In that regard, given the absence of any such complaints, no special measures have been taken beyond those established by the General Command of the Bolivian Police in relation to the protection and guarantees provided by the State to accredited missions in the Plurinational State of Bolivia.

The Permanent Mission of the Plurinational State of Bolivia to the United Nations takes this opportunity to convey to the United Nations Secretariat the renewed assurances of its highest consideration.

In response to your fax CITE/MBNU/268/09 of 11 May 2009, I should like to inform you that neither this Ministry nor the Ministry of Government has received any complaints in the context of paragraph 10 of General Assembly resolution 63/126, concerning serious violations of the protection and security of diplomatic and consular missions and representatives, or missions to international organizations and their representatives.

In that regard, given the absence of any such complaints, no special measures have been taken beyond those established by the General Command of the Bolivian Police in relation to the protection and guarantees provided by the State to accredited missions in the Plurinational State of Bolivia and their representatives.

However, it should be mentioned that two demonstrations were held in the course of this year, outside the Japanese and Peruvian Embassies, respectively. The coordinated presence of an increased number of police officers immediately restored calm to the area.

I would be grateful if you would transmit this information to the United Nations Secretariat.
