Statement by H.E. The Hon. Mitch Fifield, Ambassador and Permanent Representative of Australia to the United Nations, on behalf of CANZ

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Mr Chair,

Thank you for giving me the floor. I have the honour to speak on behalf of Canada, New Zealand and Australia.

Our group continues to strongly support the Secretary-General's reform

efforts, of which human resources management is a critical part. We are

pleased that the ongoing implementation of reform is strengthening the

UN's culture of collaboration across pillars. As a result, we look forward to a

UN that better delivers for the people it serves around the world.

Mr Chair,

Human Resources Management is a tremendously important agenda item

and there are many different elements to it. We should strive for an

outcome on each report, including those from previous sessions that are

outstanding, to provide clear direction to the Secretary-General and to

inform future reports that will be brought to the Fifth Committee.

We regret that the Fifth Committee was unable to reach consensus on

Human Resources Management during the 73rd and 74th sessions and we

need to do better. Our group remains committed to achieving a positive

outcome during this session.
