, where they already exist and where necessary, to strengthen relevant institutions and mechanisms for, inter alia, data collection, analysis, the subsequent elaboration of policies, programmes and projects, and their monitoring and evaluation, including by improving skills and increasing resources, with a view to their providing timely, reliable and disaggregated information, including, inter alia, sex- and age-specific information, on international migration flows in countries of origin, transit and destination and their effects on development, and in this regard invites the international community to provide financial and technical assistance to developing countries:
- 20. *Invites* relevant international organizations and multilateral institutions to enhance their cooperation on methodologies for the collection and processing of statistical data on international migration and the situation of migrants;
- 21. *Encourages* efforts by Member States and the international community to promote a balanced and comprehensive approach to international migration and development, particularly by building partnerships and ensuring coordinated action to develop capacities, including for the management of migration;
- 22. *Invites* Governments, where appropriate, to consider the linkages between international migration and development in policy formulation by, inter alia, promoting, through a comprehensive approach at the national level, collaboration and coordination among the governmental authorities in charge of international migration, and those focusing on development or development cooperation, and other relevant policy areas;
- 23. *Recognizes* the need to take concrete actions to strengthen bilateral, regional and international cooperation and dialogue in the area of international migration and development and, where appropriate, to develop and implement national policies and cooperative strategies to ensure that migration contributes to the development of both countries of origin and countries of destination;
- 24. *Urges* the relevant United Nations bodies, organizations, funds and programmes, and other relevant intergovernmental organizations working on international migration, including the International

Organization for Migration, to enhance within their respective mandates the coordination of their activities, and to strengthen cooperation and collaboration;

- 25. Requests the Secretary-General to continue his substantive work on international migration and development and, in collaboration with other relevant international organizations, funds and programmes, to continue assessing the progress made in achieving the goals and objectives on international migration and development set out in the outcomes of major United Nations conferences and summits;
- 26. Looks forward to the High-level Dialogue on International Migration and Development to be held during the sixty-first session of the General Assembly;
- 27. *Recommends* in this regard that the Economic and Social Council transmit the report of the Commission on its thirty-ninth session to the High-level Dialogue.

PART THREE: INTERNATIONAL MIGRATION PROFILES

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VI. DEFINITIONS AND SOURCES

International migrants

Total (thousands): The estimated total number of international migrants, both sexes combined, as of 1 July of the years indicated, in thousands. The basic data used to estimate the number of international migrants was obtained mostly from population censuses. For 179 countries or areas, the estimate shown corresponds to the number of persons born in a country other than that in which they lived, that is, the foreign-born population. For a further 42 countries or areas where information on place of birth was not available, the estimate shown corresponds to the number of foreigners. For the remaining 9 countries or areas, no information on the number of foreign-born or foreign persons was available; the estimates were imputed using a model.

The coverage of refugees in population censuses is uneven. In countries where refugees have been resettled, granted refugee status and allowed to integrate, they are normally covered by the population census as any other migrant. In such cases, there is no reason to make a special provision for the consideration of refugees in estimating the international migrant stock. However, in many places, refugees are required to reside in camps and other designated areas. In most countries in which refugees are maintained segregated from the rest of the population, it is unlikely that population censuses cover them. Furthermore, when refugee flows occur rapidly in situations of conflict, it is uncommon for a population census to take place soon after and to reflect the newly arrived refugee population. Consequently, for many countries hosting large refugee populations, the refugee statistics reported by the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) are the only source of information on persons who are recognized as refugees or find themselves in refugee-like situations.

In order to ensure that the estimates of the international migrant stock reflect properly the numbers of refugees, the refugee figures reported by UNHCR and the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA) were added to the estimates of the international migrant stock for most developing countries. In doing so, care was taken to estimate refugee stocks at mid-year (1 July) from the UNHCR data, which usually refer to the end of the year.

For developed countries, where most refugees have been admitted for resettlement and are routinely included in population counts, be it by censuses or population registers, no such adjustment was made. Nor was any adjustment made to reflect the number of asylum-seekers.

Males (thousands): The total number of male migrants as of 1 July of the years indicated, in thousands.

Females (thousands): The total number of female migrants as of 1 July of the years indicated, in thousands.

Percentage of female migrants: The number of females as a percentage of the total international migrant stock.

Percentage of total migrant stock: The number of international migrants living in the country as a percentage of the total migrant stock in the world.

Migrants as a percentage of the total population: The number of international migrants as a percentage of the total population of the country where they live.

Annual rate of change: The estimated exponential annual rate of change of the international migrant stock.

Annual rate of change excluding refugees: The estimated exponential annual rate of change of the international migrant stock excluding refugees.

Net migration of foreign born (thousands): An estimate of the net gain in the migrant stock between two periods accounting for the effects of mortality.

Refugees

Total (thousands): The total number of persons who are recognized as refugees under the 1951 Convention relating to the Status of Refugees and its 1967 Protocol or under the 1969 Organization of African Unity Convention Governing the Specific Aspects of Refugee Problems in Africa; those granted refugee status in accordance with the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) Statute; those granted humanitarian status or temporary protection by the State in which they find themselves; those in refugee-like situations; and Palestinian refugees registered with UNRWA. Percentage of total refugee population: The number of refugees living in the country over the total number of refugees in the world.

Annual rate of change: The estimated exponential annual rate of change of the number of refugees.

Remittances

Total (millions of current US dollars): The main source of data used by the World Bank is the Balance of Payments Statistics of the International Monetary Fund (IMF). For countries that do not report data on remittances in the Balance of Payment Statistics of the IMF, or that report only certain types of remittances, the World Bank uses alternative estimates provided by World Bank country desks or data from central banks. Remittances are defined as the sum of three types of transactions. "Workers' remittances" are current private transfers from migrants staying in a country for a year or longer to households in another country. Usually they are transfers between members of the same family residing in different countries. If migrants are staying in a country for less than a year, their entire income in the host country is recorded as "compensation of employees". "Migrants' transfers" are related to the transfer of household effects and financial assets that arise at the time when a migrant changes her or his country of residence. They are not transactions between two different parties. Regional aggregates were calculated by the United Nations Population Division.

Percentage of gross domestic product: The percentage of gross domestic product (GDP) attributable to remittances.

Population

Total (thousands): De facto population, both sexes combined, as of 1 July of the years indicated, in thousands.

Males (thousands): De facto male population as of 1 July of the years indicated, in thousands.

Females (thousands): De facto female population as of 1 July of the years indicated, in thousands.

Annual rate of change per 1,000 population: The estimated annual exponential rate of change in population size, including change due to migration, expressed in per thousand population.

Annual rate of natural increase per 1,000 population: The estimated annual exponential rate of change in population size due to births and deaths, expressed in per thousand population. It does not include change due to international migration.

Total net migration (thousands—annual average): Net average annual number of international migrants during the period, that is, the average annual number of immigrants minus the average annual number of emigrants defined as individuals born in a country other than that to which they arrive or from which they depart, including both citizens and non-citizens, in thousands.

Annual net migration rate per 1,000 population: The net number of international migrants during the period divided by the average population of the country, expressed in per thousand population.



Ratification includes acceptance, approval, accession or succession.
