



Excellency,

I have the honour to refer to resolution 60/227 of 23 December 2005 by which the General Assembly decided to hold a High-level Dialogue on International Migration and Development on 14 and 15 September 2006, at the beginning of the 61st Session. It will be the first time that this issue is addressed at this level in the General Assembly.

In preparation for the High-level Dialogue, the General Assembly invited the President of the General Assembly, within existing resources, in consultation with Member States, and with the assistance of the Secretariat, to organize prior to the High-level Dialogue up to two panel discussions on its overall theme. The first panel discussion was held here in New York on 8 June.

I wish to inform you that second panel discussion is scheduled to take place in Geneva on 4 July 2006, from 4:30 to 6:30 p.m. I would like to invite you to personally participate in this event.

The purpose of the panel discussions is to debate, at the substantive level, the ways and means of maximizing the benefits of migration for development and minimizing its negative impacts, and, particularly, the role that the United Nations system can play in assisting Member States to make the most of the opportunities that migration brings and addressing the challenges it poses.

The panel discussions will provide an excellent opportunity for fruitful interaction between Member States and representatives of the United Nations system and will be an important contribution to the successful organization and outcome of the High-level Dialogue in September.
