

Financial situation of the United Nations Statement

Mr. Chairman,

I would like to update the Committee on developments since last week's briefing.

For the regular budget, Mauritius, the Republic of Moldova and Slovenia have paid in full, bringing the total number of Member States having paid in full for the regular budget to 91.

For peacekeeping operations, Brunei Darussalam, Djibouti and Japan have paid in full all due peacekeeping assessments, which brings the total number of Member States having paid in full for peacekeeping operations to 51. Japan has also made payments for the two remaining peacekeeping operations for the non-mandated period.

For the International Tribunals, Djibouti and Slovenia have paid in full, bringing the total number of Member States who paid in full for this category to 73.

In addition, as indicated in paragraph 31 of the report (A/74/501/Add.1) which is now before you, Brunei Darussalam, Djibouti and Japan are now fully paid for all categories. This brings the total to 46 Member States.

On behalf of the Secretary-General, I would like to thank these Member States for their positive action since last week's briefing on the UN financial situation.
